# Season's customs, foods around world depicted

The program presented by Mrs. C.L. Metz and Mrs. Charlie Lee Thursday afternoon for the 23 Study Club's annual Christmas meeting and party depicted different ways the holiday is celebrated in foreign lands and in America through both customs and foods.

Mrs. Joe Singer and Mrs. H.M. Carter were hostesses for the meeting at the Singer home which, true to form, was decorated to create a fairyland of Christmas magic and spiritual joy. Mrs. Sam Hill served as program leader.

Mrs. Metz presented a talk on "Christmas Pageantry and Customs Around the World," which emphasized that despite the differences in its observance, all people share in its magical and spiritual joy.

"For almost 2,000 years, Christmas has been observed by people all over the world, each in his own way. In 350 A.D., December 25th was proclaimed the date of the Nativity by Pope Julius, the first; however, there is no historical evidence to back it up," Mrs. Metz said.

She said that Christmas was the only religious holiday recognized as a legal holiday throughout the U.S.A., and that Alabama was the first state to declare it a holiday in 1836; and by 1890 all other states had followed suit.

Mrs. Metz told interesting facts about the observance of Christmas in France, Spain, England, Africa, Switzerland, Finland, Sweden, Italy, Holland and Mexico. She noted that Americans observe many time-honored customs and traditions in their celebration, some uniquely their own, some borrowed from other countries. She remarked that whether the celebration is with pomp and elegance, brilliant display of gifts, or in silent prayer and worship that it should all be done so as not to forget the true meaning of the day, and that people should pause often to recall that night so long ago when the angels sang "Peace on earth and goodwill to men."

Mrs. Lee's topic was "Holiday Cuisines of Other Nations." She began by asking the club members to

tell the food traditions that are kept in their families at Christmas. She said that breads dominated her thinking and that she had chosen to discuss Christmas breads of Germany, Alsace-France and Norway, her heritage. To enhance interest, she had baked the breads for members to sample during the tasting bee that followed the program.

From Germany, Mrs. Lee selected the Stollen, the sweet, fruit-laden bread, which her family has sort of

adopted as a Christmas breakfast bread.

The fruit and nut-laden Bierewecke bread was baked by the speaker to represent Alsace-France. In reviewing its history, she said that part of the 16th century ordinance enacted in the city of Strasbourg was to separate bread making from cake making and that Bierewecke made with a modicum of bread, (no butter) dried fruits, and sweetened with a bit of honey and the fruits, was to be made by bread makers. This was to be served before midnight mass on Christmas Eve with hot mulled cider or spiced wine.

Mrs. Lee brought a loaf of Jule Kaga bread to the meeting to represent Norway. She mentioned other traditional foods of foreign countries to include the rice pudding with the almond and fruit soup. She said that many of their desserts have histories that date from the Middle Ages and mentioned the Christmas pudding as a piece de resistance in England. The pudding traces its lineage to gruel of wheat, strained milk and eggs and is called freemetry.

A tasting bee featuring favorite Christmas foods of club members highlighted the social hour.

During the afternoon, Mrs. Howard Marlar was welcomed as a new member, and in lieu of exchanging gifts, each member contributed a monetary offering for Girlstown.

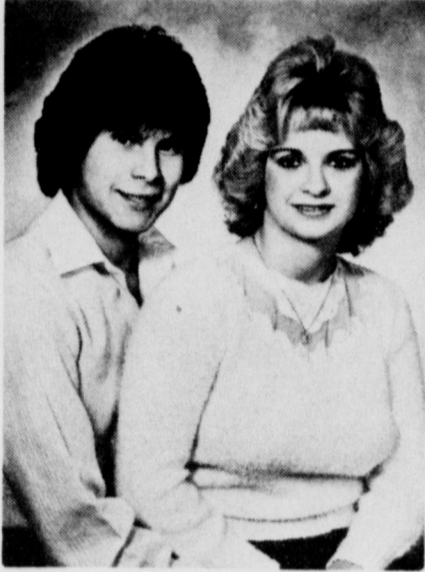
Members answered roll call by remembering their most memorable Christmases, most of those revolving around their childhood days. The meeting was climaxed with exchange of gifts from the tree.

