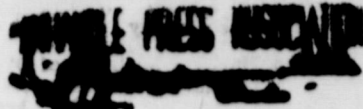

Milk Has Two Faces

Milk is both saint and sinner among human foods, the State Health Department said today in a statement favoring compulsory pasteurization of all milk offered for public sale.

The statement was directed to cities planning milk ordinances or milk production codes.

Said the Department: "Milk is the best single food available for human consumption, and also one of the most dangerous—unless it is handled right."

"Milk contains the essentials of a balanced diet. It is rich in vitamins. It has an especially good quality of protein and fat, and a high content of readily usable calcium.

"But unless it is pasteurized, it might also contain germs of tuberculosis, typhoid and paratyphoid fevers, gastro-enteritis, diphtheria, streptococcal infections, undulant fever, foot and mouth disease, diarrhea, dysentery, and perhaps even polio.

Pasteurization means holding milk at a temperature of 143 degrees Fahrenheit for 30 minutes or at 161 degrees for 15 seconds.

VA Quiz

Q - If I apply for disability compensation as soon as I get my discharge from service, will I be required to take a VA physical examination?

A - Not necessarily. As long as you file your claim within six months from your discharge, VA may give you an initial rating based on the records of your branch of service, unless it would appear that an error would result from such a procedure.

Q - If a veteran shows a lack of progress in his Korean GI Bill studies, would he still be entitled to make his one-and-only change of course?

A - Yes, but only if he can show VA that the lack of progress was not due to his own misconduct, neglect or lack of application.

Q - I have just been discharged from service, and I am thinking of getting a Korean GI term insurance policy. I already have a \$10,000 life insurance policy with a pricompany. Would this bar me from GI insurance?

A - No. Insurance held with a private company has no bearing on the amount of GI insurance you are permitted to carry. A veteran may get up to \$10,000 worth of Korean GI term insurance, minus only whatever other forms of GI insurance he might have.

Q - I bought a house with a GI loan, a few years ago. Our family has grown and we could use a larger house. My wife is a veteran, too. Would she be entitled to use her GI loan benefit for another house?

A - Yes. The fact that you used your GI loan benefit would not serve to deny your wife the right to use hers.

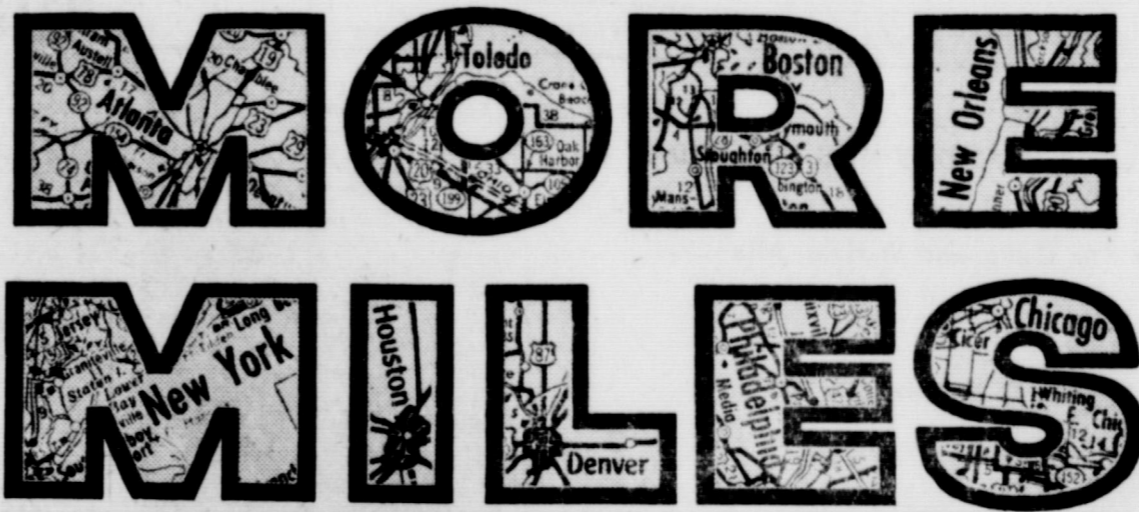
