Theclub started with 40 mem25 , with four charter members still active.

They became known as the "MuleSkinners" because the hobby of one of the charter members was raising miniature mules.

When they first began, the members traveled to such places as San Marcos, Grand Prairie, and as far chili cook offs, and promoting Iowa Park.

The members wore a distinctive iform, a white hat and shirf, that clearly stated they were the "Iowa Park MuleSkinners." They still wear a white shirt and a blue apron. The first couple of meetings con sisted of inter-club cook-offs in an effort toselect a chininaipe.

One of the MuleSkinners' first public events was a chili feed for all residents of Iowa Park. They prepared
650 pounds of chili meat to feed the 650 pous.

Tve known people who've been hit by these gnats around the eye or lip, and not one said anylhing pleas-
ant about the results. One man's eye was complectly closed by the swelling after one bite on his eyebrow. Using meswin spay buffalo gnatoff you Ive had a lot of experience in finding that out. One of the most common materials you can use to fend off the buf-
