## Drivers must have insurance

Beginning tomorrow, Texas drivers contacted by Department of
Public Safety officers or other peace officers in the state during traffic stops and vehicle accident investigations will be required to furnish proof of compliance with the new compulsory liability insurance law.

Under House Bill 197, an Vehicle Safety Responsibility Act approved this year by the 67th legislature, all drivers must carry minimum liability coverage for medical expenses of $\$ 10,000$ per property damages of $\$ 5.000$

 new law will result in the suspension of the violator's drivers license and motor vehicle registration unless the proof of finmill responsibility for froof years from the conviction date. For convicted violators to establish proof of financial responsibility, a filing of an "SR-22" form must be made to the Safety ResponsibilityBureau in Austin by the violator's Bureau in Austin by the
insurer as proof of coverage. The SR-22 form, used as evid of insurance, is kept on the DPS computer file for five years, but if the violator cancels or allows the coverage to lapse, the violator is
notified that his or her license and notified that his or her license and
registration are suspended and that registration are suspended and that
another SR-22 filing will be required. Sher SR-22 filing will be required.
Since most insurance companies will not insure those requiring an SR-22 filing, coverage may be obtained through either a county mutual insurance company or through the Texas Automobile
Insurance Plan (TAIP), an assigned risk insurance pool, at a higher premium rate than the norm.

Those persons convicted under this
law will pay 20 percent more than the standard rate for insurance, if in the TAIP. Drivers convicted a second time wil

Seldom does anyone report before hand that a controlled burn is to be made, and our volunteers are having to leave their work or homes to answer useless calls.
So, property owners.
So, property owners, make a new year's resolution: call and inform th
volunteer firemen that you are goin volunteer firemen that you are going
to start a control fire. It's to you benefit. They might get tired answering such needless calls and no be on hand to save your house or bar if a real fire starts some tim

## Lack of moisture

## hurt pecan kernels

Most of this year's pecans are high
quality, however, there are numerous rees where the kernels failed to fill properly. There is also a tendency for
some of the kernels to develop a some of the kernels to develop a
corky formation on the surface. The pecan trees of Wayne Coffman of Wichita Falls failed to fill properly. This condition was caused by the trees being overloaded with too many nuts per cluster for the growing
conditions of the tree. The tree probably ran out of soil moisture probably ran out of soil moistur
during the month of September. Pecan trees did pretty good on soil moisture until the later part of August. Dry September conditions placed the pecan trees in a stres resulting in lower kernel quality Some growers tried to water the
trees but failed to add enough moisture for deep penetration int the feeder root zone. This zone is two to 12 inches deep under the outer tips of the tree branches.