# Library fund exceeds matching grant goal

Iowa Parkans responded to the call for more donations to the library, and the Friends of the Library are completing an application for a \$100,000 matching grant.

Friends president Mike Dodd was quoted in last week's edition of the Iowa Park Leader as lacking \$1,372.08 to qualify for the matching fund.

Monday, Mrs. Luther Shaw, treasurer, said the response had taken the fund over its goal and had reached \$100,918.60.

The fund includes: \$17,677.96 expended on the building; \$46,583.47 cash in bank and \$36,657.17 pledged.

To complete qualification for the matching grant, the city must now pass a resolution, agreeing to underwrite all uncollected pledges.

According to William D. Gooch, assistant state librarian, the matching grant will come from the Library Services and Construction Act, Title II, Public Library Construction program.

When received, the grant will be made to the city of Iowa Park, rather than to the Friends of the Library, according to Gooch.

In order to qualify for the funds, structures and property could not be included as the city's part of the matching funds.

Pledges can be included, the letter specified.

Earlier estimations gathered by the Friends of the Library to renovate the Burnett home for use as a library, amounted in excess of \$200,000. This would include an elevator to the second floor.

Dodd cautioned that donations to the fund should not be cut off by those who planned to contribute but had not indicated their intentions. He said whatever money is collected in excess of the present amount is still needed for additional furniture, book purchases and general operating expenses.

## Extra help saving money

There's a lot of cattle coming into Wichita County from the southern states of Florida and Mississippi. They are being put on wheat in large numbers. Some producers are having trouble with death loss, others aren't.

One point to consider, though, is that not all stockmen handle their cattle the same way when they arrive on the place. One will precondition a certain way, while another will do things a lot differently.

I talked to one wheat farmer-stocker cattle producer that appears to be doing some things right, especially when you examine his figures. That man is Tim Montz over at Byers.

Tim farms about 1,500 acres of wheat, and when it gets large enough, he buys cattle and puts them on it. Over the past few weeks, he's bought about 900 head of stockers from Florida and Mississippi. He has a preconditioning program to get them ready for pasture, but has added a little extra to it by hiring a couple of hands to keep close, daily watch on the health of the animals.

one percent loss. He feels this is due to his hiring two hands to closely watch his cattle and bring in those that are sick. In dollars and cents, it works out to about \$4,500 saved on his 900 head that he's purchased.

Tim is in the shape most farmers are in today. He can't afford a lot that he would like, but he feels he can't afford not to keep a very close watch on his livestock either. It appears that he was right, and spending a little money is saving him a bunch.

## Record low temperatures, snow hampers residents

Weather has been the topic of the day, or week, since last Thursday. Snow began falling that afternoon, and when Iowa Parkans awoke Friday morning, there was a cover of five inches over the entire country.

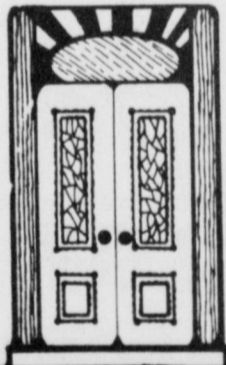
Temperatures have since been ranging from 8 to 18 degrees and many individuals date record lows have been broken, according to the

Weather Bureau.

Most of the snow was melted, other than on grass areas, before a freezing mist began falling Tuesday, making streets and bridges extremely hazardous for drivers and sidewalks dangerous for walkers.

Snow again began falling Wednesday morning early, and at least an inch of cover was measured by noon yesterday. At the same time, one report was made that the temperature had reached 6 degrees shortly before noon.

