

# Questions and Answers about the Telephone Company's Request for Higher Rates in Iowa Park



#### O. Why is the telephone company asking for higher rates in Iowa Park?

A. Because present rates, which were established before the war, will not bring in enough revenue to permit operation of the Iowa Park exchange on a sound financial basis.

#### Q. What are the results of post-war operations of the telephone system here?

A. During 1948, telephone revenues in Iowa Park were only \$171 a month higher than operating expenses. This falls far short of a reasonable return on the value of the telephone system here.

#### Q. How about telephone costs? Are they up much?

A. Yes. Costs of furnishing telephone service, like post-war costs in most other businesses, are much higher than before the war.

#### Q. How long have lowa Park's telephone rates been in effect?

A. Present rates for telephone service here were established in 1940. At that time, Iowa Park had 290 telephones, as compared with more than 580 today. The scope and value of the service has increased greatly in the past 10 years with no increase in rates.

#### Q. With so much more business, isn't the company's revenue much higher than it was a few years ago?

A. Telephone revenues have increased, to be sure, along with the increase in telephones. But expenses have increased sharply, and although we have more than twice as many telephones in service as in 1940. present rates for service, established in 1940, will not permit operation of the Iowa Park telephone exchange on a sound financial basis.

#### Q. Would it be possible for the telephone company to cut corners and reduce expenses?

A. The telephone company takes advantage of every possible operating economy to keep rates low without affecting the quality of the service. Through these economies and advances in the telephone art we have been able to furnish more and more telephone service here without increasing rates. The telephone company is proud of its record of not having increased rates during these 10 years, although the number of telephones here has doubled and the cost of virtually everything that goes into the furnishing of service has risen sharply.

### Q. What does the rate increase amount to?

A. Briefly, for residence customers, the new rates represent an increase of 11/2 cents a day. Business telephones will cost six cents a day more.

#### Q. Why is it important to telephone users in lowa Park that the telephone system here be operated on a sound financial basis?

A. It is important to you and to the general welfare of Iowa Park that the telephone industry be progressive. It cannot be progressive long if it is not financially healthy.




