## Trustees breeze through

## monthly meeting agenda

School trustees took quick action fered by Supt. Glen Mitchell, in their monthly meeting Thursday night. A far-reaching proposal was to write letters to elected officials, re questing their support inchanging leg islation which would lead to the ranting of a tax abatementto Cryovac The leters, signed by each mem Representatives John Hirschi and Charles Finnell, Senator elect Tom Haywood, and also Lt. Gov. Bob Bul-
lock. Their proposal is that legislation repeal a 1993 act which requires tax abatements to be deducted from assessed property values for school financing.

The letters point out.
"Cryovac which is a large industry in our school district employs over 700 people, and they have asked for a tax abatement because they plan to expand their plant by over year 2000 , almost doubling their inyear 2000 , almost doubling their in-
vestment in North Texas. We granted an abatement to Cryovac in 1991 be cause the increased values did notcount against our state values. However, we cannot grant a waiver under the present law because it would cost our schoo district $\$ 739,937$ in state revenue during the 1997-98 school year and by the year 2000 it would cost our district $\$ 1,381,132$ annually. We feel this is unfair to small rural communities in Texas, since larger municipalities can better afford to do so. We want to promote business grown. We wani cially grant the tax watement witho the legislature repealing the deadlin for tax abatements."

Each year, the number of fires ises as the temperature falls," said Michael Hines, executive director of the Texas Commission on Fire Proection. "Because many of these fires are caused by carelessness with home heating equipment, we strongly urge everyone to take care of their heaters and fireplaces this winter.
During 1993, 17 people died in fires caused by heating equipment, according to the Texas Fire Inciden Reporting System. More than 1,800 The most common cause of heating fires was allowing portabie heaters too close to something combustible, such as bedding, furniture or wall surfaces "This means that most heating fires could have easily been prevented, Hines said.
The Commission recommend hese actions to help prevent heating fires:
be necessary. Contact the Better Busilance. This mean there must be a leas three feet, or about the distance of an adult's arm length, between the heater and any furniture, blankets, chairs, sofas or the nearest wall. - Have central heating equipment, as well as portable heaters, checked by a qualified technician. Your best option is to have the equipment checked before you turn it on for the first time this season. However, just because you've been able to use the equipment safely without a checkup doesn t mean that the equip
checked now.

- If you have a fireplace, have the chimney inspected each year by a qualified chimney cleaning service Ask the "chimney sweep" for tips on using your fireplace most effectively. If you are worried about the cost of having your heating equipment or chimney inspected, talk to several companies before agreeing to the service. Typically, a heating or chimney inspection by a qualified technician state.
