Deville Development Co., of Fort Worth, has been awarded the contract for the construction of the new Clyde post office building, and construction is expected to begin soon, it was announced by Congressman Omar Burleson.

The building, which will be located across the street from the First Methodist Church, will be built in compliance with post office specifications, and will be leased by the department for \$5,040 annually for a ten year period.

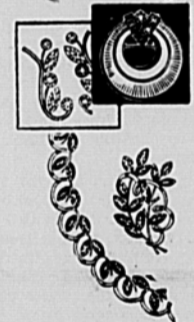
