## Baird Bands Excel At Regional Recieve Superior Ratings

For the second year the Baird Junior High and High School Bands received first division or superior ratings at regional competition.

On March 25, the Baird Junior High Band traveled to Cisco Junior College for their annual contest. The band performed two numbers for a panel of judges who each rated the band first division. In the sight-reading phase of the competition, the band was rated 2nd division. This is the second year in a row and the third year in four years that this group has been rated 1st Division.

On April 21, the High School Band performed at the Region II U.I.L. Concert and Sight-reading Contest held at Cooper High School. The Band was rated First Division in Concert and Sightreading. In Concert, the three judges each awarded

the group with a I. Each one of the judges were very complimentary toward the band. One judge remarked on how much he enjoyed listening to such an outstanding band and that the school and community should be very proud of their abilities and training. Another judge commented that ours was the best band that he had heard in the AA competition.

In sight-reading, the band was rated II by one judge and I by the two remaining judges. All three of these judges commented on how well disciplined and attentive the band was.

Our community can be very proud of the dedication and effort of these two bands. The public will have an opportunity to see and hear these two bands plus the beginner band on May 18 at the annual Spring Concert.

## Dr. Lutrick Returns For Revival After 30 Years

Dr. Charles Edward Lutrick will be the evangelist in a revival at Baird First United Methodist Church May 2-5. He served the church in Baird in 1952 and 1953 and is currently pastor of First United Methodist Church in Midland.

Revival services will begin with the Sunday evening service, preceded by a covered dish dinner, on May 2 and will include morning services at 7 a.m. and evening services at 7:30 p.m. Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday. A study of Ephesians will be his subject in the morning services and evening services will have the theme, "Called to be Disciples today."

A 12-hour prayer vigil is planned beginning Saturday, May 1 at 6 p.m. He will be assisted by Fred Kunkel of Abilene, singer, Viva Peek, organist, and Karen Shelnutt, pianist. Additional news of the revival will be given through WFAA, 57 on the radio dial, in the regular program from 6-8 a.m. Sunday May 2. Printed flyers are being distributed by the Youth.

Dr. Lutrick has served churches in Lubbock, Vega, Florida, Baird and Midland. He has also held various positions in Conference work. A native of Abernathy and 1940 graduate of Abernathy schools, he took his BA degree from Texas Tech in 1945. He received the Masters from Perkins School of Theology at SMU in 1949 and the Doctor of Divinity from McMurry in 1968. His wife, Ruth, grew up and was educated in Lubbock. They have three children.

Tina placed 1st in the 100-meter Dash

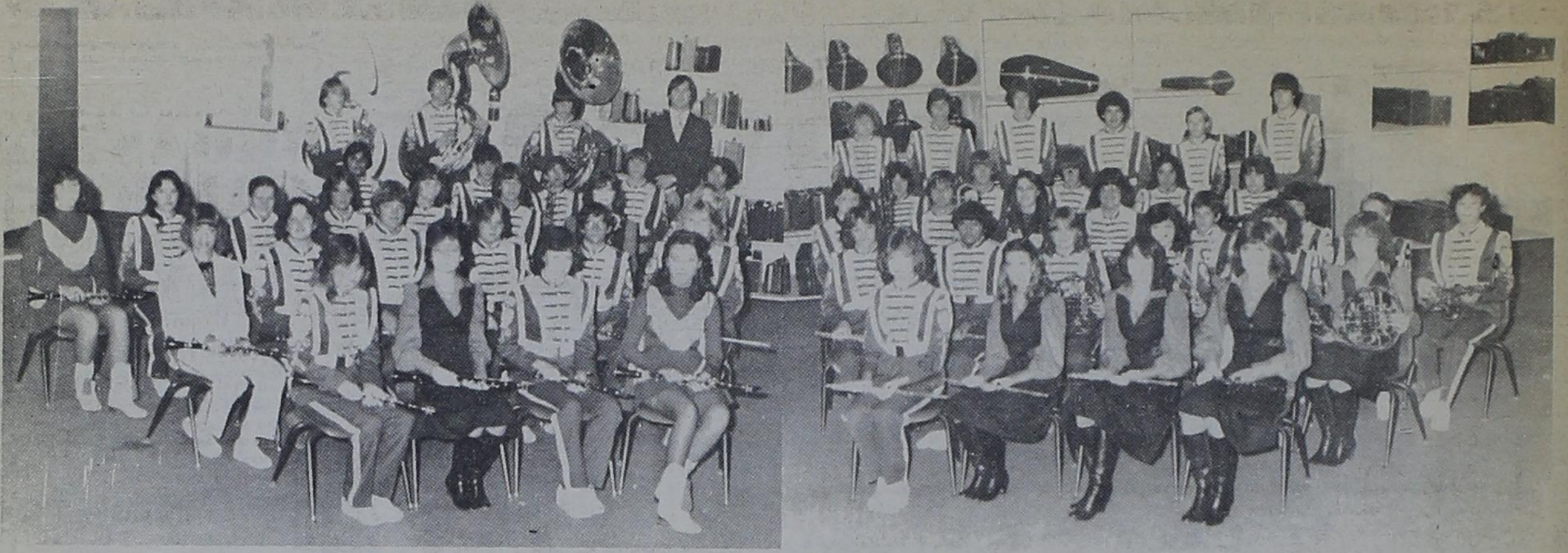
and 1st in the High Jump.

