New wheat sells at 85 cents and \$1.10 per bushel, in the Fort Worth market.

With this issue we send for to the people the first number of the second half of volume one of the Clarendon, and we deem it necessary to offer a few words in the form of a salutatory: the suspension of the paper for a few weeks was an unavoidable necessity. Having been advised by many friends to make a change in the management of this paper, which, we believe agreeable to all, has been made, and the undersigned is now the sole proprietor of Callahan County's paper. After assuming sole control of the business it was deemed necessary and expedient to erect a suitable building into which to transplant the Clarendon, for it was found neither profitable nor pleasant to depend upon rented houses in Belle Plain, the rents demanded being extravagantly high and the often changing hands of rentable building making it necessary to be continually on the move, at least such is our experience, having moved four times in the last six months. But now we enjoy the blessing of occupying our own domicile, and think can boast of as good an office, being as well lighted and having as much room and as many conveniences as any printing establishment on the western frontier. The loss of missing a few issues of our paper falls only upon ourselves and not upon our subscribers, therefore we hope they will pardon us for our failing to appear sooner. It shall be our aim to be ever found advocating the cause of right, truth and justice, believing that these are the fundamental principles upon which is based all good government, and upon which is based all good government, and upon these should be based all the deeds and actions of mankind.

We shall aim to run a live county newspaper, always bearing in mind our motto, "The greatest good to the greatest number"...

An editor is but human and is like other people liable to err in judgment, and we are no exception to the rule, and should any short-comings occur, we shall always be ready to recapitulate, "Maintain the right, condemn the wrong" is the inscription upon our banner which we now unfurl to the public breeze.

Callahan County Clarendon
June 26, 1880

Letter From Upper Colorado
Editor Clarendon:

Owing to the busy season, attending the spring "round ups" I have been unable to send you anything from our section for some time, this being the first opportunity I have had, I avail myself of it. A rumor reached us yesterday that a party of Indians made a raid the night of the 21st on Snyders store, on Deep Creek and Deits Rancho, also on Deep Creek, stealing about ten head of horses. Informant met a party of rangers at the store, and they advised cow men to scatter their horses, as a large number of red skins were missing from Ft. Sill. We have had no rain in this immediate vicinity, since early in the spring, but below on the river, a few miles there has been two good rains in the last week. There is some taking the old McKenzie trail, via Ft. Concho and Ft. Elliott, instead of the Griffin route, two or three herds have passed up so far this season. The trail runs up Deep Creek by Snyders store. C.C. Slaughter started a herd of 800 Beeves to Kansas a few days ago, he will join his herd with that of John Slaughter & Bros. Who ranch in Yellowhouse Canyon. Mr. Pool who is buying beeves for Dunn and Coleman, Coleman City, has been up gathering a herd of beeves; he left a few days ago for Fort Worth. Mr. Hill, another buyer bought a herd on Double Mt. Fork he also drove to Fort Worth, they both paid twenty dollars per head for good steers. Buffalo in bunches ranging from two to one hundred visit us frequently this spring, four were killed in sight of our round up, a few days ago. One of the "boys" roped a yearling and another a suckling calf. As I know no more importance to communicated at this time I will close with my regards, etc. H.C.H.

Mr. Smith has moved his barber shop to the lot between Ed Seay's and Woodward's stores. Messrs. Riddell and Pilkington have both moved with their families to the railroad. Dr. Eli Thayer and wife, leave next Monday for Boston, where they will in future make their home. We regret to see our good citizens leave thusly.

On another page see the advertisement of Dr. T. FitzHugh, who has taken up his residence among us; we bespeak for him a lucrative practice as there is an ample field here.

STATE OF TEXAS COUNTY OF CALLAHAN ORDER PROHIBITING CERTAIN FIREWORKS IN UNINCORPORATED AREAS OF CALLAHAN COUNTY, TEXAS

WHEREAS, the Commissioners Court has determined that during the July 4th fireworks season the rural acreage in the county not under cultivation for a period of at least twelve months are determined to be extremely hazardous for the danger of fire because of high grass and dry vegetation and allows the Commissioners Court of a county to prohibit the sale or use of restricted fireworks in specific areas in Callahan County; and

WHEREAS, on the 5 day of June, 2009, the Commissioners Court of Callahan County has determined that the normal danger of fire in the unincorporated areas of Callahan County is greatly enhanced by the extremely dry conditions now existing.

NOW, THEREFORE, the commissioners Court of Callahan County adopts this Order prohibiting the use of restricted fireworks in the unincorporated areas of Callahan County.

A. No person may detonate, ignite, or in any way use fireworks classified under 49 C.F.R. part. 173.100(r)(2) (10-1-86 edition), as "skyrockets with sticks" and "Missiles with fins" in any portion of the unincorporated area of Callahan County.

