manager.
Federal funding expired Aug. 31 ,
1975, although local punds continued
to pay the salaries of personnel for
two additional years.
Salaries for the program were
budgeted for $\$ 19,195$ this year,
Cowley said. It the program were

spend $\$ 20,500$ next year on the
salaries of Penn Nowell, career
edretion coordinator, and Gayle
Mrs. Nowell and Mrs. Lyles will not
affect the junior high occupational
