

Hodges, Anderson wed Saturday afternoon

BBQ Chicken Breasts

4 boneless chicken breasts

Marinade:

- 4 Tbsps. oil
- 4 Tbsps. soy sauce
- 2 Tbsps. lemon juice
- 1 Tbsp. brown sugar
- 2 cloves garlic, minced
- 1 tsp. thyme or basil
- Dash pepper

Blend together oil, soy sauce, lemon juice and brown sugar.

Place chicken in a single layer in

glass dish. Sprinkle with garlic, pepper and thyme. Pour marinade over chicken. Let stand in refrigerator for at least 4 hours, turning breasts from time to time.

Preheat grill. Place chicken on grill and baste with marinade. Grill 5 minutes on one side. Turn over and grill 5 - 9 minutes. Juice should run clear and chicken will be lightly brown.

Sourdough

- 2 pkgs. yeast
- 1 cup warm water
- 2/3 cup oil
- 2 cups buttermilk
- 5 cups self-rising flour
- 1 tsp. salt
- 1 tsp. baking soda
- 2 1/2 Tbsps. sugar

Mix ingredients and shape as desired. Bake 20-25 minutes in 375 degree oven. Will keep 6 weeks in refrigerator.

Buttermilk Pie

- 1/2 cup butter
- 2 cups sugar
- 3 eggs
- 3 Tbsps. flour
- 1 cup buttermilk
- Dash of nutmeg
- 1 - 9-inch unbaked pie shell

Cream together butter and sugar. Mix in eggs and flour and beat until fluffy. Fold in buttermilk and nutmeg. Pour mixture into pie shell and bake 45-50 minutes at 350 degrees.

Bread Pudding

- 2 1/4 cup milk
- 2 eggs, slightly beaten
- 8 cups bread crust (or buns)
- 1/2 cup brown sugar
- 1/2 tsp. cinnamon
- 1 tsp. vanilla
- 1/4 tsp. salt
- 1/2 cup sugar
- Raisins, if desired

Mix all ingredients except bread crumbs (put in last) gently. Pour into greased baking pan and bake 45 min-

utes to 1 hour at 350 degrees. Cool and make Butter Sauce.

Butter Sauce

- 1/2 cup butter
- 3/4 cup sugar
- 3 Tbsps. flour
- 1 tsp. vanilla
- 1 cup boiling water

Put first four ingredients in a saucepan and add 1 cup boiling water. Cook until thick. Cut bread pudding and pour butter sauce over.

NOTE: It is best to use crust or buns (any kind). When pinching off into your 8 cups, don't compress down.

Texas Fudge Brownies

- 1/2 cup butter
- 1 1/2 cup sugar
- 1 - 16 oz. can Hershey's Syrup
- 4 eggs
- 1 cup flour
- 1 cup pecans

Blend butter, sugar and syrup. Add eggs one at a time. Mix well after each egg. Stir in flour and pecans. Bake in greased 9x13 pan at 350 degrees 25 minutes or until done.

Frosting

- 1 cup butter
- 1 1/2 cup sugar
- 1/3 cup canned milk
- 1/2 cup chocolate chips

Melt butter in saucepan; add sugar and milk. Bring to a boil stirring constantly. Boil 2 minutes. Remove from heat; stir in chocolate chips until melted. Frost brownies.

