| saved for every life lost, meaning that bout 100 years of travel time would be saved in exchange for one life lost and one severe injury. <br> The National Safety Council estimates that about 4,000 of the 43,000 people killed on U.S. roads last year died on Interstates. <br> The government classified 75 percent of the Interstate system as rural, but rural Interstate routes make up about six percent of all roads in the nation that are covered by the 55 mph limit. The rural Interstates carry 19 percent of all traffic that moves on highways with that speed limit. <br> The panel recommended that the system for measuring state compliance with the federal speed law be replaced with a procedure that "attaches more significance to high speed violations than to violations just above the speed limit." <br> West Texas and western states in general have argued for ten years that the speed limit was unnecessary for safety purposes on the long, mostly empty, stretches of highway through their states. <br> The panel said its projections indicated that if the speed limit was raised to 65 mph along the 31,500 miles of rural Interstate routes, it would result in about 500 more deaths, an increase in fuel comsumption of about 10 million barrels a year, and a $\$ 10$ million increase in taxpayer costs. <br> Tying the number of deaths each year on the nation's highways to the speed limit is ridiculous as far as we are concerned. <br> If 500 more people will die on rural Interstates if the limit is raised to 65 mph then conversely, 500 less should die if the limit is lowered to 45 mph . And perhaps another 500 could be saved if the national limit was set at 35 mph .