Only one minor vehicle accident due to glazed streets had been received by the police department by presstime Wednesday. It occurred at 3:04 p.m. Tuesday at Douglas and Access Road. There were no injuries.



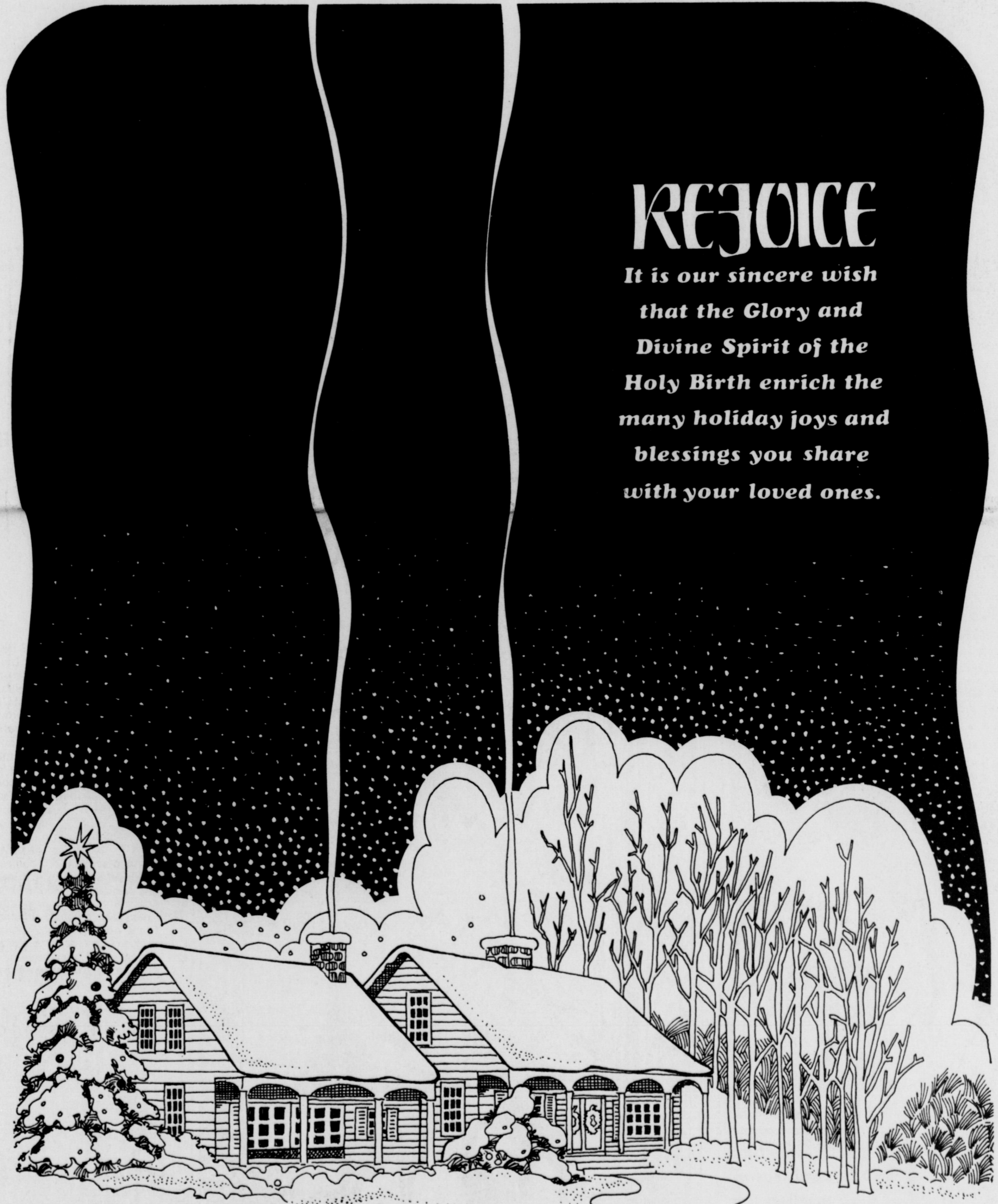

# Area oil, gas report

At a location five miles northeast of Harrold, Harold Mason of Electra has finaled a new oil producer in the Wilbarger Regular Field.

