community in community in the area, is buying water from Wichita Falls. And now
we're asking for our maximum daily we're asking for our maximum daily million gallons to two million. million gallons to two million.
It's still unclear what the Wiehita Falls council's decision on our request was, but it's obvious the vote was to our sister city of Electra. o our sister city of Electra.
Iowa Park has been buying water from Wichita Falls since 1972, when our lakes dried up and we were forced to build a transmission line to
water for a thirsty community. water for a thirsty community.
Now we're in a drought again, and Now we're in a drought again, and
needing more water. And the
majority of the present Wichita Falls majority of the present Wichita Falls
council appears against selling any
more water than they now sell, if as
