**HELPING TO SAVE** their facilities after a grassfire hit the high school baseball field are coaches and players, who had alerted the fire department. The raging fire, which originated Thursday afternoon near the railroad and is rumored to have

been set by two as-yet unknown girls, was fanned by strong southerly winds. It reportedly caused some \$3,000 in damage to the windscreen and outfield standard. Neither the bus barn area nor old Van Horn house were damaged.

## City purchases 6 lots by south water tower

The City of Iowa Park now owns six lots in the south part of town.

Council members, during their regularly-scheduled meeting Monday, approved payment of \$1,500 for each of the lots to Mrs. Peggy Blanchard.

It wasn't a need for the property that prompted the purchase, however. When the city relocated a water tower a few years ago on West Emerald, access to the lots was cut off.

Mrs. Blanchard was asking \$2,000 per lot. The city had an independent appraisal made of the tract, and was told their value was \$1,000 each.

The \$1,500 was a compromise worked out with the former owner.

Insurance agent Robert Bosley requested, and was granted, a six-month waiver of the city's solicitation permit fee requirement, which will allow him to contact residents at their homes without appointments.

Bosley, who lives here but works out of an office in Wichita Falls, explained his need to contact potential customers, and said the permit fee specified in the ordinance made

such contacts prohibitive.

A request from Kenneth Shelton for permission to tap a two-inch water line, which is privately-owned on South Bell Road, so he could purchase city water, was approved.

Shelton will be required to pay a \$300-tap fee and be charged the usual out-of-city rates for the water.

Also approved was an ordinance increasing the amount the city administrator can expend for a purchase, from \$3,000 to \$5,000, without council approval.

Aldermen discussed, but took no action during the meeting, a proposal to extend Jackson Street northward to the 1200 block.

The proposal was made by Kenneth Beall, who said his daughter wishes to build a home there, and two or three other homes also would be constructed.

Because extension of the street would require either altering the size or location of the pavilion in Oscar Park, council members said they wanted to study alternatives before

## All May 4 positions now have candidates

There are now candidates for all three positions on the city council, but the opportunity to file remains open until Wednesday, Mar. 20.

Mercer currently serves as a city alderman. Hunter previously held the mayoral post. Witherspoon has never held an elective position.

Tim Rich filed Monday morning as a candidate for the position currently held by Johnny Crawford.

One candidate, Terry Johnson, has filed for the alderman seat being vacated by Mercer.

Crawford has not made a statement whether he will seek re-election in the May 4 election.

No one other than the two incumbents on the school board has filed for a place on that May 4 ballot.

Three candidates have filed for the mayor's position, which will be vacated at the end of this term since Wayne House said he will not run again.

The two seeking re-election are Keith Fisher, who currently is serving as chairman of the board, and Randy Catlin.

The three, all of whom filed the first day they were being accepted, are Bud Mercer, George Witherspoon and Tim Hunter.

Candidates for the school board election also have until Mar. 20 to file for a place on that ballot.

City candidates can file at city hall, and school trustee candidates file at the administration building.

## Police seek suspect in assault case

Police are investigating an alleged assault of a Wal-Mart employee Saturday morning.

A man reportedly became upset while attempting to return merchandise when he was told he did not have the documentation required by the store to receive a refund.

When the man began cursing and threatening, the female employee picked up the telephone to notify police. The man is alleged to have grabbed her, making her drop the phone, and walked out.

The suspect reportedly left in a pickup. He was described as standing six feet tall, slender build, mustache, wearing jeans and a Cowboy T-shirt. Police believe they may have the suspect's name, and are planning a photo lineup.

Five arrests were made by police during the past week, four of them on outstanding warrants.

Stephen Vinson Acherson, 27, was taken into custody at 12:43 a.m. Thursday in the 600 block of South Bond, and charged with a Class C assault.

He was released from custody at 7:50 a.m. after signing a promise to appear in municipal court, according to the police blotter.

At 2:06 p.m. Thursday, Gary

Lynn Burris, 40, was taken into custody on an outstanding warrant issued by the Wichita County sheriff's department.

Two warrants had been issued for his arrest, including theft of service, with a \$2,500 bond, and driving while license was suspended, no bond.

Burris was turned over to a county deputy at 2:02 p.m. to be transported to the jail.

Billy Paul Griffin, 21, was placed under arrest at 12:22 a.m. Friday in the 200 block of East Cash, after it was determined two locally-issued warrants were on file concerning him.