The well is designated as the No. 9 LeRoy Tate, pumping oil at the rate of nine barrels per day.

Location is in a 100-acre lease in the M.M. McLaren Survey. Bottomed at 800 feet, the well will produce from perforations 444 to 454 feet into the hole. The well is 150 feet from the east and south line of the lease and the survey.

A 8,900-ft. wildcat well is planned by Bennett Resources Inc. of Graham at a drillsite ten miles southeast of Quanah, Hardeman County. The location is in an 80-acre lease in the W&NWRR Survey, A414. Well's designation is the No. 9 Brown Unit.

Searth Oil & Gas Co. of Amarillo has filed for permit to drill the No. 1 Parker, a 6,925-ft. wildcat well three miles northeast of Quanah. Location is in a 173-acre lease in Hardeman County's W&NWRR Survey.

At a location six miles southwest of Iowa Park, S&J Operating Co. of Wichita Falls has completed the No. 11 & 16 Hammon Fee in the Wichita Regular Field and the No. 10 Fassett & Tuttle in the KMA Field.

Drillsites were in respective leases of 400-acres, 409 acres and 794 acres, in Wichita County's ETRR Survey.

The No. 11 well showed daily potential for 8 barrels of oil on an open choke. Production will be from an interval 1,277 to 1,282 feet. Well's total depth was 1,290 feet, with top of pay logged at 1,186 feet.

The No. 16 well entered the pay zone at 471 feet and went to 668 foot total drilling depth. It is pumping at the rate of 4 barrels of crude oil per day on an open choke. Perforations range from 471 to 477 feet into the holes.

The No. 10 Fassett & Tuttle is pumping at the rate of 7 barrels per day, also on an open choke. After entering the pay horizon at 1,288 feet, the well was perforated to produce from an interval 1,288 to 1,294 feet into the wellbore. Total drilling depth was 1,350 feet.

Camino Corp. of Wichita Falls has filed for permit to drill the No. 1 SNRC Jeter, a 1,850-foot developmental well in the Wichita Regular Field, 7.5 miles southwest of Wichita Falls. The operation will be in a 26-acre lease in Wichita County's Denton County School Land Survey.

Midwest Drilling & Producing Co. of Wichita Falls has posted initial production figures for the No. 18 Foster Hamilton, new oil well in Wichita County's Stephen Denison Survey, 15 miles west of Burkbur-

nett.

The well indicated potential for 32 barrels of oil per day on an open choke. With drillsite in a 6-acre lease in the Wichita Regular Field, the well had total drilling depth of 1,998 feet. It entered the pay horizon at 1,860 feet and will produce from a set of perforations 1,860 to 1,868 feet into the wellbore.

Wichita Falls-based Heydrick Petroleum Co. has turned in first production figures for its No. 4 E.L. Chilton, a successful developmental well in Wichita County's Cash Field.

Pumping oil at the rate of 26 barrels per day, the well was tested on a 16/64 choke.

Drillsite was in a 134-acre lease in the H&TC RR Survey, eight miles southeast of Electra. The well was taken to a total depth of 4,200 feet, after entering the pay zone at 3,818 feet. Production interval will be 3,819 to 3,828 feet into the hole.

A new oil producer in Wichita County's L. Netherly Survey has been finaled by Loc-Mac Co. of Ft. Worth. Designated as the No. 5 Lochridge B, the well indicated capacity to produce 16 barrels of oil per day on an open choke.

The location is five miles south-southwest of Iowa Park, in a 217-acre lease in the Wichita Regular Field.

