## Peach trees have problem

Peach leaf curl is affecting a lot of

peaches in the area. A.J. Junk of Iowa

Park is experiencing an infestation of
this fungular disease on his Elberta
trees. Chemical control this late in the
season is ineffective.
season is ineffective.
The disease is evident when the
young developing leaves are
characterized by puckering, thickening, and curling. The diseased tissue is red during the early stages. Affected leaves are shed after a short
time. After the disease is visible of the leaves, control is very difficult. This problem will be treated by
Junk in late November after the leaves have fallen from the trees due othe dormant season. He will spray
with Kocide 101 at the rate of three easpoons per gallon of water. For the ommercial grower, Kociere is used at
the rate of two pounds per 100 gallons This disease development is related to air temperature on the time of
leafout and available moisture. pptimum air temperature for
development is about 68 degrees development is about 68 degrees
farenheit. Moist conditions this
spring have also contributed to the Spring is the season for bee
