the immune system has been weakened. The lesions (rash) of shingles usually last 7-10 days, but in some cases, partizularly in
the elderly, severe even years. This pain the site may persist for many months or physician should be seen at the first sign of shingles. If treatment is begun within 72 hours of developing the rash, the chances are better that postherpetic neuralgia may not develop or will be less severe. Conventional therapy usually involves an antiviral drug and
an oral steroid. Some researchers claim that vitamin C and bioflavonoids have antiviral activity. Vitamin E and Vitamin $\mathrm{B}_{12}$ may accelerate the healing rate. A cream containing capsaicin, a hot pepper extract, is also frequently used to treat the pain.