Bottomed at 1,931 feet, the well will produce from an interval of perforations 704 to 708 feet into the hole. The pay formation was first encountered at 705 feet.

Pumping at the rate of 9 barrels of crude oil per day on an open choke, the No. 10 Goetze was completed in Wichita County's SA & MG RR Survey by Avis J. Carroll of Wichita Falls.

Drillsite is in a 35-acre lease in the Wichita Regular Field, nine miles northeast of Electra.

After entering the pay zone at 855 feet, the well went to 1,125 foot bottomhole. It was perforated to produce from an interval 848 to 855 feet into the hole.

Swanson & Vestal, operating out of Electra, has recorded a successful developmental well in Wichita County's KWVFL Survey. It is the No. 1 R.L. Kempner "C", showing potential for 2 barrels of oil per day on an open choke.

Drillsite was in a 127-acre lease in the Wichita Regular Field, three miles south of Kamay.

The well was drilled to a total 1,806 foot bottom, after entering the pay horizon at 1,752 feet. It was perforated to produce from an interval 1,752 to 1,762 feet.

A wildcat oiler has been completed seven miles south of Chillicothe by

S.M. Ferguson Jr. Inc. of Wichita Falls.

The Hardeman County discovery is designated as the No. 1 C.R. Moore. It is in a 320-acre lease in the H&TCRR Survey Sec. 98 Blk. 16.

The well pumped 305 barrels of oil and 119,000 CFD gas daily on a 10/64 choke. The flow pressure stood at 710 PSL. Ferguson took the hole to 8,144-ft. bottom and perforated for production 8,121 to 8,123 feet into the wellbore.

The drillsite was 497 feet from the west line and 2,335 feet from the south line of the lease and survey.

An 8,700-foot Hardeman County wildcat is scheduled to be drilled one mile south of Chillicothe. Phillips Oil Co. of Oklahoma City is the operator.

The well is in a 44-acre lease in the H&TCRR Survey, A-46. It will be known as the No. 1 Rapp-Koontz. Drillsite will be 2,386 feet from the west line and 1,675 feet from the south line of the lease and 2,386 feet from the west line and 2,513 feet from the south line of the survey.

Wildcat drilling action is scheduled six miles northwest of Vernon by Madison Oil Co. of Wichita Falls. The firm is preparing to drill the No. 1 Abbott-Bond in a 40-acre unit in the H&TCRR Survey A-1545, 660 feet from the west line and 660 feet from the south line and 330 feet from the west line of the lease and 1,575 feet from the south line of the survey. Projected total drilling depth is 8,800 feet, with Ellenburger oil production as the target.

The No. 1 Kenneth Bingham is scheduled for spudding in Wilbarger County's Odell Field four miles east-northeast of the Odell community. Ranger Operating of Graham will be the operator.

