The ones with the shucks stuck to the pecan itself may or may not be good. would suggest that the home Iner go ahead and gather the green at ins that have fallen and lay them After 3 or 4 days, try and remove the shucks off the pecans by cutting down the "ribs" that surround it. If the shucks peel off in sections, more than cure the pecan will go ahead and a bit darker than normal the pecan after cutting, it probably

When storing these, be sure and
lay them on a flat surface to cure lay them on a flat surface to cure.
Make sure they are fully cured before storing in boxes. Laying the pecans flat speeds up the curing process an guarantees a better quality pecan. The recent rains are helping out