B. This Order does not prohibit:

1. Common fireworks, small in size classified as Class C explosives;
2. Large fireworks devices designed primarily to produce visible or audible effects by combustion, deflagration, or detonation and classified as Class B explosive by the U.S. Dept. of Trans. [TEX. OCC. CODE, Chapter 2154].
3. The sale of "skyrockets with sticks" and "missiles with fins".

C. A person commits an offense if the person knowingly or intentionally violates a prohibition established by this Order. An offense under this order is a Class C Misdemeanor.

The meeting was called to order at 9:23 A.M. by Judge Corn. All Commissioners were present.

Lori Herrick with Davis Kinard & Co., PC reported on the financial audit for the year ended September 2008 performed by their Company. Commissioner Farmer made a motion to accept the audit. Commissioner Kirkham seconded the motion. The motion carried 5-0. Exhibit

Judge Corn and the Commissioners extended their thanks to Treasurer Dianne Gunter and her assistant Jan Windham for their hard work in preparing for the audit.

On June 5, 2009, the Commissioners Court adopted the following order effective immediately:

ORDER PROHIBITING USE OF FIREWORKS IN UNINCORPORATED AREAS OF CALLAHAN COUNTY

A. A person commits an offense if he or she intentionally, knowingly, or recklessly detonates, ignites, or in any way uses fireworks on a county road or in the right-of-way of a county road.

B. If the landowners' permission is obtained prior thereto, persons may detonate, ignite, or use fireworks on private property in unincorporated areas of the county, as long as:

1. The person using the fireworks is not intoxicated as defined in Vernon's Act. Civ. St. Art 62011-1 (a) (2).
2. Reasonable precautions are taken concerning proximity to structures and flammable vegetation,
3. Children are adequately

Commissioner Hicks made a motion to prohibit the use of fireworks in unincorporated areas of Callahan County. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Kirkham. The motion passed 5-0. Exhibit

Commissioner Windham made a motion to approve the Healthcare Transportation Services Contract by and between Citizens E.M.S. Inc. and Callahan County Sheriff's Department. Commissioner Hicks seconded the motion. The motion carried 5-0. Exhibit

Commissioner Windham made a motion to take Johnny Tabor's (engineer with Tabor Engineering) recommendation to go with option 2 and award the bid for road disaster repair to Raydon, Inc. contingent on approval from O.R.C.A. and Grantworks approval and to allow Judge Corn to sign for the Court on Award. Commissioner Hicks seconded the motion. The motion carried 5-0. Exhibit

Commissioner Farmer made a motion to pay the approved bills. Commissioner Kirkham seconded the motion which then carried 5-0.

A motion was made by Judge Corn and seconded by Commissioner Farmer to adjourn. The motion carried 5-0. Meeting adjourned at 10:15 A.M.

THE MASTERY OF THE THING

A rereading of Gerald Manley Hopkins's great poem, "The Windhover."

I fell in love with "The Windhover" when I was a teenager, recognizing right away the rapture of a love poem directed not at a particular person (though the poem is dedicated "To Christ Our Lord") but to life itself. The poem is widely anthologized, a cornerstone of the English canon, bridging the Victorian age and early-20th-century Modernism. Its author, Gerard Manley Hopkins, was a Jesuit priest who died at the age of 44. He had felt the tension-between his religious and literary callings throughout his career, first burning all his work upon entering the priesthood, then taking up verses again only for church occasions. Hopkins vacillated between joy and despair both in his poetry and about his poetry—but at least he continued to write it.

When I was first discovering poetry, it was 1986 or so, and I was taught largely contemporary confessional and identity poetry written in modern, accessible, but (to me) dull language. So it was with a sympathetic ecstasy that I leaped back in time to Hopkins's sonnet written on May 30, 1877:

I caught this morning morning's minion, king-
dom of daylight's dauphin, dapple-dawn-drawn Fal-
con, in his riding

Of the rolling level underneath him steady air, and
striding

High there, how he rung upon the rein of a wimpling
wing

In his ecstasy! . . .

By the end of the first line we have no idea yet what was caught, though it seems to be a "king." But the line break tricks us: it's really "kingdom" and it's part of a continuing, relentless trail of modifiers that are really metaphors, but metaphors for what? By the time we get to "Falcon," the bird mentioned in the poem's title, we're far from certain that we're talking about a real falcon and not a metaphor for yet something else. The poem, it turns out, is an epistemological narrative unfurling: What are we seeing?