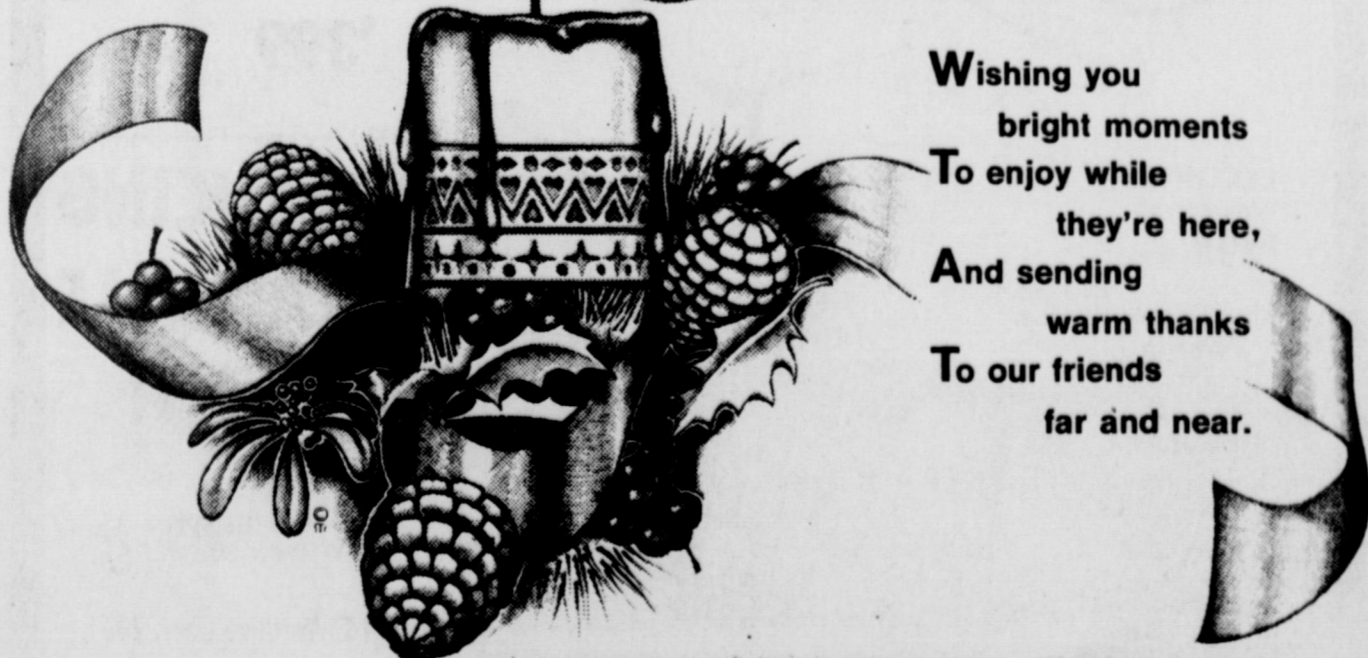

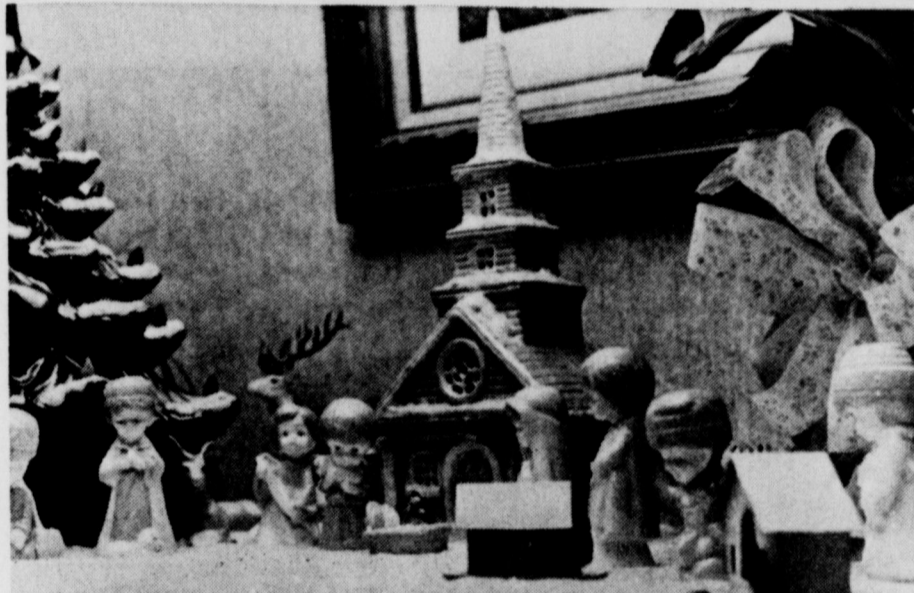
wrapped with lights, sparkles with icicles and a lighted gold top piece.

