### THE STATE OF TEXAS

To: Donald Terry Cornelius, Respondent, Greeting;

You are hereby commanded to appear before the Honorable 78th District Court of Wichita County at the Court House thereof, in Wichita Falls, Texas, at or before 10 o'clock A.M. of the first Monday next after the expiration of forty-two days from the date of the issuance of this citation, same being the 11th day of December, A.D. 1972, then and there to answer Plaintiff's Petition filed in said Court, on the 27th day of October, A.D. 1972, in this cause, numbered 93,162-B on the docket of said court and styled In Re: Billy Eugene Goodwin, et ux, Petitioners.

A brief statement of the nature of this suit is as follows, to-wit:

This is a petition for adoption wherein Billy Eugene Goodwin and wife, La Joyce Goodwin, ask for leave to adopt a minor child named Ernest Lee Cornelius. Said child's natural mother is deceased and his natural father, Donald Terry Cornelius, has wholly failed to contribute to the support of said minor child for a period of more than two years and his address is unknown to petitioners.

Wherefore, Premises considered, Petitioners ask the Court to enter its order granting them leave to adopt said minor child and for such other and further relief, in law or in equity, to which they may be justly entitled, as is more fully shown by Plaintiff's Petition on file in this suit.

If this citation is not served within ninety days after the date of issuance, it shall be returned unserved.

The Officer executing this process shall promptly execute the same according to law and make due return as the law directs.
