CALLAHAN COUNTY OIL, GAS STATISTICS RELEASED

DALLAS — Callahan County oil and gas wells pumped some \$4.6 million into the county's economy last year, according to a study just released by the Texas Mid-Continent Oil & Gas Association.

Value of production from oil wells was \$4.4 million and from natural gas wells \$202,000, based on the most recent U. S. Bureau of Mines figures compiled by the Association. The county ranked 127th in the state in value of production.

"Output from Callahan County is part of this country's domestic oil supply which is endangered by some of the proposals now before Congress," commented Corbin J. Robertson, Assn. president. "Attempts to destroy depletion provisions of our income tax laws and to nullify present controls over imported oil could discourage further development of Texas oil resources. Eventually oil markets now shared by the county would be given over to foreign producers."

Last year, the county produced 1.5 million barrels of crude oil and 1.6 billion cubic feet of natural gas.

Of this total, county landowners and others with mineral interests received royalty payments of \$578,000.

The state received \$218,000 in production taxes with crude oil accounting for \$204,000 and natural gas \$14,000. A number of school districts in the county lean heavily on oil production for ad valorem support, such as Eula, 61.8%.

Rhodes Drilling Co. of Abilene staked No. 1 Carol Gillit as a proposed 700-foot rotary Moutray Sand wildcat.

Location is 14 miles southeast of Baird on a 160-acre lease.

It spots 730 feet from the north and 200 feet from the west lines of Section 49, D&DAL Survey.

A regular field well was completed seven miles south of Clyde at Laco Oil Co. of Abilene No. 5 S. E. Edwards.

It is located 2,190 feet from the south and 2,160 feet from the west lines of Section 15, BB&C Survey.

Daily potential was 26 barrels of oil, pumping from an open hole which was fractured with 20 sacks of sand. Pay was topped at 1,211 feet.

Operator set the 4 1/2-inch casing at 1,210, and the hole is bottomed at 1,238 feet.

Trumter Petroleum Co. of Ft. Worth staked two regular field locations five miles northwest of Putnam. Both are slated for 650 feet with rotary.

No. 14-B Herman Betcher is 660 feet from the south and 2,020 feet from the east lines of Section 66, BOH Survey.

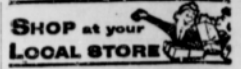