Fear not: we are reading about a real falcon. "Windhover," my dictionary tells me, is British dialect for a kestrel: "a small falcon that hovers with rapidly beating wings while searching for prey on the ground." The bird is riding a thermal: "the rolling underneath him steady air," which, with its implied hyphens between the words, is a very particular type of air. "Striding" and "high" help build the feeling of "ecstasy," as does "rung," which is a technical term from falconry meaning "rising in a spiraling motion." But Hopkins also sees that the bird is "reined" by his "wimpling wing"—a wimple is part of a nun's headdress, which presses against her temples and keeps her hair back. In other words, the bird is exulting not only in the freedom of the air, but in the resistance of it too, the friction.

. . . then off, off forth on a swing,

As a skate's heel sweeps smooth on a bow-bend: the
hurl and gliding

Rebuffed the big wind. My heart in hiding

Stirred for a bird, —the achieve of, the mastery of the
thing!

The bird achieves or masters something in his successful negotiation of the powerful wind, and it is this that "stirs" Hopkins's heart. His heart was "in hiding" before. Perhaps he was despondent or, like any of us most of the time, he wasn't noticing anything in particular about his surroundings until that moment, that dawn or dawning, a symbol of reawakening. The speaker of the poem could be anyone—man or woman, old or young—who somehow steps out of the ego and, by inhabiting another creature, finds a sacramental joy in simply being alive.

Brute beauty and valor and act, oh, air, pride, plume,
here

Buckle! AND the fire that breaks from thee then, a
billion

Times told lovelier, more dangerous, O my chevalier!

No wonder of it: sheer plod makes plough down sil-
lion

Shine, and blue-bleak embers, ah my dear,

Fall, gall themselves, and gash gold-vermilion.

Hopkins's mimetic language turns from describing the kestrel's flight in the first part of the sonnet (the eight-line octet) to describing how its dynamics are also hidden in other things—and, ultimately, his own soul. As when the kestrel is buffeted by the wind and then comes back stronger, fire breaks from things when they "buckle." When the plow turns up the dull clods of earth, the new earth glints with minerals ("sillion" is a medieval term for the small strip of land granted to monasteries to farm). When a "blue-bleak" ember falls from a log, it flares up again with new light. And thus when the spirit falls against the opaque materiality of the world, it breaks open (gashes) with an insight, or illumination.

Words You Can Use

Girandole: Here is a word for a grouping of jets of water, or perhaps fireworks, that are set into a pattern. Remember this word soon for Independence Day.

Humectant: This is a noun, or can be used as an adjective, for something that is moistened or is moistening. Wet earth might wet dry earth if they are combined, so the wet earth would be a humectant.

Laroid: When you go to the Gulf and see the sea gulls, you can use this word to describe things related to them.

Mellaginous: If it deals with honey, or anything to do with honey, you can use this word to describe it. It is not thought to be used much around Moran, Texas.

"The Windhover" is a sonnet as fierce and alive as that kestrel Hopkins saw in May 1877. When I first read it, for all my teenage ignorance about theology and archaic word meanings, it swept me up in its rhythms and dashed me down again with the sudden impact of that electrifying final line: "Fall, gall themselves, and gash gold-vermilion." If we hear through our eyes when we read any page of text, Hopkins taught me that in a great poem's soundscapes, we "see" through our ears as well.

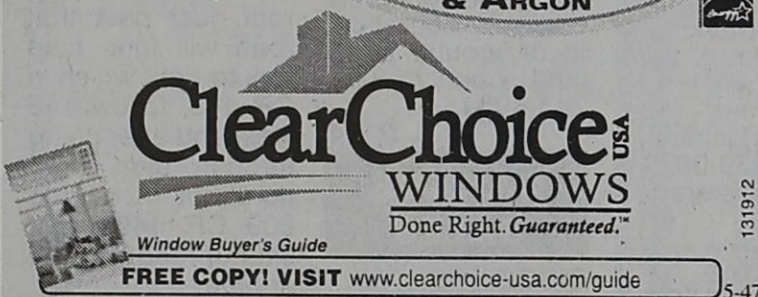

Local Veterans Attend Memorial Replica Dedication May 30

On Saturday, May 30, Eastland County veterans attended and took part in the dedication of the Vietnam Veterans Memorial Replica at the National Vietnam War Museum site near Mineral Wells, TX.

Crowds arrived early for the unveiling and dedication, which officially began at 11:00 a.m. with an invocation, posting of colors, Pledge of Allegiance, National Anthem and introductions. It is estimated that several thousand attended.

Guest speaker Joe Galloway, journalist and war correspondent during the Vietnam War, was followed by the unveiling of the Wall and raising of the service flags. The ceremony continued with Burial of the purple heart, and an American Blessing of the Wall. At 12:00 noon a rifle salute was given, followed by Taps.

Several other highlights of the day included the arrival of Patriot Guard Riders and parachutist Dana Bowman. Dana Bowman of Weatherford, TX lost his legs while a member of the Golden Knights parachute team.