A \$1.6 million school bond in answer to discrepancies in fire regulations has been proposed by the Eula Independent School District.

Violation were discovered Jan. 27 in a routine fire inspection, by a represen-

A March 8 deadline was given to recitify the problems, and less-exspensive repairs were done.

The board was granted time to hold a bond election.

Construction and remodeling, equipment and property purchases would be financed if a bond is approved.

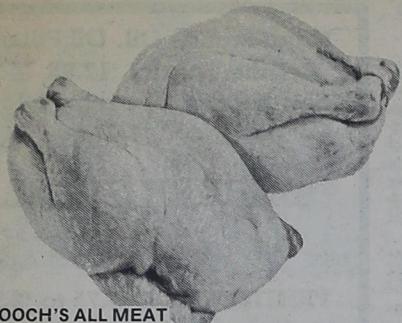
Survivors include her husband; 3 sons; a step-daughter; four brothers including, A.J. Walker of Clyde; 10 grandchildren and several nieces and nep-

# Kindergarten Pre-Registration And Immunization Clinic

Pre-registration of Kindergarten students for 1982-83 for Baird will be held on Wednesday, May 5 from 9-11:30 a.m. in the Elementary Library. Boys and girls who will be 5 years old on or before September 1, 1982 will be eligible for enrollment.

Birth certificates and immunization records are required at the time of registration. An official state birth certificate is required—not a hospital certificate. An official certificate can be obtained by writing to the county clerk's office in the county in which the child was born or to the Bureau of Vital Statistics in Austin. A \$3.00 fee is charged for this service.

A free immunization clinic will be held at the time of registration. Parents are asked to bring their children to the clinic

for T.B. tests and any additional shots that may be needed. All kindergarten students for next year should be tested at this time for T.B., so parents should bring their children when they are registered.

### Immunization Requirements

**Tetanus-Diphtheria**-At least three doses of DTP or TD are required, provided one dose has been received on or rather the fourth birthday.

**Polio**-Three doses are required, with one dose after the fourth birthday.

**Measles**-All students must have received measles vaccine on or after the first birthday, or have a signed and dated statement by a doctor of measles illness.

**Mumps**-Same requirement as measles vaccine.

**Rubella**-One dose of rubella vaccine is required.

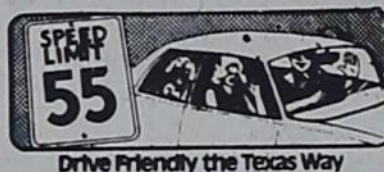

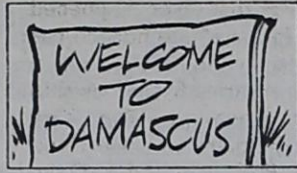

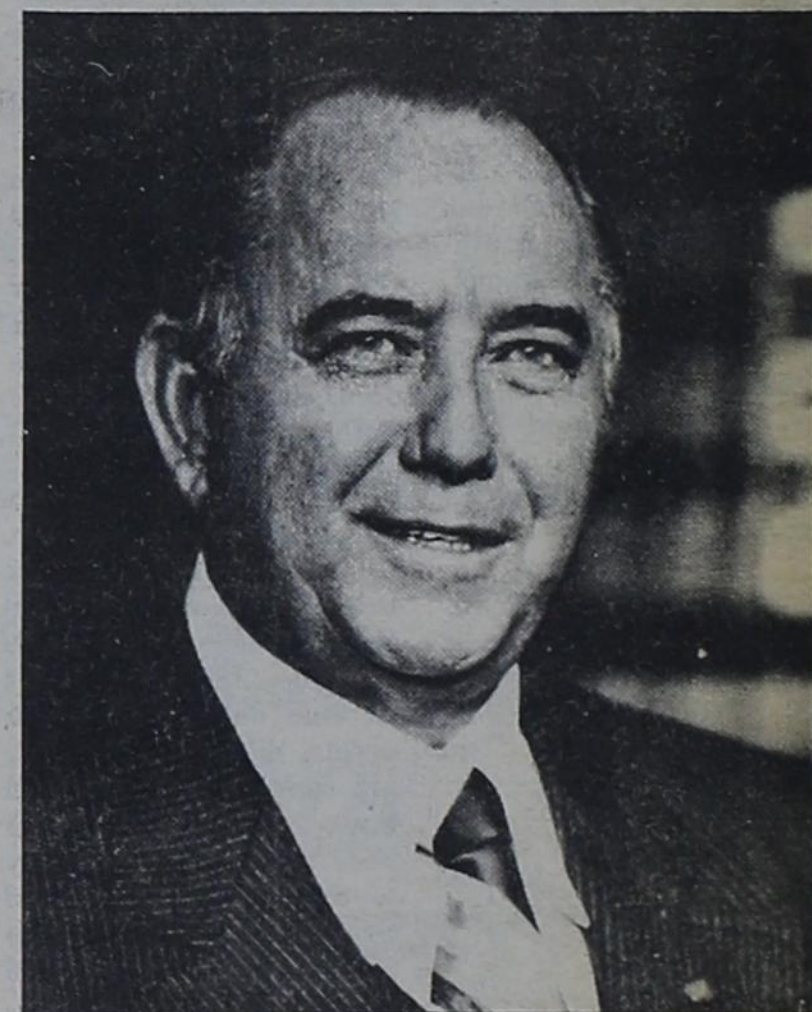
