Bamboo Fastest Growing There are 50,000 kinds of grass in Merry-Go-Round Circuit own galaxy have been studied the world, and 10,000 in the United by Dr. Ralph E. Wilson, of the Mt. States, according to a Wisconsin California, observatory man, who has adopted grass as a staff, and he finds that our sun is part of a celestial merry-go-round

Grasses are all sizes and shapes. and makes a complete trip around from tiny Arctic grasses, which are almost microscopic, to the bamboos. which grow as high as 100 feet in some parts of the world. Yes, the bamboo is a true grass, and perhaps the fastest growing grass of them all-it grows as much as two or three feet a day in certain places. American grasses include the hay and pasture grasses, the cereals and sugar cane. Indian corn is a grass, just as truly as wheat, rye, oats and rice. Then he has a few pieces of Hungarian grass, one of the oldest of them all, and chiefly remarkable because it was raised by the cave men for fodder, and has been found in Stone age lake dwellings.

Proper Diets Can Save Many at Childbirth, Claim

A Canadian physician declared which is located in the constellation the lives of thousands of mothers and babies can be saved by proper feeding of the mother before the baby is born.

Addressing the American Dietetic association, Dr. J. Harry Ebbs of the University of Toronto, described a unique experiment on 400 human guinea pigs to find out what a little extra food will do for a mother and her baby.

The 400 expectant mothers were year study, the results of which divided into two groups. Half received no extra food, the other 200 received one quart of milk and one fresh egg daily to supplement their ordinary diets, which in many cases were based on a food budget of \$10 a week, or less.

"The results from even this small addition to the diets were amazing," Dr. Ebbs declared.
