It seems that people either like or dislike eggplant. Those who like i probably prefer it in casseroles or pried. It seems an important part of the Alayed an ierican diet, though it has gained litule ground in recent years. The people who do like eggplan
will probably like Mrs. Clyde Cole's will probably like Mrs. Ceite Cole's
Eggplant Parmigiana recipe in this week's Leader.
The humble eggplant has been introduced in at least two countries,
France and the United States under France and the United States under illustrious auspices. Louis XIX liked lo see rare and unknown foads on his
table, and the one in charge of the royal gardens gratified him by being the first to plant eggplant in northern France. Thomas Jefferson, a tireless searcher for new foods, had seeds and New World sent to him regularly from abroad. Among these which he experimented with at Monticello was the eggplant.
The eggplant is a native southeastern Asia, probably India where it is believed to have bee
cultivated several thousand years It cannot be said that it was received with enthusiasm where it spread to. It appeared on a menu given by Pope ins in 1570 though it did no attain the gastronomic peaks in tha East.

## HOW SWEET IT IS!!

Hawks 27, Bearcats 12

The Hawks got their revenge Friday night. They knocked off Ballinger, 27-12, at Stamford
for the Bi-District title and shortened the Bearcats' season, avenging the Area game of 1985 .
And the Mean Green did it in grand style. They were so dominating that they let their Junior Varsity
players fir players finish the final two minutes of the game.
It was the first loss of the season for Ballinger which was ranked third in the state by the Associated Press, and was the pre-season third-ranked Class AAA team in the state by Texas Football magazine. The "underdog" Hawks amassed 24 first downs to
Ballinger's 12, and used 10 backs to gain 348 net Ballinger's 12, and used 10 backs to gain 348 net
yards rushing against a team that had shut out five yards rushing against
opponents this season.
Iowa Park's 27 points was within seven of the 34
oints Ballinger's defense points Ballinger's defense had allowed all season. And the Bearcats, who had 329 points going into the game
were held to only seven by the Mean Green defense. were held to only seven by the Mean Green defense.
The other seven points was against the Junior Varsity group.
Fullback Danny Forman scored three touchdowns in the game, two on running plays of three and nine yards, and the other on a six-yard pass from Jeff Huff.

He finished with 56 yards rushing on 15 carries. of the season, though he didn't score a point. He carried 12 times, all in the first three quarters, for 89 yards; caught three passes for 33 yards, and average
37 yards on three punts. 37 yards on three punts.

he gained 73 yards rushing. The other touchdown was scored by junior full-
back Jim Cummings. He carried only three times, but gained 39 yards. His score was an 18 -yarder up the middle, and he left a trail of six red-shirted defenders
lying in his wake.
Another indication of Iowa Park's domination was the fact that the Hawks lost the ball twice on fumbles and were penalized 11 times for 104 yards,
and still won the game. and sullinger lost the

Feltman and David Meissner, and the other a pass interception by Eric Whitman. ger took the opening kickoff and marched all the way
to the Hawk eight yard line, and stalled three yards Iowa Park scored on its second possession, which
thor began on their own 45 yard line late in the opening period. Three passes by quarterback Scott Davis, a pair of 12 -yarders
Coker, were featured in the drive to the Bearcat three, from where Forman lit the scoreboard and Robert Adams followed with an extra point kick.
Later in the period, Ballinger covered a Galloway fumble on the Hawk 47, and scored four plays later on a 30 -yard pass.
But the Bearcats failed on their extra point try, even after two tries. They took a five-yard penalty for delaying the game, and attempted a pass for the twopoint conversion. It was intercepted by Whitman, but
the Hawks were penalized on a holding penalty. Then a bad snap to the kenck holder snuffed that attempt, and Ballinger trailed $7-6$ with $4: 22$ remaining in the half. Weaver returned the following kickoff from his own 15 to the Bearcat 40 , using the Hawks' starburst return play
Six plays later, Huff started to roll out to his
right from the six, was cut off and lobbed the ball right rom tefenders to Forman at the one, and he bulled his way into the end zone. Adams' kick with $1: 37$ remaining in the half gave the Hawks all the points they were to need the rest of the evening, 14-6.
