CARDIAC CHECKUP URGED TO PREVENT SPORTS DEATHS

High school and college athletes should get a checkup for cardiac anomalies to identify those at risk of sudden death, according to Dr. Barry J. Maron of the National Institutes of Health.

Ideally, cardiac screening should be done by schools and colleges, but the costs of such responsibility for checkups must rest with the athlete's family and their private physician, states Dr. Maron
Good histories and physicals - including ECG's and, if indicated, echocardiograms could identify $90 \%$ of persons with hypertrophic cardiomyopathy, the major cause of sudden death in young athletes.

A family history of prematuare heart disease is a major warning sign for the youngster, because hypertrophic cardiomyopathy is an inherited trait, said Dr. Maron.

## Man with unusual vocation dedicated to good health

So, after 12 years selling insurance in California, he settled He is sales manager for Medical and Dental Equipment Repair, which located here in Iowa Park The business does m repair equipment for hospitals. They also do work for nursing homes, dental offices, clinics and ambulance services. The business has been expanded with contract work coming
from Wichita Falls, Olney and medical facilities in Oklahoma.
"There aren't enough trained personnel to adequately care for all the equipment used by the medical profession. There are highly sensitive pieces of equipment being
used that need competent repairmen to take care of them," explains Levine. "An overcalibrated defibrillator is just as dangerous as an under-calibrated one.

As much as Levine likes his
work, he also takes time out for work, he also takes time out for miles every morning. Starting out on Alameda, he heads north toward the expressway, cuts over a street and circles back. He begins his run at 6 every morning.
I I irs raining or the weather daya by running. Some people will plan their day over a cup or two of coffee, but I plan mine while I run. That way, I know what's important and what isnt: if $I$ remember it whe don't, it wasn't. It's also peaceful the mornings, and I enjoy the sun rises," he said.
Levine started running 10 year that four reasons for heart attacks were stress, lack of exercise, being overweight, and smoking.

Levine, being a non-smoker, was guilty of the other three. He began running slowly with a goal of part, giving his body a chance to adjust to the new demands. As his walking time decreased his distance increased. Before the end of a year, he had dropped 50 pound and had entered his first marathon. One of the high points of his tre was finishing that marathon. It
took him a little over four hours to finish the 26.2 miles, but finish it he finish
did.

To train for a marathon, Levine picked up his distance to seven miles picked up his distance to seven miles a day, five days a week, about two
months before the event. A monhh months before the event. A month
before the marahon, he added a few long distance runs to his weekly workouts.

A veteran of 10 marathons, he views them not as a contest of being faster than another person, but as a test of each runner against himself. "I am not a competitor," he explains, "I run for myself. I run an eight-minute mile while a world class runner runs four and fivemyself."
While his first marathon took a bit over four hours to finish, his last took him only three hours. Looking toward the future, he plans on helping John Church's
business grow as much as possible. business grow as much as possible.
He feels the potential for growth in the medical repair field is great and $h$ wants to be a part of it.

He also plans on running for as long as he can.
