While there is no indication at this time of widespread attacks of influenza this winter, there undoubtedly will be some the illness as colder weather approaches. Vaccination against it is a prudent measure for certain groups

and individuals. Principal targets for vaccination should be groups wishing to guard against absenteeism in their pro-fessions and occupations and those to whom the disease might be an ad ed health hazard.

There are now amdle sucplies of influenza vaccine of the type containing immunizing materials again st the important strains of influenza including the Asian strain.

Last year this time Texas was braced for an expected epidemic of Asian flu, so called becaused it had first been diagnosed in Hong Kong. The first cases were reported in April in that Oriental city and a brief five months later Texas had been thoroughly seeded with the

There is no expectation of a similar outbreak this fall.

-There has just been a new ad-Q—There has just been a new addition to our family, a baby boy. I am at school under the Korean GI Bill, and I know this entitles me to an increase in my allowance money. but what do I have to send VA as proof of my new dependent?

A — To support your claim of

additional allowance money, send VA either a certified copy of the public record of birth or a certified copy of the church record of the child's baptism.

Q - One of our neighbors down the street is a Spanish-American War veteran who needs hospitalization. There is no VA hospital in this city but I am wondering if he may not be eligible for treatment in a non-VA hospital here with VA paying the bills.

A — Probably not. Your neighbor would have to need emergency hospital care for a service connected disability for which delay in treat-ment or travel to the nearest VA hospital would be extremely hazard

Q - I know of a case of a woman veteran, a Yeomanette of World War I who is 70 years old and whose husband is unable to support her or himself. Isn't there some new law that says payments can be made to a woman veteran with a helpless husband, and if so what are its provisions?

A — Yes, there is such a law. It

states that dependency payments may be made to an eligible living veteran whose husband is not capnot support himself because of a permanent physical or mental dis-

Q — I am 21 years old, the son of a World War I veteran who has just died of a service connected condition. I understand that War Or-phans education is generally limited to children between 18 and 23. Will my War Orphans benefit end when I became 23?

A— Since your veteran parent died after you had passed age 18 you will have five years from the date of his death in which to com-Plete your War Crphans schooling The upcoming big game hunting
