No challengers yet on city, school ballots

This could be a record year for school and city elections, which are called for May 2.

There may not be any elections.

Five positions -- three on the city council and two on the school board -- are to be decided in May.

Five candidates have filed, one for each opening.

But, as provided by state law, if none of the positions are challenged in either election, there will be no election, and the candidates are automatically named.

All three city council incumbents -- Mayor Tim Hunter and Aldermen Joe Singer and Joe Ward -- have filed for re-election.

There are two openings on the school board to be decided. Incumbent Jeff Watts has filed. Randy Alsup has filed for the position currently held by Dennis Yeager.

Deadline for candidates to file in either the city or school election is Thursday, Mar. 19.

Candidates for school trustee can file at the administration building, and candidates for city council can file at the city hall.

Early voting in both elections will begin April 14 and conclude April 29.

February big month for permits

The value of building permits issued by city hall during February was more than triple January's total.

Thanks to a permit for construction of a new residence, February's total amounted to \$182,381, as compared to January's \$50,799.

Thus, for the year, \$233,180 in permits have been issued.

SECOND-OLDEST ORGANIZATION HERE

Iowa Park Lions Club



(EDITOR'S NOTE: This is the first in a series of organizations in Iowa Park.)

The Iowa Park Lions Club is the second oldest civic organization in Iowa Park, the Masonic Lodge being the oldest.

The club was organized in May 1928 by George B. Anderson of Wichita Falls. May 15, 1928 the club met its charter quota.

Charter members and their classification are: R.E. Brewster, Supt. of schools; J.G. O'Donohoe, Oils; B.A. Davis, School Principal; Earl J. Wilson, Agriculturist; C.C. Hudson, Editor; R.O. White, Ford Dealer; D.C. Dodson, Dept. Store; G.W. Belcher, Theaters; C.F. Johnson, Finance Co.; Clyde Browning, Confectioner; Norman Bayless, Cotton Gin; Otis T. Weaver, Bookkeeper; L.C. Denny Jr., Banker; Earl O. Knox, Mayor-Grain Elevator; D.H. Ford, Service Station;

Dr. Gordon G. Clark, Physician; Rawlins Clark, Pipe Line; N. E. Waldie, Warehouse; J.P. Lusk, Biologist; C.M. Duncan, Hardware; J.C. Searle, Hotel; Le Roy McClendon, High School Principal.

There are now 1.3 million members in the International Lions Club across 160 continents and geographical areas.

A vision of a community service club was what Melvin Jones, an insurance salesman of Chicago, had in mind when he wrote to several club heads across the country in 1917 and told them of his idea.

He had conceived the idea that in addition to meet, eat, trade with each other and use first names, there should be added to the luncheon club concept the idea of "service to others." Jones had watched Rotary from 1905 and Kiwanis from 1915 progress into real luncheon clubs and grow, despite war-times, to where they were forces in the business and professional world.

After writing letters conferring with some already established organizations heads he finally got them all to meet.

The first meeting was held in Dallas on Oct. 8, 1917, with 36 delegates and eight alternates.

The name "International Association of Lions Club" was adopted 24 to 6.

Currently the Iowa Park Noon Lions Club, with about 20 businessmen and women, is still keeping the idea of a "service club" going.

The club strives for one hundred

percent participation from its members. Some members are unable to attend all meetings, but work at the fund raisers.

The main focus of the club is vision. "Working with the blind is what the Lions Club is all about," President Belvin Lytle said.

The Lions Club provides eye exams and glasses to needy children. Lytle said they receive names from the schools of children who may need glasses, but whose family can't afford them. He added they sometimes help adults with eye glasses. The club has also helped with a seeing eye dog, computers and training for the blind.

They have contributed toward the purchase of a computer that was needed at the Iowa Park Junior High for students with vision problems. This is just one of the many services that the Lions Club contributes to citizens of Iowa Park.

The club also gives two to five \$500 scholarships to seniors at Iowa Park High School each year. Lytle explained the way their scholarship recipient is chosen is to invite all applicants to meetings, and have them meet and talk with the members. Members later make their selections.

Locally the club contributes to the Iowa Park Senior Citizens, Operation Kid Fish, and recently made a contribution to the Waling Track Fund for Lake Gordon.

They help support the Lions Club Camp for children with vision problems, and make contributions that help diabetics, health services, envi-

Early voters few in party primary

Voters are apparently saving their effort for the party primary elections on April 14, because very few are casting early ballots at the local poll.

Shortly after noon Wednesday, only 27 Republican and 77 Democrat ballots had been marked at the county annex poll.

And early voting ends Friday. Some observers had predicted a heavier turnout, particularly because of the Precinct 3 Justice of the Peace race.

