Lower Alcohol, Fat, Sodium Intake Recommended In New Diet Guidelines
The American Heart Association has issued revised diet guidelines which, they believe, will lower the risk for cardiovascular disease.

The new guidelines call for healthy adults to limit their cholesterol intake to less than 100 mg per 1,000 calories, with a maximum intake of 300 mg per day.

Saturated fat intake should be less than 10\% of total calories and total fat intake should be less than $30 \%$. Sodium intake should be $1 \cdot \mathrm{~g} / 1,000$ calories with a maximum of 3 g a day

For adults who drink, alcohol should be limited to $15 \%$ of total calories, or $11 / 2$ ounces of alcohol (two drinks), or two 4-ounce glasses of wine, or two 12-ounce beers.
