Shepherd and Earl B Mayfold The Shepherd and Eurl B. Mayfield. The bill has been endorsed by Lynn counay citizens, as peogle here can save a greating federal court if the divisien is created.

The new division, if created will ey, Cochran, Croshy counties: Bailbock, Dickens, Floyd, Gaines, Garza, Hockley, Lamb, Lsvn, Montley Seurry, Terry and Y akum. Th court will be located at Labbock.
The brief which has been com plied for use in making a fught for the creation of the sew division, shows the rapid growth of Lynn County and is good advertising for this section. It shars that the numed from 674 in 1920 with increased from 674 in 1920 with a total acres to 757 in 1925 with 87,32 acreage of 119,060 while a much more rapid developmerre has been after the above cizures daring 1925 lated. The brief alse shows that the poll tax receipts of Lynn county increased from 849 in 1920 to 2,972 in 1925, and much other information regarding development and futare possibilities of this county.
The creation of the new division would save the people of this county a large amount of time in attending federal court. People here have to make two changes in attending fed distance of 189 miles. If the new division is created no change will be necessary and the distance traveled will be cut to 49 miles, or a saving of 140 miles.
The creation of the new division will be just another step forward in the development of this section and has the approval of the large majority of our citizens.

## New Law Regulates Election of Trustees

 The voters of the O'Donnell InAependent School District will elect three trustees at the election orderedto be held on April 2nd. Usually there is no great scramble for the office of school trustee, but it is im . portant to the advancement of the
district that only men of business district that only men of business and wide vision be selected. Since
the present board has the work of gromoting the proposed school build-
ing under way, it would be a wise ing under way, it would be a wise
act to re-elect the members whose cerms are expiring. There has been a radical change
in the law regulating the election of shool trustees in common school
districts and in independent school district having fewer than 50 cbowastics according to the last a
uroved census. Under the new law (Atr. 2746 a of Revised Statutes) the ballots are rent to the election officers. The officers to hold the election should be ielectofore.
If any person desires his name to be placed upon the official ballot as in common school district or in an independent district having less than 500 scholastics, he should present a written request to the county judge. AT LEAST TEN DAYS BEFORE THE ELECTION (and no candidate Shall have his name printed uniess this is complled with, or unless five or more voters request in writing that certain name be printed. The ballots are then caused to be Trinted by the county judge and dethold the election at least are to hold the election, at least one day
Soefore the election, other supplies Soefore the election, other supplies
except the ballot boxes also are furnished by the counties.

- The election officers shall make re*urn to the county judge, and shall eertify the result in the same manreutrns shall be eanvassed by the commissioners' court. The name of The presiding officer selected by the trastees should be sent to the county judge, in order that he may properly deliser the election supplies.