Two Democrats, Ray Smock and Marc Newman, are the candidates seeking to fill the post which will be vacated by Bill Robinson, who announced earlier he would not run for another term.

Additionally, Iowa Park native Terri Voyles Penaluna is one of two candidates on the Democratic party ticket for the county clerk office.

The winner in that contest will take on Republican Lloyd Lueck in the Nov. 3 general election.

Additionally, considerable interest has been expressed -- at least around the coffee shops -- in the county judge race.

Incumbent Nick Gipson earlier switched parties, and as a Republican he is being contested by former county commissioner Woody Gossom on the primary ticket.

The winner between those two will take on Democrat Aaron Alejandro in the general election.

Republicans will choose between Ron Buffum and Chip Hitchcock in the primary, for the candidate who will take on Democrat David Farabee in the Dist. 69 state representative race.

That position, which involves the north half of Iowa Park, is currently held by John Hirschi, who has decided to not seek re-election.

Trustees move on project

The school board hired an architectural firm to do pre-bond election work during a called meeting Monday night.

Mike Marris Architect, Inc. was employed by a unanimous vote of the trustees for pre-bond election work. It was specified that the cost would not exceed \$3,000.

Murphy Davis, the district's financial advisor, and representatives from Marris Architect, Inc., Mike Marris and Raymond Etheridge, met with the board to discuss issues con-

cerning construction of school facilities and calling of a possible bond issue.

Date for a bond election has not been set, but trustees are considering holding the election in late August.

Murphy said he would try to have a time schedule for a bond issue ready for the regular board meeting on March 12, and Marris will prepare a time line for construction, both using the August date.

In other business, no action was taken on a contract for work on the high school parking lot.

Council to meet Monday

Public appearances on two subjects that were passed over at the last city council meeting are on the agenda for Monday's session.

The meeting is to begin at 7 p.m. in council chambers.

Ron Longino, representing the Hotter 'n Hell bicycle race, will ask permission that the city hall park be used as a rest stop.

Larry Bryant, representing Buford Television, is to request the city assign his firm TCI's cable franchise and extend the term of the agreement.

Aldermen decided to not take action on both subjects at their last meeting, because representatives were not in attendance.

The cable television franchise issue is due to the fact that TCI is

selling its business here, and in several other communities in the area.

Also concerning television service, aldermen will consider an ordinance sought by Friendship Cable of Texas to erect, maintain and operate a community antenna television service within the city.

Two resolutions will be considered during the meeting. One concerns an agreement for work on the Johnson Road water tower, and the other, if approved, would extend a lease agreement on a portion of South Park right of way to Billy James.

Administrator Mike Price will ask the council for authority to advertise for sealed bids from contractors wishing to sell unleaded gasoline for use in city vehicles.

Police arrest shoplifter

A 47-year-old man was arrested for shoplifting at Wal-Mart Friday afternoon, according to the police blotter.

Wendell Bruce Meador was detained by a security agent of the store and turned over to officers.

Though Meador had in his possession only \$52 worth of merchandise, he was charged with a felony, because, according to records, he had five previous convictions.

Meador was later transported to the county jail.

Leonard Earl Armstrong, 26, was taken into custody Wednesday evening of last week, when it was determined he had two outstanding locally-issued warrants against him.

The warrants were for having an expired drivers license and failure to maintain financial responsibility, with \$117.75 and \$253.25, respective, fines.

He was later released after signing a promise to appear in mu-

nicipal court, according to the blotter entry.

A business sign in the 600 block of East Highway was reportedly damaged by a vehicle last week. The report was filed Friday.

Police believe they have identified the owner of a vehicle which reportedly struck another vehicle parked over the weekend in the 1300 block of Fourth Street.

A warrant had been prepared for issuing at presstime, police said.

There was a time, not too many years ago, that our utility companies played a major part in our communities.

They had offices and personnel in almost every town.

If you wanted to pay your bill, had a problem, or just wanted to discuss plans for doing something around your home or business, you just dropped by the local office.

The people in those offices were residents of our communities. They often provided leadership. They were your next-door neighbors.

But no more. One at a time, the electric, gas and telephone companies began pulling back, closing down, and that was that.

For a time, each utility would

name a local, unrelated business that would accept your monthly payments. But no more.

That is, after March 25. That's when Southwestern Bell Telephone told Ken Via that its monthly payments could no longer be accepted at Parkway.

All utility payments -- other than your city's, that is -- must be mailed.

And if you need to talk with someone? Then you go through the process of "touch 1" or "touch 25" on your phone dial.

I still haven't figured out what folks do if they don't have touchtone phones when that happens.

