NEWS FROM CONGRESS

This week the House passed the following Resolution:

"Resolved, that the House of Representatives reiterates its opposition to the seating of the Communist regime in China as the representative of China in the United Nations or any of its specialized agencies and supports the President in his expressed determination to use all means to prevent such representation."

It is hoped that the effect of this Resolution will make it clear that the House does not favor any procedure which would let Red China force its way into the United Nations by aggression. If the United Nations is to remain effective at all, it certainly cannot be subjected to the pressure of outlaw nations that would force themselves into membership by aggression and war.

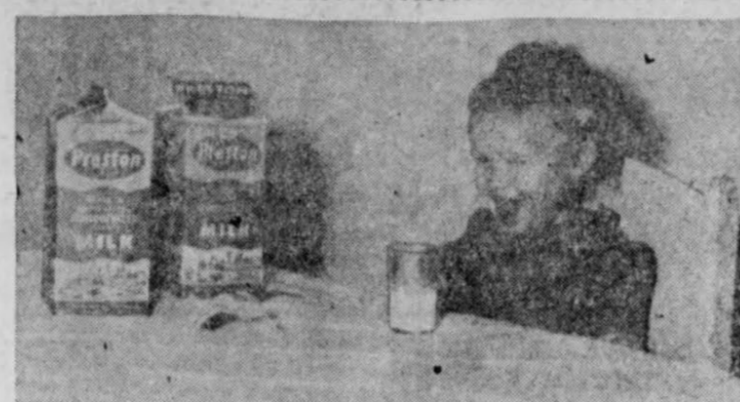
The Committee on Government operations, of which I am a member, is at this time holding hearings on several different bills that would prevent the government of continuing to operate businesses that are competitive with private firms and would also prevent it from going into any new enterprises that are not absolutely necessary for the national defense. It would be surprising to know just how many businesses that the Government operates which are competitive with private business.

Even though the leadership of both parties still say that we will probably adjourn by the 1st of August, as this date grows nearer and you think of the fact that the Congress still has finally to act upon the agriculture program, social security, a tax bill, and many other pieces of major legislation, it becomes more improbable that adjournment will come by that date.

The Administration backed bill for a so called "health reinsurance plan" was recently defeated by a margin of over 100 votes. I voted against the bill because I felt that the bill within itself was ineffectual and would not really accomplish anything. Also it would have created just one more bureau and would have been a movement on the part of the Federal Government to get into the field of health, and I feel that there is little doubt that once they get into that field, the next step would be to move into a generally government controlled health plan which would not be desirable.

CONTRACT ESSENTIALS EXPLAINED

Only in exceptionally important instances must contracts be entered into with any great degree of formality. In the usual case, the simple requisites of a binding contract may be completed in the most informal manner.

Probably most of the contracts in force today are merely spoken agreements. Many contracts are created by informal letters written by persons to one another. Many are made over the telephone, as when you call up a store and they agree to deliver some goods you order. Much of the world's grain supply is bought and sold, in the first instance, merely by hand signals in the great pit in Chicago.

If the contract is of importance, involving substantial sums of money or vital services, it is a good idea to reduce its terms to writing to minimize the possibilities of fraud and misunderstanding. Details of oral understandings are easily forgotten or misinterpreted, but written contracts endure unchanged. And, if a difference of opinion must be settled in court, a written agreement speaks for itself.

Certain kinds of contracts, such as those involving the sale of real estate or the lease of real estate for more than a year, will not be enforced in the courts unless written. In the same category are contracts wherein one person undertakes to stand good for the debt of another and those which are not to be performed within one year from the date on which the agreement is made.

Among the requisites of any contract of any sort, each party involved must be legally competent to enter into the agreement. Each must be sane and of legal age. A contract entered into by a male or unmarried female under 21 is voidable at the option of the minor (but not at the option of the other party). A married woman is competent to contract if 18 or over, but she is subject to a number of contractual restrictions because of her marriage.

To be enforceable, a contract must be entered into freely by each party involved. Their consent must be genuine. Compulsion or coercion will make the agreement void. Mistake, misrepresentation or fraud may also serve to invalidate a contract.

Another requirement of a contract is that each party shall perform some part of it. Similarly, there must be some object or benefit to be gained by each party. In return for your work, your employer agrees to pay you certain sums of money. He gains the use of your services, while you are benefited by the wages or salary received.

Also, a contract must be entered into for a lawful purpose. You cannot enter into binding contract to commit a crime or to evade the law. Thus, since gambling and wagers are prohibited by law, gambling debts cannot be collected by legal process. Nor will the courts enforce an agreement to pay interest in excess of the legal maximum provided by statute.

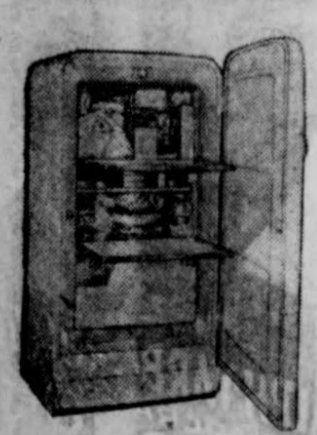

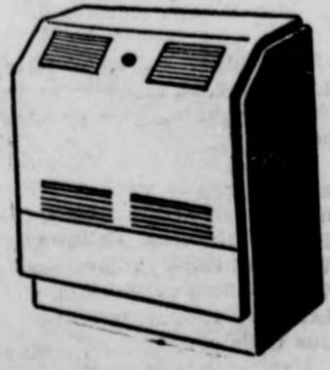

Soil Conservation

Farm to live and live to farm, said President Eisenhower in proclaiming the 11th National Farm Safety Week July 25th through July 31st.

The sponsors of National Farm Safety Week and the supervisors of the Wilbarger-Wichita Soil Conservation district urge you to examine your farm, remove the hazards, and avoid risks to reduce accidents in farm work.

Questions that we should ask ourselves are. How can I teach safety? What do I owe my family in the matter of safety? What do I owe the community in the matter of safety - What do I owe myself in the matter of safety. What influence have I had on safety programs during the past year? What safety measures do I now practice? What can I do to further the safety program during the year ahead?

The full importance of developing a safety consciousness is shown by the fact that 11,000 farm people were killed in accidents during 1953.

Madrid clover seed harvest has been good this year according to Cliff Erogon of Electra, Wymore Downing of Wichita Falls and Wilbur Prechal of Clara.

The Soil Conservation Service suggests that diverted acreage on the farm may be used to good advantage in winter legumes. Winter legumes adapted to this area include Austrian winter peas, alfalfa, madrid clover, and hairy vetch.

Legumes furnish protection from erosion, add nitrogen and improve the physical condition of the soil.

Many of our soils have deficiencies of essential plant foods and fertilizers are needed at time of application for best growth and soil improvement. The technicians for the soil conservation district suggest that you have a soil analysis made now so as to be ready for seeding of winter legumes. About 1 quart of soil taken to Midwestern University Soils Laboratory is all that is necessary for analysis purposes.
