Shoppers will be able to register for a six-foot Burr Oak tree, to be given away at closing time, according to Wendy Meadows, instructor. ## Third study ready on golf course here

The city council will take another look Monday at a feasibility study made recently on the possibility of building a golf course.

This will be the third such study contracted by the city, and made by Flatt Golf Services, Inc.

No site for an 18-hole course has been discussed in public. The other two studies made were on undeveloped tracts of land west of the city, on the north and south sides of U.S. 287.

No action was taken on either of the two earlier sites.

Monday's meeting is to begin at 7 p.m. in council chambers.

released on the meeting, a public appearance has been requested by Mrs. Lita Watson.

Mrs. Watson, a former city alderman and identified by most as being the authority on the city's history, is to request the city to purchase and erect historical markers at the old refinery and fair grounds.

She also will ask that the historical marker located in City Hall Park also be relocated, though the proposed site is yet to be designated.

Aldermen are to consider authorizing Administrator Mike Price to contract with Eddie Mandela for the widening of a concrete drainage

structure on West Magnolia. Four ordinances and two resolutions also appear on the agenda.

The ordinances concern:

- \* modifying the cost of natural gas service adjustment clause for residential and commercial consumers;
- \* amending the existing ordinance concerning traffic signs on certain residential street intersections;
- \* allowing building and plumbing contractors to provide a liability insurance policy in lieu of bonds from approved surety companies, and,
- \* amending an ordinance to prohibit unauthorized persons to use solid waste containers.

The two resolutions are: accepting the annual audit report for the year 1994-95; and renewing a non-annexation agreement with Entex Fabrication, Inc.

Aldermen also will be asked to sustain Mayor Wayne House's reappointment of Jerry Reed to the Nortex 9-1-1 Communications District board.

## Telephone solicitor working scam here

Someone apparently is attempting to pull a scam on Iowa Park residents by soliciting advertising for a non-existent publication.

And that publication is supposedly for the Iowa Park Police Dept.

Police were notified last week by a resident who had been solicited by telephone by a man who identified himself as Dick Anderson.

The solicitor was attempting to sell advertising space in a publication representing the local police department.

The resident told the solicitor he was not interested in purchasing any advertising, and then called the police station, asking if such a publication existed.

He was informed there was not. An Iowa Park couple was taken into custody Wednesday of last week, both on outstanding warrants issued locally.

Ronnie Kenneth Boren, 39, was taken into custody at 7:58 p.m. in the 200 block of West Highway, and an hour later, his wife, Vickie, 39, turned herself in at the police station, according to the police blotter.

Outstanding warrants had been issued for both arrests, on charges of disorderly conduct and failure to appear in municipal court.

They were released later that evening, after signing promises to appear in municipal court April 9.

Michael Lee Burnside, 44, was arrested Wednesday evening in the

100 block of South Bond, and charged with public intoxication.

Burnside was released at 7:44 a.m. Thursday after paying a fine of \$132.

Ardine Copeland Jr., 38, was stopped in the 400 block of West Highway Friday afternoon, when police believed him to be driving wrecklessly, according to the blotter entry.

Copeland was charged with unlawful carrying of a weapon, when the officer saw a handgun, and later found a double-edge knife and pair of nun chucks, according to the report.

He was released from custody Saturday on \$750 bond.

### Time to change time to new time

Unless you are planning to attend a sunrise ceremony on Easter Sunday, the changing of time to Daylight Savings Time will not present a problem.

However, if you plan to make the regular church service, it would be best to re-set your clocks before going to bed Saturday night.

All time pieces should be set one

hour later: "Spring Forward."

So, if you go to bed normally at 10:30 on Saturday evening, set your clock to 11:30, and you'll be on the same time schedule as everyone else who wanted to be on time.

True, you will lose an hour's sleep that night, but you will be able to make it up next fall, when the nation returns to Standard Time.

Iowa Park schools will observe a pre-Easter holiday Friday, according to the school calendar.

The fifth six-weeks period ends

today, and when students return to their classes Monday, they will begin their sixth and final grade period of the school year.