The outstanding warrants were for driving without a valid license and having an expired motor vehicle inspection sticker.

Griffin was released at 1:55 a.m. after posting \$30 toward total fines of \$210.

At 9:22 p.m. Saturday in the 600 block of East Alameda, officers arrested Earl Wayne Wilson, 31, after determining two Wichita County warrants against him were outstanding.

Both the warrants were for reckless driving. Wilson was turned over to a sheriff's deputy at 1 a.m. to be transported to jail in Wichita Falls.

Sean Lynn Mitchell, 19, was taken into custody at the police station Sunday, after it was determined two locally-issued warrants against him were outstanding.

The warrants were for failing to yield right of way to an emergency

vehicle, and failure to maintain financial responsibility, with total fines of \$499.50.

Mitchell was released later after signing an order to appear in municipal court.

A student at Iowa Park High School reported Friday the theft of some \$1,500 worth of jewelry from her locker in the athletic dressing room. The case is under investigation.

A vehicle parked Saturday night in the 700 block of West Coleman reportedly had a window broken.

## Clean-Up Week slated

The annual City-Wide Clean-Up, Fix Up Week dates were set Monday by the Chamber of Commerce for March 25 through 31.

The event is co-sponsored each year by the Chamber and City of Iowa Park.

In conjunction with that special week, Chamber directors also set Mar. 30 as the date for the spring city-wide

garage sale, a one-day event.

The tentative date of Friday, May 31 was set for the All-Iowa Park Golf Tournament, also sponsored annually by the Chamber.

Organizations and individuals wishing to volunteer to participate in Clean-Up Week are encouraged to contact Susan Dillard, Chamber secretary. Areas for their work will be assigned prior to that week.

Directors discussed their concern over recently-arrived new city maps. Tommy Key complained that the printing was not to the standard of previous maps, their size was smaller than before, and shipment was six months behind schedule.

Another complaint that affects the businesses of the community was aired by Kenneth Via.

He pointed out that numerous contacts are made during the year by businesses not located here, reporting to represent local entities such as the schools.

Case in point, Via said, was the football schedule poster, where none of the advertising dollars are kept locally, like they previously were when the Booster Club directed the project.

No recommendation was made during the discussion, however.

## 'Coins for Corey' is successful

Kidwell students filled a wagon with coins in response to a fund-raising drive to aide first grader Corey McMahon.

The seven year old son of David and Wendy McMahon of Iowa Park, had a brain tumor removed Feb. 13 in Dallas. Corey remains at Cooke's Children's Medical Center of Dallas, but is expected to return home next week.

In a drive termed "Coins for Corey," students were asked to bring coins to school in an effort to help the family defray medical and travel expenses.

And they did. As of Friday, just three days into the drive, students had brought some \$420 in change and dollar bills, which were deposited into accounts set up for the drive. Another \$250 was collected in canisters that were placed at local businesses.

Students may continue to bring money for the fund to the school through tomorrow, when the drive will end.

# Cook of the Week

This week we are featuring the favorite recipes of Sandra (Mrs. Perry) Green's family.

She told us that they really enjoy Mexican food and has included the recipe for "Burrito Chili & Cheese Casserole."

### Pineapple Cake

- 1 1/2 cups sugar
  - 2 cups flour
  - 2 tsps. soda
  - 2 eggs
  - 1 - 20 oz. can crushed pineapple
- Mix together in bowl. Pour into floured 11x15 pan. Bake about 30 minutes at 350 degrees.

### Icing

- 1 1/2 cups sugar
  - 1 stick oleo
  - 1 small can (6 oz.) evaporated milk
  - 1 cup pecans
  - 1 cup coconut
  - 1 tsp. vanilla
- Combine sugar, oleo and milk in saucepan. Cook 3-5 minutes over high heat. Add vanilla and stir well. Add pecans and coconut; mix well. Pour over cooled cake. Refrigerate.

### Burrito Chili & Cheese Casserole

- 6-8 frozen burritos
  - 1 - 19 oz. can chili
  - 1 chopped onion
  - 10 ozs. Cheddar cheese, grated
  - 1 ctn. sour cream
- Place frozen burritos in casserole dish. Thaw in microwave. Sprinkle chopped onions over the burritos. Warm chili and sour cream together. Pour over burritos. Sprinkle with grated cheese; cover and warm in microwave until hot and cheese is melted.