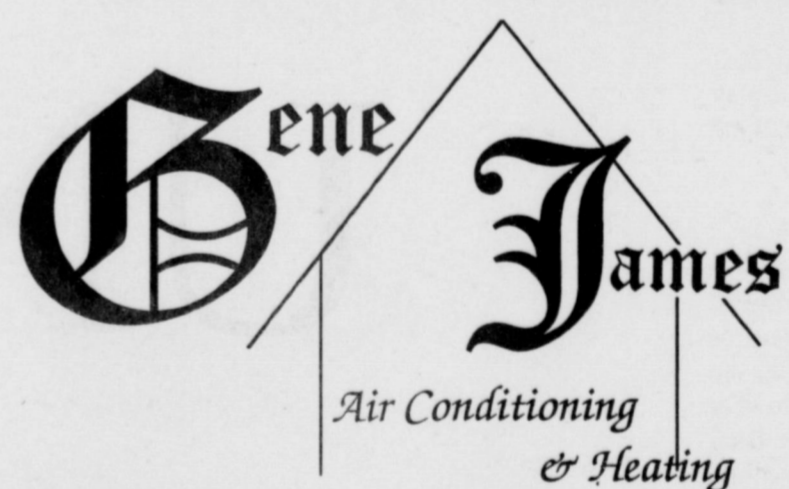
Tips for the Summer Traveler

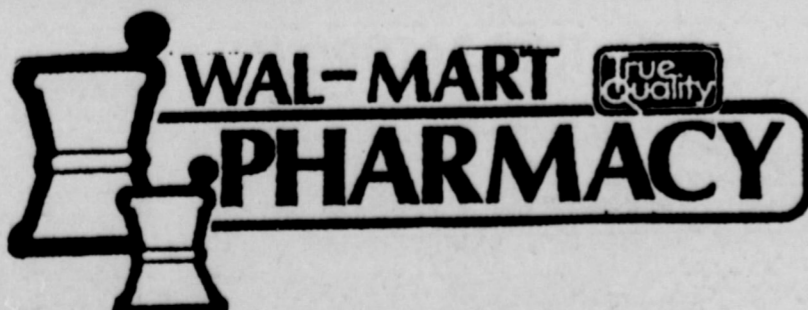

complaints." Thompson's response was that one of the highest visibility spots in town (US 287 and Pacific) had head-high weeds, broken windows and was a general eyesore. "But until there's a complaint, it won't be worked on?" he asked.

Roy later said it might be possible for him to build a smaller fenced area on his lot, if he decided to go back into the recycling business, which he closed after two years of operation.

OTHER BUSINESS

Mayor House had to break a tie vote when the zoning of Park Place Addition was decided by ordinance.

Both the developer, Richard Porter, and the planning and zoning board had recommended that the newest annexation to the city be zoned "R-2," which allows homes to be built with a minimum of 1,000 square feet as well as mobile homes and multi-family structures.

The addition is located on the northwest corner of US 287 and FM 368.

A tie developed when aldermen Virgil Woodfin and Bud Mercer voted approval, Bob Hamilton and Mark Raby against it, and Crawford abstained.

The mayor cast his vote in favor of the zoning as proposed.

Another issue of the evening, which passed but did not receive unanimous approval, was a format of contracting out the maintenance of the city's water and sewer system.

At issue was the city dissolving its four-man department that maintains the lines from the two treatment plants and the customer property, and turn

over that responsibility to the lowest bidder.

Specific requirements must be met by the successful bidder, including time of response to calls.

The current department is one worker short, and the other three would be phased into other departments, the mayor pointed out.

All aldermen except Hamilton voted approval of the proposed format.

Council members voted to accept the lowest of four bids to lay a new sewer trunk along a portion of West Highway.

The bids ranged from \$88,685.50 to \$216,639.16, and Potcoet Inc. submitted the winning bid.

Other topics of the meeting included:

- * approval of a request by Sammy Bates for water and sewer service outside the city limits;

- * approval of a resolution authorizing the mayor to execute a lease agreement with Rusty Rusk for land next to the new water tower;

- * approved the 1995 budget proposed by Nortex 9-1-1 Communications District;

- * received a request from Steve Hammonds to either name a park after the late Dutch George, or designate where Hammonds might plant a tree in George's name.

- * agreed to hold their fourth budget workshop at 7 p.m. next Monday.

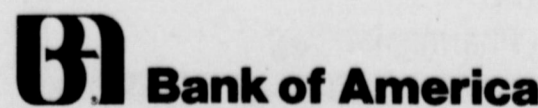

Frank M. Terlizzi has been appointed to the position of bags operations manager of the Iowa Park facility of Cryovac.