In every case, the utilities explained they were closing down their local offices to save money.

Have you noticed any savings in your utility bills?

Sadly, those days are long-since gone. Forever.

About the only time you will see a utility representative is when they appear before a city council, seeking a rate increase or easement agreement.

PASTA RECIPES

Pasta dishes have gained popularity in the last few years, both as a source of energy, and for the nutrients they provide.

Pasta can be used in casseroles or as a base for all types of sauces, and the combinations are numerous.

The recipes being featured this week will hopefully provide new ideas for pasta lovers.

Creamy Chicken Manicotti

8 manicotti shells
1 (10 3/4 oz.) can creamy chicken mushroom soup, undiluted
1/2 cup sour cream
2 cups chopped cooked chicken
1/4 cup chopped onion
2 Tbsps. butter or margarine, melted
1 - 4 oz. can sliced mushrooms, undrained
1 cup (4 ozs.) shredded Cheddar or Monterey Jack cheese

Cook manicotti shells according to package directions, omitting salt. Drain shells and set aside.

Combine soup and sour cream; stir well. Combine half of soup mixture and chicken; stir well. Set aside remaining soup mixture. Stuff manicotti shells with chicken mixture and place in a greased 12x8x2-inch baking dish.

Saute onion in butter in a large skillet until tender; add mushrooms. Stir reserved soup mixture into mushroom mixture. Spoon over manicotti. Bake uncovered at 350 degrees 15 minutes. Sprinkle with cheese and bake an additional 5 minutes. Yield: 4 servings.

Fideo

5 slices bacon
8 ozs. uncooked vermicelli
3 cloves of garlic, chopped
1 small onion, chopped
1 - 28 oz. can stewed tomatoes
4 1/2 tsps. sugar

Fry bacon in skillet until crisp. Drain and crumble, reserving drippings. Break vermicelli into small pieces. Add vermicelli, garlic and onion to drippings in skillet. Saute until brown. Stir in tomatoes, sugar and crumbled bacon. Simmer, covered, 10 minutes.

Broccoli Pasta Casserole

2 bunches fresh broccoli, cut into small pieces
1 - 12 oz. box rotini pasta noodles
2 (10 3/4 oz.) cans cream of mushroom soup or cream of celery soup
1 clove garlic, minced
1 can onion rings (optional)

Preheat oven to 325 degrees and lightly grease 9x13 casserole dish.

Cook broccoli pieces, covered in boiling salted water about 5 minutes; drain. Meanwhile, cook pasta according to package directions; drain. Combine broccoli, pasta, soup and garlic. Pour into casserole dish. Top with onion rings if desired and bake uncovered 30 minutes.

Lytle said, "We are limited to what we can do with the funds we have." Money is raised through community fundraisers. The more community support the club receives at its fundraisers, the more contributions they can make. Lytle said the Lions' biggest fundraiser is the soft drink and sausage-on-a-stick booth at the Whoop-T-Do. He added this year they will be sponsoring a MerriWeather and Culpepper Circus Sept. 28. They also hold a bi-annual broom and mop sale of items made by the Lighthouse for the Blind.

The club will also induct, for the fifth year, someone from Iowa Park who has excelled in track and field into the Hawk Track Hall of Fame.

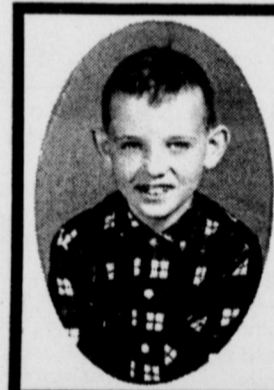

Baseball Hawks enter tournament undefeated

The Iowa Park Hawks came from behind to defeat the Rider JV team 7-5 Friday afternoon to go to 2-0 for the season, in the home opener at Hawk Field.

Iowa Park pounded out 11 hits in the game against the Raiders, that combined with the 14 hits against Hirschi in the season opener is a good early sign that the Hawks are going to be solid at the plate. Iowa Park has scored 22 runs in the two games.

Rider jumped on top 3-0 in the top of the second inning after a pair of leadoff walks and a single loaded the bases with no outs. The Raiders scored three times on two singles to take a 3-0 lead, still with no outs, before Iowa

Park settled down. Chase Wright recorded the first out on a strikeout, then got a ground ball back to the mound for the second, before striking out the next batter to end the inning.

In the top of the third, Wright struck out the side retiring the three, four and five hitters for the Raiders. In all Wright finished with six strikeouts, two walks and allowed four hits in his three innings of work.

In the bottom half of the third inning Iowa Park got on the board with a pair of runs to cut the lead to 3-2.