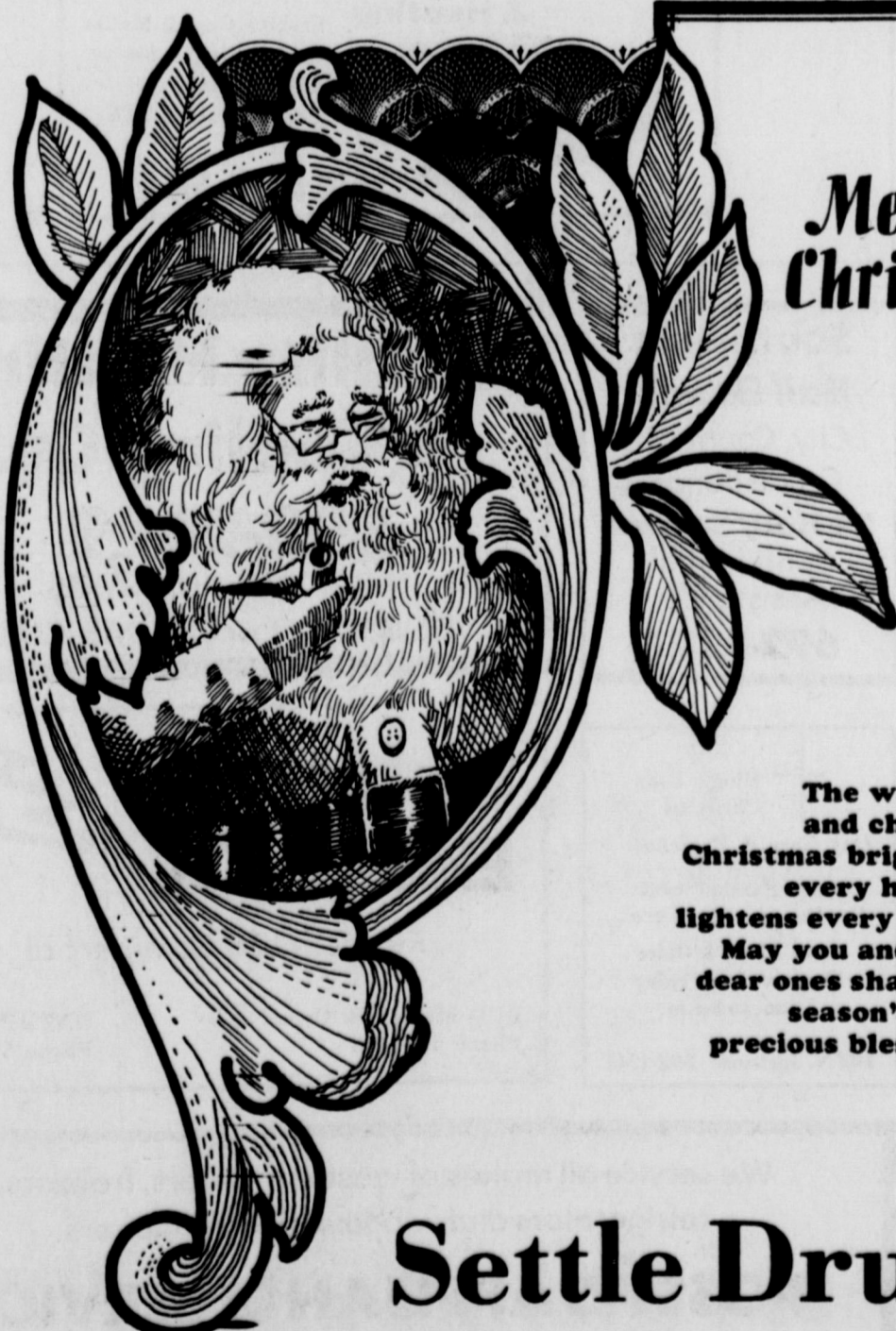

