Approximately $\$ 73$-million in Borrowers may apply for the
fund low-interest mortgage loans became available to Texas homebuyers as of
last week, a Texas Housing Agency official announced Thursday.
The FHA-insured loans will be offered to eligible low- and moderate-
income borrowers at a fixed payment income borrowers at a fixed payment
rate of 8.70 percent over 30 years, with a three to five percent maximum downpayment, said Dan A. McNeil, Acting Executive Administrator of the Texas Housing Agency.
The housing agency has established maximum income limits and a ceiling on home prices to direct the program more effectively to house-
holds least able to affort conventional interest rates, McNeil said.

To qualify for the program, an individual applicant must have an
adjusted gross income for the precedadjusted gross income for the preced-
ing tax year of $\$ 33,000$ or less; the combined income ceiling for a family is $\$ 42,000$.
In addition, for homes in most areas of the state, borrowers must be
firsst-time homebuyers or not have owned their principal residence in the past three years.