### Orange Rice

(Great with the burritos)

- 2 chicken bouillon cubes
  - 2 Tbsps. oil
  - 2-3 Tbsps. chili powder
  - 3 cups water
  - 1 1/2 cups rice
- In saucepan over medium heat add oil and chicken bouillon cubes. Break or smash cubes with spoon. Add chili powder and mix well. Add water and bring to a boil. Add rice and return to a boil. Stir rice; cover pan and reduce heat to simmer. Cook 20 minutes. Remove from heat when done and let set 3-5 minutes. Fluff with a fork.

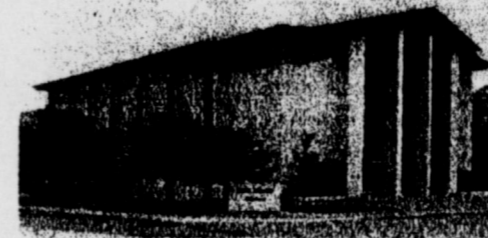

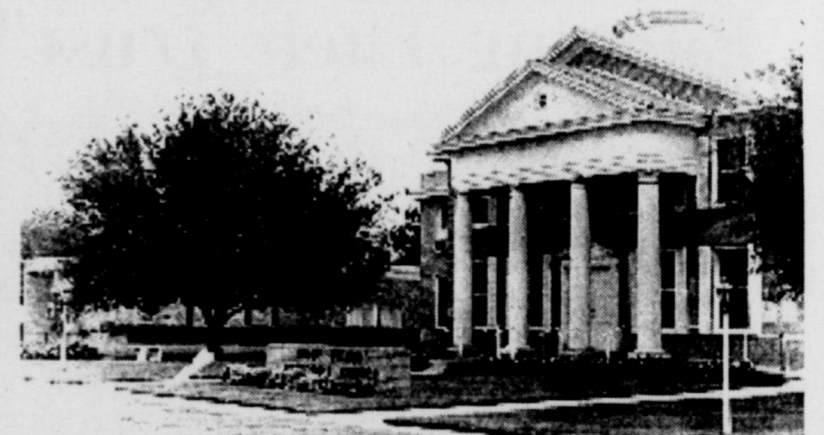

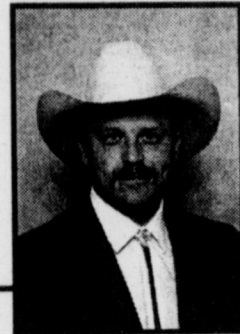

# Hawks start with wins

The Iowa Park Hawk baseball team opened the '96 season on a strong note by winning their first two games of the season.

The Hawks started the week with a 6-5 win over Burkburnett Friday afternoon, then capped the week with an 8-0 shutout over Holliday Tuesday.

In the Burk game, the Bulldogs jumped out to a 2-0 lead but the Hawks put up a 4 spot in the bottom of the second to take a 4-2 lead. Dusty Owen got things started with a walk, Robert Klinkerman followed with a single and then Corky Petty walked to load the bases. Owen came in to score on David Waterbury's RBI sacrifice fly for the first run of the season. Chad Wright drove in the next three runs with a home run on a ball that the Burk centerfielder dove for that went to the fence.

The Bulldogs added single runs in the top of the third and fourth innings to tie the game at 4-4 but in the bottom of the fifth, Iowa Park took the lead for good when Waterbury doubled, stole third and came in to score on a passed ball.

The Hawks added an insurance run in the bottom of the fifth when Owen led off with a walk and was moved to second by Klinkerman's single. Owen and Klinkerman pulled off a double steal leaving runners at second and third. Owen came in to score on another passed ball to make the score 6-4. Burk added a single run in the top of the seventh but Chris Norris, who came on to pick up the save, shut the door to preserve the win.

Clancy Lalumia pitched the first 2 2/3 innings with Petty going the next 2 1/3 to pick up the win. Norris came on in the top of the sixth and worked the final two innings to earn the save.

Leading hitters for Iowa Park were Wright who went 1x3, scored a run and had 3 RBIs. Waterbury finished 1x2 with two runs scored and 1 RBI. Klinkerman also finished 1x3 with a run scored.

In the Holliday game, it was all Iowa Park as the Hawks beat the Eagles, who were the No. 3 ranked team in the state in Class 2A, 8-0 on a combined two-hitter by Norris and Klinkerman.

Norris, 1-0, went five strong innings to pickup the win striking out 11 while allowing only one hit and three bases on balls. Klinkerman came on in the top of the sixth and allowed only one hit as well.

