#### **PUBLIC NOTICE**

CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT NUMBER 8 ON THE BALLOT (SJR 1)

General Election November 7, 1972

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
Section 1. That Article IV, Section 4, Constitution of the State of Texas, be amended to read as follows:
"Section 4. The Governor elected at the general election in 1974, and thereafter, shall be installed on the first Tuesday after the organization of the General Land Office, and any statutory state officer who

read as follows:

"Section 22. The Attorney General elected at the general election in 1974, and thereafter, shall hold office for four years and until his successor is duly qualified. He shall represent the State in all suits and pleas in the Supreme Court of the State in which the State may be a party, and shall especially inquire into the charter rights of all private corporations, and from time to time, in the name of the State, take such action in the courts as may be proper and necessary to prevent any private corporation from exercising any power. in the name of the State, take such action in the courts as may be proper and necessary to prevent any private corporation from exercising any power or demanding or collecting any species of taxes, tolls, freight or wharfage not authorized by law. ### CountrysideUSA

Ret. Graham Purcell this week hailed House passage of a comprehensive new rural development program as the beginning of a new era for countryside USA. He sharply criticized a lastditch attempt by Republicans to destroy the bill with a key rule amendments. They tried to strip the U.S. department of agriculture of its rural development re-

"Enactment of this bill is going to mean more jobs, more opportunity and improved local services for Northwest Texas," Purcell said. "We now have a plan of rural economic development to mark the beginning of a new era for 1 on-metropolitan USA."


