




has shown animals in the County Livestock Show, where she earned various placings. She was a member of the fourth place State Band in the UIL Marching Band Competition.

Lady Hawks split outings

The Iowa Park Lady Hawks split their two games this week by beating Childress by 31 at home Tuesday night to snap a two-game skid. Earlier in the week, Iowa Park lost on the road to Bowie.

In Friday night's game at Bowie, Iowa Park played with the seventhranked Lady Rabbits for three quarters, but a 13-3 second period proved to be the difference between the two

Iowa Park outscored Bowie 12-11 in the opening quarter, thanks in part to a pair of three-point bombs by Randi Nelms. The junior guard finished the game with nine points, all coming from outside the three-point stripe. Wendy Bridwell finished the first period with four points.