The Hawk hitters were just as impressive pounding out 10 hits including a home run by Lalumia, a triple by Petty and a double by Waterbury.

Iowa Park got on the board in the bottom of the third when Kevin Braziel and Lalumia each singled and scored on passed balls to make the score 2-0. Owen walked and stole second and went to third on a ground out by Klinkerman. Petty followed with his triple to drive in Owen for the third run and came in to score the fourth run when Waterbury doubled.

The Hawks went on top 5-0 in the bottom of the fourth when designated hitter Shaun Campbell walked, went to second a passed ball, stole third and scored on another passed ball.

Iowa Park made it 6-0 in the bottom of the fifth when Petty reached base on an error by the third baseman. Waterbury singled moving Petty to second where he scored on Norris' RBI single to center.

The final two runs came in the bottom of the sixth when Braziel reached base on an error and scored on Lalumia's home run on a ball. The centerfielder dove for the ball but

it went all the way to the wall for a stand-up homer to make the final score 8-0.

"We didn't play with very much emotion in the Burk game," said head coach David Fuhrman. "We had some first game jitters where Burk had a game under their belts. I wasn't very happy with only five hits. I didn't think their pitching was that strong but we sucked it up and won the game and that was a plus."

"We started out flat against Holliday too," Fuhrman added. "We got started in the third with the four runs but we only earned two of those and the other two were given to us by their errors. I thought Norris looked sharp and even when Holliday did hit the ball, we played good defense behind him. We didn't make any errors and did a good job on the bases taking the extra bag when we had the opportunity."

The Hawks will not get much time to dwell on the first two victories as they travel to Childress to play in the Childress Tournament that gets started at 9:30 a.m. today with Iowa Park and Childress scheduled in the first game. The Hawks will play another game today and will return to Childress for two more games on Saturday with the times depending on the outcome of Thursday's games.

The Hawks will also travel to Hoskins Field to take on the Wichita Falls High School Coyotes at 4 p.m. on Monday.

## JV winning 'no-hitters'

The JV Hawks baseball team has a streak that spans over the first two games this season of not allowing a hit.

That's right, back-to-back no-hitters by the Iowa Park JV.

Iowa Park opened the season with a 6-3 win over Burk and despite the three runs the Bulldogs scored, not a single Burk hitter reached base by a hit. The Hawks committed five errors in the game that allowed Burk to score it's three runs. Levi Scholl, Justin Terry, Waylon Stewart and Jonathan Clubb all combined on the no-hitter against Burk.

## Former Lady Hawk to be recognized

Erica Knight will become the third person to be inducted into the Hawk Track Hall of Fame, during ceremonies prior to the finals of Saturday's annual Iowa Park Lions Club Hawk Relays.

Despite the fact that she attended high school here only two years, she established herself as one of the most... if not the most... accomplished Lady Hawk track athlete. In addition, she was a starter on the varsity basketball team, and was consistently on the academic honor roll.

As a freshman and sophomore, she earned four medals at the state UIL track meet.

Her freshman year, 1990, she placed third in both the triple jump and 100-meter hurdles. The following year, Erica earned second place in the triple jump and repeated her third

place in the hurdles, and then added a fifth place in the high jump.

Erica's career as a Lady Hawk was cut short when her father, Billy Yarbrough, was transferred by his company to Oklahoma. The family moved to Ardmore, where Erica competed one more year in track. She placed third in the hurdles at the state meet, but Oklahoma does not have competition in the triple jump.

She earned a starting position on Ardmore's basketball team, which competed in the state tournament her junior year. As a senior, she opted to not compete in track, but her team won the state basketball championship, and she was named Most Valuable Player of the tournament.

Her reason for not competing in track her final year in high school was the fact that she was recruited and accepted

a full scholarship to play basketball at Baylor University, which she did through her sophomore year. An injury prohibited her from continuing in the sport, and she is now concentrating on academics, at Midland Junior College.

In earning the third-place medals at Austin her freshman year, her best in the triple jump was a 36-8, and she was clocked in 15.3 in the hurdles. The following year, she placed second in the hurdles with a 15.0, third in the triple jump with a distance of 37-3.3, and cleared 5-2 for fifth in the high jump.

Erica's name will be on a special plaque and permanently mounted at the base of the flag staff on the east end of Hawk Stadium, with the first two recipients of the recognition.

The first to be named to the Hawk Track Hall of Fame was Coach Bill Carter, followed last year by the late Bobby Gilbreath.