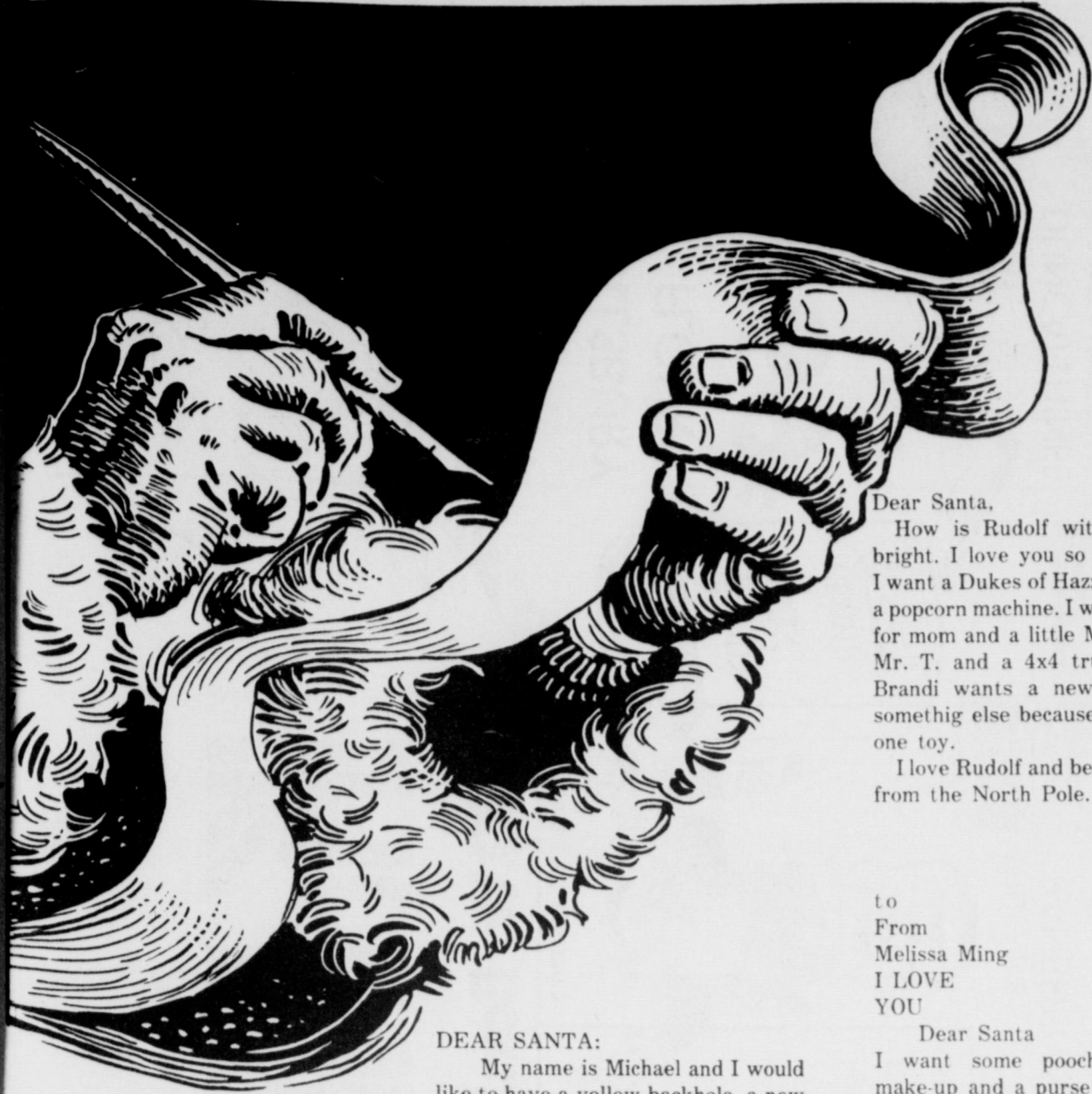