# Cook of the Week

Belenda Walls

Belenda and Terry Walls and their family are fully involved in church, school, and civic activities.

They have four children: Terry Jr., a Iowa Park High School senior, who is in band and a member of the National Honor Society; James, a junior, who's in band, on the varsity tennis team, and manager for the JV and Freshman football teams; Roger, a freshman student, is also in the band and participates in football, track, powerlifting and Little League baseball; Rachel, a sixth grader, is in band, and plays girl's softball.

They are members of Faith Baptist Church, where the family is active in Sunday School, youth, and other church activities. Belenda teaches fourth grade Sunday School and fifth and sixth grade G.A.'s on Wednesday nights.

They are looking forward to a trip at the end of May, with other members of the church, to Jasper, Ark. to help build a church.

"We have tried to teach our children that Jesus Christ wants them to be servants, as he was, and volunteering is a way to do that," Belenda said.

As a result, Belenda, Terry, James and Roger have spent many summers helping in Vacation Bible School. Terry will be helping coach Roger's baseball team, the Royals, this summer, and Belenda has worked as a volunteer at Wichita General Hospital the last four years and will receive her 500 hour bar in May. James and Roger have spent the last two summers volunteering at Chaparral Baptist Assembly. James also went on a World Changers trip last summer.

Belenda said that church and family activities play a big part in their lives. She and Terry try to attend all activities that their children are involved in. Belenda said the other family members like to play ball, but since she's not athletically inclined, she spends a lot of time sitting on bleachers and being the designated cheering section. The family also likes to go camping and hiking.

Belenda also likes to sew, crochet and cook. She likes to spend time in the kitchen and will often bake up extras to go in the freezer for those "busy" days. Rachel is beginning to spend time in the kitchen with her mother, and Belenda says "I'm sure

that she'll soon be a wonderful cook."

This time of the year, the family spends a lot of time getting their garden ready. They grow the majority of their vegetables, and what they don't eat fresh, Belenda cans or gives away.

Belenda said she learned to can foods when she was growing up by watching her "Grandma." The Walls have two pantries in their kitchen that are full of canned vegetables, jelly, fruit, pickles and relish. "In fact, I can't remember the last time that I bought some of these items," Belenda said.

Belenda has won many ribbons at the County Fair over the years, and her children were upset with her for not entering this year. "I just got too busy and forgot to take them down there," she said. "They get as excited as I do, waiting to see if we'll get a ribbon."

Belenda's father was in the military and her family lived in many places. They eventually moved to Wichita Falls where Belenda graduated from Wichita Falls High School.

Her husband, Terry, went to school in Iowa Park, and has been employed 10 years at Cryovac. Belenda does substitute teaching for Iowa Park and City View schools.

For this week's recipes, Belenda let each member of her family pick one of their favorites, and then included some of her own.

### Terry's Favorite Pecan Pie

- 1 pie shell
- 3 eggs
- 2/3 cup sugar
- 1/2 tsp. salt
- 1/3 cup margarine, melted
- 1 cup corn syrup
- 1 cup broken pecans

Heat oven to 375 degrees. Beat eggs, sugar, salt, margarine and syrup by hand. Pour into pie shell. Sprinkle pecans on top and bake until set, 40-50 minutes. Cool before serving.

### James' Favorite Refrigerator Rolls

- 1 pkg. active dry yeast
- 1 1/2 cup warm water
- 1 cup unseasoned lukewarm mashed potatoes

- 2/3 cup sugar
- 2/3 cup shortening
- 2 eggs
- 1 1/2 tsp. salt
- 6 to 7 cups all-purpose flour

Dissolve yeast in warm water in large bowl. Stir in potatoes, sugar, shortening, eggs, salt and 3 cups of the flour. Beat until smooth. Mix in enough remaining flour to make dough easy to handle. Turn dough onto lightly floured surface; knead until smooth and elastic, about 5 minutes. Place in greased bowl; turn greased side up. Cover bowl tightly; refrigerate at least 8 hours.

Divide and shape into rolls. Place on lightly greased cookie sheet. Let rise until doubled, about 1 hour. Bake in preheated 275 degree oven about 20 minutes.

