## Pecan trees need care

Pecans need special attention in the summer. That means applying sprays controlling casebearer aphids and scab, pruning and irrigating. The time for applying the second genera-
tion pecan nut casebearer tion pecan nut casebearer spray is
I have already begun seeing eggs n the nutlets of some varieties. Sprays containing Zolone, Diazinon and Sevin are being used by home owners. Comm
using Pydrin. ing Pydrin.
Pecan growers have had to worry every summer due to aphid leaves tions. Zolone and malathion sprays can give home owners good control these pesky pests.
Summer drought is a sure bet every year, and pecans will suffer if
they do not receive at least one inch of water per week from June through September. Actually, two inches is optimum.
A mature pecan tree will use more than 100 gallons of water per hy. If trees go more than three
reeks without water, serious crop bss can occur.
Woisture, so keep competitive vege
ation to a minimum under pecan
trees. With shallow soil and vegeta-
tion under trees, tion under trees, a weekly irrigation will be needed.
On young
On young pecan trees, weeds
slow down growth more thing else, go use a contact herbicide such as Roundup to keep the limb spread area weed-free. Pecan trees less than four years of age should have only one main
trunk. If two, three or four trunks detrunk. If two, three or four trunks de-
velop, simply cut the weaker ones out and leave the strongest one. Summer pruning of small limbs less than one inch in diameter can also be practiced. My old saying on pruning pecan trees is prune when about any time.

Young trees also should receive zinc sprays every two weeks to insure maximum growth. Make your final nitrogen application this month
because later applications because later applications can, and
probably will, result in freeze injury in December or January.

Freeze injury is showing up in parts of Texas on mature pecan trees. Varieties which were productive
st fall, such as Wichita or Mahan last fall, such as Wichita or Mahan,
have been hit the hardest. Since the pecan has a short chilling requirement of only 400 hours, it can have

Birthweight.
The committee found that maternal physical stresses are associated with infants of lower birthweight.

The evidence is less conclusive for psychological stress.
