IF YOU HAVE SEEN a cloud of mist floating from the alleys and streets in Baird lately, it is coming from a new spraying machine purchased by the city recently. The machine is of the latest type. It is a dust mist spray, Model C.I.A unit, trailer mounted. It will put out inseclicide dust and liquid mist to control mosquitoes and flies. The machine, which cost slightly above \$1,500, was developed by Charles Martin and Associates of Dallas. It can be pulled behind a pickup or car, and it does a fine job. City employees have been spraying infested areas regularly, and there has been a noticeable drop in insect population.