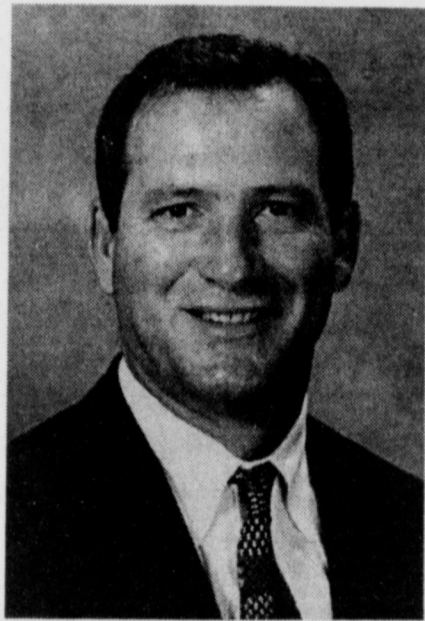



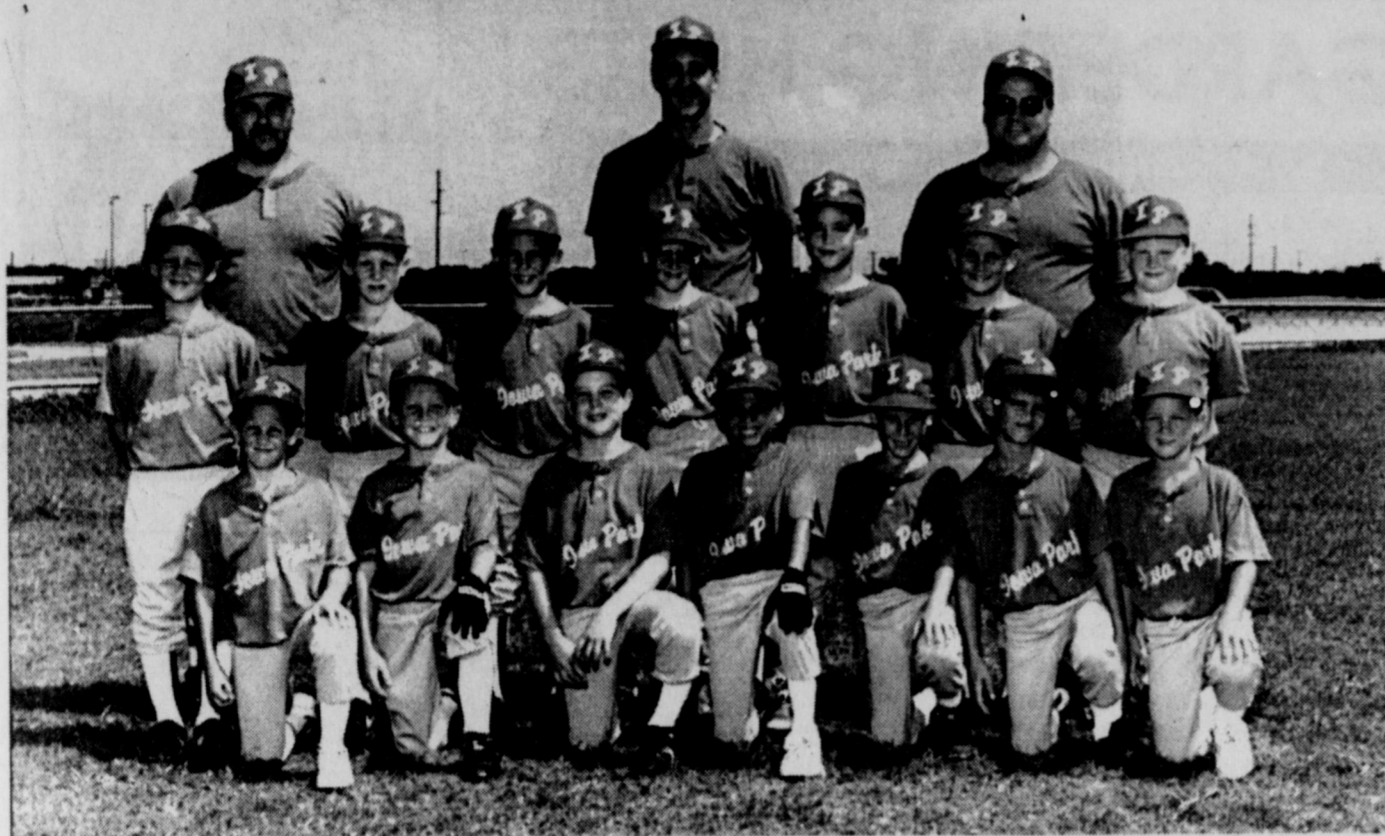

Health-care solution

Reasonable health-care insurance reform can be done without crippling the world's best health-care system and without further surrender to federal dependency and national bankruptcy.

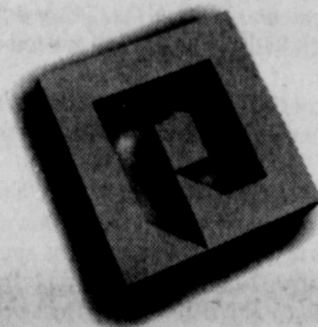