The Vietnam Veterans Memorial near Mineral Wells is a replica of the black granite Vietnam Veterans Memorial in Washington, D. C., which was

completed in 1982 and holds 58,260 names of those killed in the conflict (or died of combat results) and those missing in action and not recovered. It is dedicated to the 2.7 million U. S. military personnel who served in the war zone. No civilian names are listed on the memorial.

The Vietnam Veterans Memorial Replica - about half the size of the original - also holds the 58,260 names, engraved on black reflective aluminum panels. The replica was built by volunteers, many of them veterans. The decision to build a wall came after a visit to Mineral Wells by the

moving wall brought in 1998. Jim Messinger, NVWM Treasurer and wall overseer, said in an interview. The replica wall at the National Vietnam War Museum site, however, is a permanent construction.

Other recent dedications, both in 2008, at the NVWM site were the unveiling of a Camp Holloway Memorial Wall replica and the hoisting of a "Huey". The National Vietnam War Museum, when completed, is to give a national venue of learning about the Vietnam War era. For more information on this project, visit www.nationalvnmuseum.org.

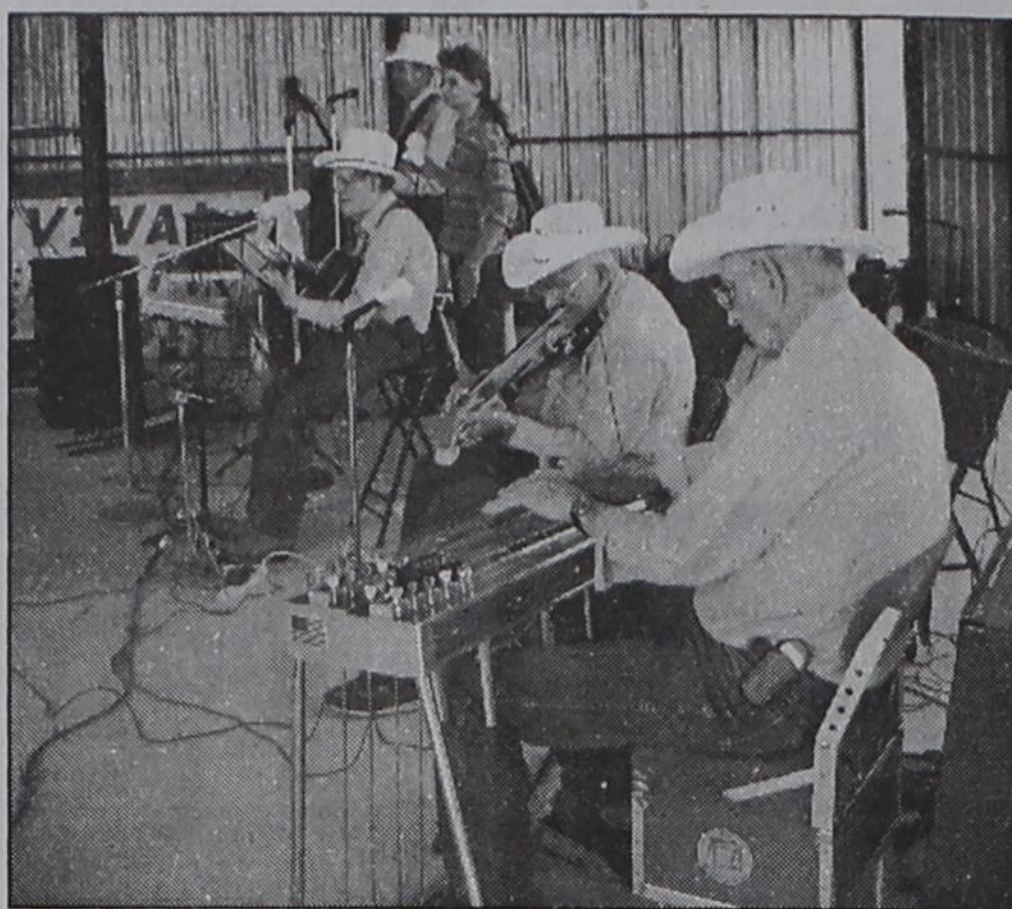

organizations, including Baird Meals-On-Wheels. He attended the Baird Senior Citizen's Center.

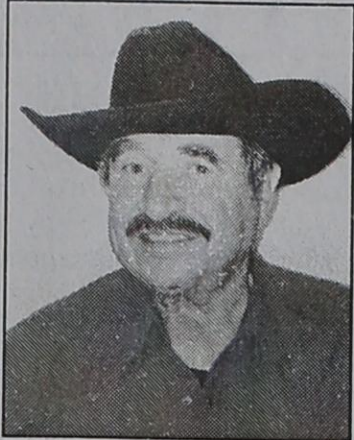
