## City to negotiate settlement of suit

Following a 49-minute execu-
tive session Monday night, the city
council voted to authorize the mayor
and administrator to negotiate a
settlement in a suit against the city.
Mrs. Mable Karstetter has filid
suit against the city alleging wrong-
ful use of dirt taken from land leased
for the landfill, and negligence caus-
ing the death of several cattle.
The vote on the proposal was
split, however, as it was on one
other motion during the evening.
Alderman George Hammonds
voted against the negotiated settle-
ment, while Bud Mercer, Bud Burch
and Diane Robnett voted for it.
The other split vote concerned

"Additionally, I have been on the Board for eleven years (one-fourth of my lifetime) and am experiencing a certain degree of 'burn-out', which is
