## Man charged with cattle theft

Wichita Co allege that Martin stole some 3 head of cattle in the last month or so Over half have been recovered, according to David Duke with the sherrifs deptartment.

Martin told depuies he operates a business, Martin Livestock Transport, in which he transports catle for ranch-
The first theft of cattle reported was on May 17 when Bruce Sheperd Dept that 11 head of caule, valued at about $\$ 5,000$, were missing from his lease property northeast of lowa Park. He believed they had been taken May 15 or 16.
On May 18, John Mann of Punkin Center reported a stock trailer stolen around the same time. The trailer was valued at $\$ 2,000$.
