This Friday, June 1st an election will be held at the High School to etermine if the O'Donnel School Board shall have the right to abolish the dual school system. There are three main reasons for calling this election: Federal law, Accreditation and Financing.

1. Federal Courts have against dual and equal facilities stating that seperate schools are not in keeping with the Federal Con-

2nd. The State Accreditation Div-ision of the Texas Education Agency checks our school's facilities and program for standards which must be maintained. If any one part of the system does not meet the stan-dards, the the accreditation of the whole school system is rated by the weakest unit. This fact can cause the O'Donnell School to loose its accreditation because one unit is not meeting standards even the the rest of the School DOES meet the standards. The School has been WARNED and this is just one step away from LCOSING accreditation. Next spring, when the ac reditation visit is made, if the School System school is subject to LOOSING its accreditation.

3rd If the School District had the money to build two equal school systems and did this to protect its accreditation, it would not assure the School System of being able to the School System of being able to continue to operate two se, erate systems because cases that have been carried to court have ruled out dual systems. This would be a trerendous expense on the tax payers of the School District and even then would not GUARANTEE continued