### Roger's Favorite Chicken Nuggets

Cut boneless chicken breasts in chunks. How much you use will depend on how many you're feeding. Wash, drain well, and put aside in a bowl.

Beat 3-4 eggs in a medium-sized bowl by hand. Add a little milk. In another bowl, put flour, garlic powder, and seasoned salt. Again, how much you use depends on how many nuggets you need. Dip chicken nuggets in egg mixture, flour mixture, then back in egg mixture. Put in deep fryer or skillet with lots of hot oil and cook until lightly browned. (This can be really messy, but they are so good.)

### Rachel's Favorite A to Z Bread

- 3 cups flour
- 1 tsp. salt
- 1 tsp. soda
- 3 tps. cinnamon
- 1/2 tsp. baking powder
- 3 eggs
- 1 cup oil
- 2 cups sugar
- 2 cups A to Z (from list below)
- 3 tps. vanilla
- 1 cup chopped nuts

Beat eggs in a large bowl. Add oil and sugar; cream well. Add A to Z and vanilla. Add dry ingredients. Mix well. Add nuts. Put into 2 well-greased loaf pans. Bake in pre-heated 325 degree oven 1 hour. This recipe also makes wonderful, moist muffins. A to Z choices below:

- Apples - grated
- Bananas - mashed
- Carrots - grated
- Pumpkin - canned
- Zucchini - grated

### Squash Dressing

- 2 cups cooked squash
- 1/2 stick margarine
- 1 large onion, chopped
- 1 can cream of chicken soup

- 2 cups crumbled cornbread
  - Salt and pepper to taste
- Combine all in casserole dish. Bake 30-40 minutes at 400 degrees.

### Cucumber Relish

- 2 quarts chopped cucumbers (about 8 medium)
- 2 cups chopped sweet green peppers (about 4 small)
- 2 cups chopped sweet red peppers (about 4 small)
- 1 cup chopped onion (about 1 medium)
- 1/2 cup salt
- 2 quarts cold water
- 1 1/2 cups brown sugar
- 2 sticks cinnamon
- 1 Tbsp. mustard seed
- 1 Tbsp. tumeric
- 2 tps. whole allspice
- 2 tps. whole cloves
- 1 quart vinegar

Combine cucumbers, peppers, and onion; sprinkle with tumeric. Dissolve salt in 2 quarts cold water and pour over vegetables; let stand 3 to 4 hours. Drain; cover vegetables with cold water and let stand 1 hour. Drain thoroughly. Tie spices in cheesecloth bag; add to sugar and vinegar. Bring to a boil and pour over vegetables. Remove spice bag. Cover and let stand 12 to 18 hours in a cool place. Bring vegetables to a boil; simmer until hot. Pack hot into hot jars, leaving 1/4 inch head space.

Adjust caps. Process 10 minutes in boiling water bath. Yield: about 6 pints.

This takes a while to make, but is well worth it. Very good with beans or hot dogs.

I believe I was four years old. It was a community-wide event, and apparently everyone from the community, as well as everyone else who

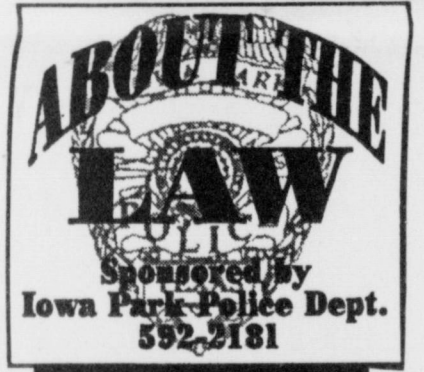
had heard about it, attended.