Michael Swenson led off with a walk, then stole second and later scored on an RBI single to right-

center by Scotty Mitchell to make it 3-1. Mitchell swiped second and then went to third on a passed ball, and scored on a sacrifice fly by Jonathan Clubb for the second run of the inning.

Tyler Pulley came on to pitch in the top of the fourth inning and allowed a single run following a bases-loaded situation with two outs to make the score 4-2.

Iowa Park took the lead for good in the bottom of the fourth by scoring three runs to go on top 5-4.

Bryan Miller led off the inning by reaching on an error by the short stop. Chase Wright followed with a single to left to put runners at first and second. Perry Green then drove the

ball in the gap to right-center for a double, scoring both Miller and Wright to tie the game. Brandon McLemore singled to score Green for the go ahead run.

Iowa Park missed an opportunity to blow the game wide open in the same inning as the Hawks had the bases loaded with no outs and couldn't push across any more runs, with the inning ending with a pair of strike outs and a fly ball to left.

In the bottom of the fifth, after Rider had scored a single run in the top of the inning, the Hawks answered with a run of their own.

Miller singled to right, Brandon Brown walked and McLemore singled to load the bases before Justin Terry walked to drive home Miller, making the score 6-5.

Iowa Park picked up an insurance run in the bottom of the sixth when Green drove home Clubb, who had led off the inning with a single to left.

Leading hitters for Iowa Park included Green, who finished 3x4 with a run scored and 3 RBIs, Mitchell

who finished 2x4 with a run scored and an RBI, as well as a pair of steals. McLemore also finished 2x4 with an RBI.

Pulley picked up the win to go 1-0 for the season while Terry picked up the save, his first of the year.

"I thought we played fairly well," said head coach David Fuhrman. "Rider's JV team is always pretty good. We hit the ball well and we played a lot better defensively. I'm a little bit concerned about our pitchers control right now. We gave up eight walks in seven innings and that's too many. Our consistency needs to improve as well. We're throwing too many pitches and going too deep in

the count too often. But it's early and those things usually take care of themselves the more they get to throw."

"I'm excited about the way we're hitting the ball this early," Fuhrman added. "We've already had 25 hits in just two games and scored 22 runs. One of the keys is that we're getting our lead off hitter on and he's scoring. Against Rider in four of the six innings our leadoff hitter got on and scored. That sets the tone for the rest of our hitters."

Iowa Park will travel to Childress Friday to take part in the Childress Tournament, an event the Hawks have won the last three years.

Mistakes hurting Lady Hawks

Coyotes. Iowa Park played error-free in the game and also hit the ball well.

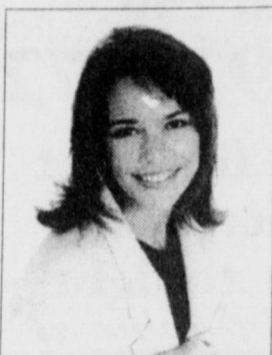

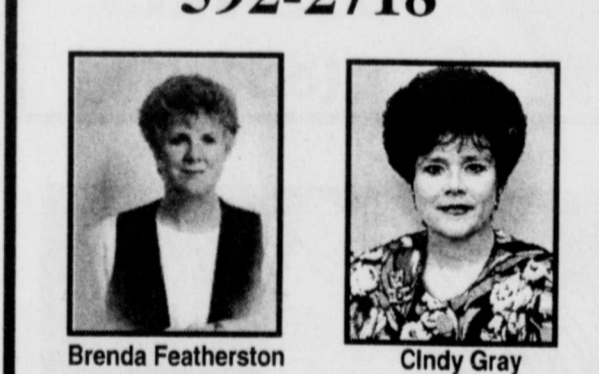

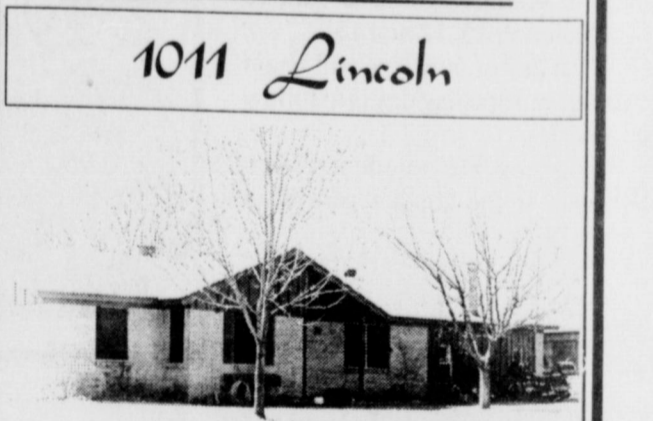
