Every drug is intended to work at a certain rate. When absorption is
ither accelerated or slowed down, a particular medication may not do what either accelerated or slowed down, a particular medication may not do what
it's supposed to do. Interaction with certain foods can make a particular drug work faster, slower, or not at all.
The absorption of some drugs is affected by the presence of food in the
tomach. For example, the calcium in dairy products inhibits the absorption of the antibiotic tetracyeline. Calcium-containing antiacids also have this effect. In contrast, citrus fruits and juices hasten the absorption of some iron pills.

instructions. It matters whether you take your medicine at the prescribed time -- bedtime, morning, or after meals - because of the timing