Another Easter egg hunt that remains in my memory was one of great disappointment.  
It was 10 years later, in 1945, at Hereford.  
Merchants of the community had joined together in sponsorship. That was the first time I had ever heard of prize eggs being hidden. And that was the source of disappointment.  
Older members of the Boy Scout troop were recruited to hide all the eggs in the big park which is located in the center of Hereford.  
The problem was, the day following the hunt, three of the five prize eggs were redeemed by some of those Boy Scouts.  
It was a major embarrassment not only to the Scout movement there, but to the individuals, their families and the community.  
Our local Evening Lions Club has for a long time put on an Easter egg hunt, open to all children of the community.  
It will be held at 1:30 p.m. Saturday, east of the high school, on the southeast corner of Johnson Road and West Highway.

A recent newspaper article told of Archer County's Veterans Memorial, a salute to all from the county who have served in the Armed Forces at any time, anywhere for anything. If you had an ancestor who settled in Archer County after the Civil War, you will want to be sure they are remembered.

There are also plans for a Civil War Memorial in Washington D.C. to commemorate the men and women who served in the Armed Forces during the War.

Some have been fortunate to have saved an ancestor's service and discharge record from the Civil War period.

There also is another record of interest, a certificate called "Personal Military and Civil History by the Soldiers and Sailors Historical and Benevolent Society."

This information was compiled some years after the Civil War. It is a small bound booklet containing a history of the veterans military service, history of the regiment served in and also some family history. This information was entered according to an act of Congress in 1902 by the Inter-State Publishing Co., in the office of the Librarian of Congress in Washington D.C.

If you had an ancestor in the Civil War and you want to get the feel of the war from his or her viewpoint, there are two books of interest by Bell Irvin Riley, "The Life of Billy Yank: The Common Soldier of the Union" and the companion book, "The Life of Johnny Reb."

You will appreciate the humor of the common soldier and the accounts of reaching across the line by the boys in Gray and Blue in gestures of friendship and sharing.

These are quite accurate accounts of what some of the war was like for the ordinary soldiers of the North and South, the real heroes of the Civil War.

# Hawks rally to win district opener

When the Iowa Park Hawks took the field in Vernon Tuesday in the District 3-3A opener, they were rested and ready to play.

Maybe too rested.

The Hawks, after not playing for 10 days, had to rally from behind twice before putting the Lions away 13-8 to grab a share of the district

lead.

Iowa Park, 14-5 overall and 1-0 in district, watched Vernon score once in the first, and once in the third before the Hawks got on the board with a single run in the top of the fifth to cut the Lion advantage to 2-1.

Vernon, 6-11 overall and 0-1 in league play, scored a pair of runs in

it's half of the fifth to re-take the lead at 4-1. Iowa Park fought back to score five big runs in the top of the sixth to go in front 6-4.

The Iowa Park rally started when Corky Petty struck out to leadoff the inning but reached base when the ball got away from the Vernon catcher. Chris Norris, who picked up the win for the Hawks to move to 6-1 for the

season, singled to leave runners at first and second with no outs. Dusty Owen followed with a 2RBI triple to left-center to clear the bases. Chad Wright drove in Owen with a single and moved to third when Kevin Braziel's fly ball to right was dropped leaving runners at first and third. Braziel stole second then moved to third when Clancy Lalumia's fielders choice plated Wright. David Waterbury's single scored Wright from third to finish the scoring in the sixth for the Hawks, who led 6-4 heading into the bottom of the sixth.

The Lions roared back scoring three times in the sixth to hold a slim 7-6 lead with only three outs left to be accounted for.

But before Vernon could get those three outs, Iowa Park had scored seven times to take a 13-7 lead.

With the bases loaded and no outs, Owen singled to score Jake Dillard, who was running for Robert Klinkerman who had singled to lead off the seventh. Pinch-hitter Jonathan Clubb, hit a grounder to third to score Petty.

Wright followed with a single to load the bases again, this time with one out. Owen scored on a passed ball, Braziel got an RBI on a fielders choice that scored Clubb, Clancy Lalumia singled to score Braziel, Lalumia scored on an error and Waterbury, who reached base on another Vernon miscue, scored on a passed ball to round out the scoring.

Norris, who recorded 13 strikeouts while walking none slammed the door on any comeback attempt by Vernon allowing only one run in the bottom of the seventh. The Lions banged out seven hits in the game with three of those leaving the park as home runs. Iowa Park also won the hitting category as the Hawks gathered 13 base hits along the way. Both teams played poorly on defense as Iowa Park committed 6 errors and Vernon had 7 miscues.

