Value of the grant is estimated at 44,320.

tionists purchased the thirty thousand acre Barnard Ranch in the Osage Hills of Northeast Oklahoma, near Pawhuska. They are seeking to reestablish the tallgrass prairie ecosystem by stocking it with Bison and using controlled burns over the area to promote the healthy growth of the native grasses and plants. Five hundred bison were placed
there in 1989 , there in 1989, with the intent of in-
creasing the herd to a creasing the herd to a total of two
thousand, who will roam freeover the preserve. There are now over 300 preserve. There are now over 300
bird species onthe land, including the rare bald eagle, and many native ani-
recies ond inc rare bald eagle, and many native ani-
mals such as bobcat, der, fox, badgers, coyotes, armadillos, and jack-
