Eagles Bite Tahoka 28-20

Post To Be Here Friday

The high-flying 1958 Eagles gave a thrilling end to its annual Tahoka game last Friday night when Q B David Bessire returned a punt 65 yards in the 4th period with seconds to go for winning TD. The score broke a 20-20 tie and the Eagles trailed 20 to 14 at half time. Tahoka scored first when the game was only three minutes old. In another 1 minutes the Bulldogs scored again. The Eagles score was on a QB sneak by David Bessire from the 1 yard line. The score was made possible by a 57 yard aerial drive with Tommy Gardenhire shooting a 46 yard rocket to end Lanny Brewer. A 2nd shot by Bessire hit end Ken White for 10 yards. In the second quarter a 46 yd. throw from Bessire to Brewer made a TD and the conversion from Bessire to White was good. In the 3rd quarter the teams went scoreless.

In last go-round a 20 yd. pass from Gardenhire to White. Tommy had gone over on a 20 yd. run around RT. end only to be called back by penalty. The Eagles tried again for a TD. The score came as a result of an 80 yd. pass attack by the aerial circus of Gardenhire and White. The score stood a tie 20 all. Bessire made the 65 yd. punt return down rt. side of line under good blocking for winning score. The Bulldogs ran the Eagles ragged on the ground but made up for it in the ozone finishing 6 passes out of 9.

Credits also go to David Sprabery, Larry James and David Gary. The boys are thinking of district championship and are in tip top spirits with a fine team spirit. The first home game is Friday night with Post as guests. The danger now seems over-confidence as Post seems a push-over — BUT **COULD BE TOUGH**. Our guess — Eagles by 3 TD.

More Facts Given On Bond Election Oct. 4th

Improvements Will Help City To Grow

Following are questions and answers on the proposed \$50,000 General Obligation Bonds on which the Qualified voters of O'Donnell will vote Saturday Oct. 4th —
Q — What is our total city tax rate?
A — \$1.50 per \$100 assessed valuation.
Q — What is the total city assessed valuation?
A — The 1958 assessed valuation is \$1,436,025

Q — What percent is the city property assessed for taxation?
A — Placed on tax roll at 40 percent of actual value.
Q — How much money does the City owe in bonds?
A — City has \$65,000 tax bonds and \$65,000 revenue bonds outstanding.

Q — How does our city bond debt compare with other towns in the area?
A — O'Donnell has around a 4 percent debt where most cities our size have about a 7 percent debt. (These percentages are of the total assessed valuation.)

Q — How much tax money does the city collect each year?
A — About \$21,500

Q — What percent collections does the city average?
A — Average of 93.33 percent collections.

Q — What is the total amount of this proposed bond issue?
A — \$50,000

Q — What does the city get for this \$50,000?
A — \$25,000 Swimming Pool
\$10,000 Community House
\$10,000 City Hall - Fire Station
\$5,000 Paving

Q — How long will it take to pay for these improvements?
A — Bonds will run 25 years

Q — Why does the city assessed valuation have to be raised by 50 percent?
A — To give the base of total values on which to issue \$25,000 in swimming pool bonds.

Q — Does the state laws limit the amount of tax rate that can be used for swimming pool bonds?
A. Yes, only 10c can be used for such bonds.

Q — When will the assessed valuation be raised?
A. June 1959 if the bonds are voted.

Q — If all the \$50,000 is voted, how much will it raise the city's annual bond payments?
A — From about \$6,500 to \$9,500 per year including interest

Q — Will the tax rate be lower when the assessed valuation is raised?
A — Yes, the tax rate will be reduced to \$1.25 per \$100 assessed valuation.

Q — If the \$50,000 in bonds are voted, can they be sold to municipal bond dealer?
A — Yes, the city has a buyer for the bonds at rates of 4, 4 1-2 percent on the first 10 years and 5 percent on the longer maturities.

Q — What will be the net raise in taxes to the property owner after the valuation has been raised and the tax rate reduced?
A — About 25 percent raise

Q — How much tax rate will it take to pay off all tax bonds if this \$50,000 is voted?
A — 50c tax rate at 90 percent collection.

Q — Will this leave plenty tax rate to operate the city after the 50c is used for bonds?
A — Yes, it will leave 75c from the new proposed \$1.25 to be based on the new assessed valuations.

Q — Can the city build a swimming pool for \$25,000?
A — Yes, the City of Roscoe, Tex has just finished a nice size pool for this amount.

Q — How will the ballot look at the polls?
A — The \$50,000 will be grouped to read as follows:
\$15,000 City Hall
\$10,000 Paving Bonds
\$25,000 Park Bonds

Q — When is the election?
A — Oct. 4, 1958

Q — When will the polls open and close?
A — 8 a. m. until 7 p. m. at the City Hall.

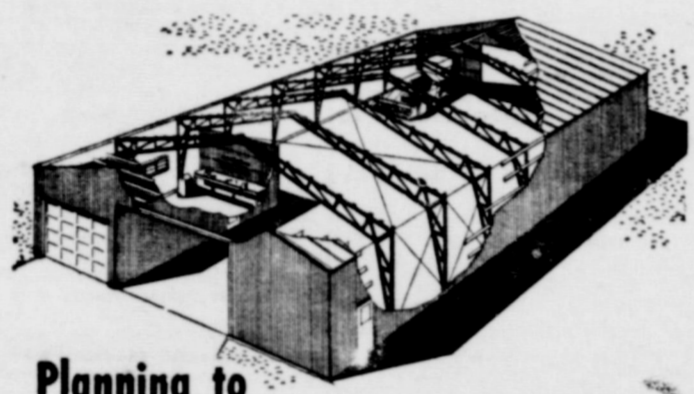