Leading hitters for Iowa Park were Norris, who finished 3x4 with 2

runs scored, Owen, who finished 2x4 with a triple and 3 RBI's, Lalumia, who finished 2x2 with 2 runs scored and an RBI and Wright who added a 2x4 1 run 1 RBI performance at the plate.

"You could definitely tell we hadn't played in 10 days," said head coach David Fuhrman. "We looked rusty hitting the ball and Norris wasn't

as sharp as he usually is after not pitching in 14 days. I think we won the game on will. We didn't play exceptionally well, but our kids just wanted it more than Vernon did. When the going got tough, they came back twice and got the win."

The Hawks will try and make two in a row this Friday at 1 p.m. when they take on Bridgeport here.

## Baseballers remain in tie for loop lead

The Lady Hawks won two of their three district games this week to retain a share of the top spot in District 3-3A.

After Tuesday's 5-1 win over Bowie and Bridgeport's 6-5 win over Graham, Iowa Park and Bridgeport set atop the standings with identical 3-1 district marks while Graham is a close third at 2-2. Bowie is 0-4.

What this all means is that an Iowa Park win over Graham today will guarantee the Lady Hawks of a playoff spot in their first year of competition, and a win over Graham and Bridgeport the following week will give Iowa Park the District 3-3A title. Even if the Lady Hawks were to lose their remaining two games, they would still end up in a three-way playoff between Iowa Park, Graham and Bridgeport.

The Lady Hawks started the week on a sour note, losing 8-0 to Bridgeport in what head coach Larry Beard claimed was his team's worst performance of the year. Bridgeport allowed Iowa Park only one hit in the game. Bridgeport took advantage of nine walks and several miscues by the Lady Hawks as five of the eight runs were un-earned.

Saturday afternoon, the Lady Hawks got back on the winning track by beating Graham in Graham 2-1 in a must-win game. Had Iowa Park lost the Lady Hawks would be forced to win their final three games just to force a playoff.

Iowa Park scored it's two runs in the top of the third while Graham's lone score came in the fifth. Julea Ricks picked up the win for Iowa Park to move her mark to 7-7 overall and 2-1 in district by striking out five and walking only one in a two-hitter.

Ricks was even better in Tuesday's 5-1 win over Bowie as she struck out 11, didn't allow a walk and gave up only one hit.

"We played our worst game of the year against Bridgeport," Beard said. "We gave them every opportunity to win that game and they did. In the Graham game, we knew it was a must-win situation for us. Had we lost we would have been out of it."

"In the Bowie game, we couldn't afford a letdown," Beard added. "We had to take care of business and not slip up against Bowie. Right now, I think any of the three teams could win it. Graham is probably the best hitting team of the three while we probably have the best pitching and the best defense. Bridgeport is probably the most consistent team of the three overall. We need to keep the game

low scoring for us to be successful. We're not going to settle for second place if we beat Graham, we want to win the district outright."

The Graham game will get un-

derway at 4 p.m. today and with a win, Iowa Park will be assured of a playoff spot with the District Championship game on April 9 at Bridgeport at 6 p.m..

## Stewart pleased with state effort

Two members of the Hawks' Powerlifting team returned from the State Meet in Houston this week and despite neither returning with a medal, head coach Steve Stewart was very pleased with their results.

Tyson Spruiell finished in sixth place, just missing a medal in the 242-lb. weight class, but set two new school records in the meet. Spruiell broke his own bench record with a lift of 315 pounds and established a new mark in totals with a 1310. Even though Spruiell didn't receive a medal, he did win a \$750 scholarship from the Texas High School Powerlifting Association.

Keith Hoover, lifting in the 275-lb. weight class division, also improved from his Regional Meet performance. Hoover finished in tenth despite tying his all-time best with a 1260 total. Hoover attempted a new school record in the dead lift but came up just short.

