It's fall and with it comes the
mance of raising a garden, canning and preserving, which is as rewarding as the time spent raising and taking care of the spring garden.
Green Tomato Chow-Chow made with the tomatoes, vegetables, spices and vinegar is one of the most popula relishes associated with fall canning. It is a recipe that gives one a chance o enjoy the herb and spice shelf to e fullest. Mrs. Chester Abernathy uses and vinegar to add zest and flavor to her recipes.
Mustard seeds are the most
important edible important edible part of the plant, which is reputed to have been
cultivated in much of Europe in the cultivated in much of Europe in the
Stone Age, in the Glastonburg lakes of England before the Iron Age, and in pre-historic Gaul before the Roman era. It is said that ancient Egyptians. Romans and Hindus probably popped a few seeds in their mouths while known for many centuries. Celery seeds are among the
smallest of the cultivated plants, and he aroma of the celery seed is that of vegetable. Celery seeds must be mported from India, France and
Indonesia, and they are the fruit of Indonesia, and they are the fruit of
wild celery or smallage. Celery is a native of Mediterranean areas and North East, and it was used as a lavoring by ancient Greeks and Romans.
Turmerie belongs to the ginger family and is grown in southern Asia. years as a spice. It is an important ingredient in curry powder and is used to color mustard.
The term vinegar, a flavoring and preservative agent, is applied to one fermentations known to man. Bible references to it can be found in the Book of Ruth and Proverbs, and it is diluted vinegar. Jo and Chester Abernathy and their daughters, Kelly, a graduate of
