More Gas Tax to Schools Rep. Jerry Yost, R-Longview,
has filed a proposed constitutional amendment that would devote more of the state gasoline tax to public
education

The state constitution requires that 75 p (cent of the revenue generated by the 20 -cents-per-gallon gas tax goes to the Texas Depart-
ment of Transportation. The remaining 25 percent goes to public education.
Changing the formula to 65 percent for transportation and 35 percent for education would free
up an additional $\$ 351$ million for schools during the 1994-95 biennium, Yost said.
"This is the people's money,"
Yost said, adding that voters should be allowed to re-examine how the money is spent."
But Yost said he expects strong opposition from the highway lobby Rep. Rob Junell, D-San Angelo
hairman of the House appropria tions Committee, agreed. "There' going to be a good fight over that, he predicted.