"Before we left, we said we wanted to finish higher than we came in with and that's what we did," Stewart said. "Both Tyson and Hoover improved over their Regional totals and that's all you can ask for. We knew going in it would be tough to go down there and medal but I was real proud of the effort they both gave and happy with their improvement."

# WORTH QUOTING

I'm pretty much a believer in free enterprise, but it appears to me that sooner or later something is going to have to be done to give insurance companies their comeuppance.

I don't know how many times I've heard people who faithfully paid premiums to insurance companies for many years without collecting a dime, then if they have a car wreck, the company refuses to renew their policy.

I had heard these stories for many years and I guess I really didn't believe them. I always suspected there must be some other reason I hadn't heard about for the policy being cancelled.

But I can tell you now from personal experience that the stories I had been hearing were true.

Rosemary had a wreck several months ago and we got a notice last week that the policies on all five of our vehicles will be cancelled May 23.

My wife doesn't drive any of the vehicles except her car, and I have been driving automobiles for over 60 years and have never had a wreck.

But the company is cancelling the insurance on the vehicles I drive too.

It seems that all insurance companies operate pretty much the same way these days. They don't want anything but risk-free business.

For years I couldn't figure out how insurance companies could bet by with operating the way they do. But then I remembered that for many years a considerable number of state legislative officials are paid a retainer by insurance companies during their terms of office.

I'm not sure whether this is still a practice or not, but it was back in the days when I noticed that most of the rules governing insurance companies were enacted by the state legislature.

Now I don't want to accuse any of our former elected officials of doing anything shady, or anything like that, but it does seem a little bit strange to me, when most other industries of this magnitude are strictly regulated, that the insurance companies can get by with operating like they do.

They take your money for insuring you against a risk, then if a risk shows up, they keep your money and cancel your coverage.

The fault lies not with your insurance agencies. They have no control over things like this. The problem is with the insurance companies themselves. And I don't think it's fair.

I think they ought to have to dance with the one that brung 'em.

# Thornberry touts value of health coverage act

U.S. Rep. Mac Thornberry voted last week for the Health Coverage Availability and Affordability Act, a bill which would, among other things, allow people to keep their health insurance if they lose or leave their jobs.

"This bill makes the changes the country needs without giving more power to Washington bureaucrats," Thornberry said.

"One of the most important of these changes is making sure that individuals who have the opportunity to move to a new job will not be held back because their new health insurance will not cover a pre-existing condition.

"The bill also does three other things that I think will benefit families and businesses. First, it allows people to put money into Medical Savings Accounts (MSAs), which is basically a tax-free rainy day fund for health care expenses.

"Second, the bill allows small businesses to deduct half the cost of health insurance for their employees, which will not only ease the economic burden being placed on small business owners, but could also help create new jobs and spur investment.

"And third, the legislation limits punitive damages in malpractice lawsuits."


According to Thornberry, the bill, also known as HR 3103, will

provide important reforms that will ensure broad health coverage, while continuing to provide states with the flexibility to make effective decisions.

Thornberry noted that many of the provisions in the legislation were included in his 13-Point Plan, which he introduced in July 1994 prior to his election to office.

The provisions included the establishment of MSAs, permitting risk pools for small businesses and organizations, preventing anyone from being excluded from coverage for pre-existing conditions, ensuring portability of coverage, and increasing the tax deductibility for self-employed individuals to purchase health

insurance coverage.  
"Today, 85 percent of the uninsured are employed in small businesses -- often because it's just too expensive for an employer to cover just a small group of employees. This bill will begin to address this problem, and provide some much needed relief to one of the most vital sectors of our economy," Thornberry said.

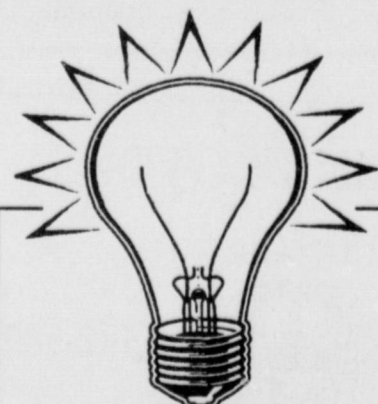
