Open Letter to Callahan County Commissioners Court

The Clyde Chamber of Commerce committee on ambulance service would appreciate that some information be made public about the status of prospective ambulance service in the area. The latest information we have is that the county commissioners court is trying to make arrangements with the cities to cooperate in providing this service, however, verifying that any meetings or efforts have occurred has been impossible. Any evidence of progress in this area would be appreciated to allay the fears and apprehensions of the public.

This committee was formed long before Callahan County was without ambulance service. In this phase of its work, the committe viewed a county-wide service as the logical solution. County officials were approached to provide ambulance service for the county. At this time any assistance needed to prove either the need or support of the program was offered. The Chamber of Commerce has no authority in this matter and this fact has continually frustrated our efforts. Our only methods were to demonstrate support.

The committee has found overwhelming support of county ambulance service. This committee is very interested in what is taking place and what we can do to expedite a solution to this problem. This committee is willing to work on this project with you if we could just be aware of what you need to have done. We would appreciate a speedy reply as we feel the situation is desperate.
