The credit may be computed only on earned income, such as wages or self-employment. Since it is refund ncome is so be claimed even though liability. It may be entered on either orm 1040 or Form 1040A Earned income credit is available to low income persons who provide a home in the United States that they share with a child for an entire year Married persons must also file a joint

unting at Iowa Park's two lakes hunting at Iowa Park's two lakes
west of town, shotguns only may be used to hunt birds, but only when the birds are in season.
Numerous inquiries have been
made to various officials recently made to various officials recently, concerning firing of gun
Iowa Park and Buffalo.
Under "Article Two, Parks and Playground Rules and Regulations," three paragraphs refer to hunting and firing of arms at the lakes. They ${ }^{\text {" }}$ (a) The discharge of any rifle, side arm, compressed air gun or air gun on park property owned by the city is prohibited except for hunting as authorized herein
"(b) Shotguns only may be used fo hunting on lake property wholly
owned by the city, but located outside the city limits, for the taking of game birds during season. Discharge of shotguns outside of season is strictly prohibited. The taking of game birds shall be strictly in accordance with the general laws of the state, as the
same are, or may be amended, as outlined by the state game and fish commission
"(c) All firearms are prohibited on
hose easement properties surround those easement properties surround-
ing the lakes. Persons trespassing on
