Bobby McNeil Receives Certificate From Maribel P. Chavez Of Abilene



Abilene- Bobbie McNeil and Hector Aguirre, Callahan county maintenance section employees, recently competed in Abilene district's second annual rodeo.

McNeil and Aguirre earned the right to compete at district level by taking first and second place, respectively in the Callahan county rodeo competition.

The Texas Department of

Transportation's idea of a rodeo is a little different as one might imagine," Lauren Garduno, Abilene district maintenance engineer, said.

"In our rodeo, we don't ride 1200 pound horses, we wrangle 7 1/2 ton dump trucks. Employees are challenged to steer trucks down long, winding and narrow passages; and, instead of seeing who has the best time in an even, they compete to see who can stop closest to a stop line and an alley dock."

In addition to TxDOT's rodeos testing precision driving skills, they also test the employees preventive maintenance knowledge.

"This year," Garduno said, "we tighten up some of the rules regarding preventive maintenance.

Contestants at both the county and district meets took dump trucks through a six-part precision driving course that tested many diffi-

cult skills.

"Everyday they have to drive in some of the most dangerous situations possible. They are expected to analyze every situation and reach immediately in a vehicle that doesn't go as fast or respond as easily as a car," Blair Haynie said.

Finals will be held in Austin in November and the top two finishers from there will go on to the nationals.





L.H. Brigham Drives His Wife A Little Buggy

Ginny Greene-Correspondent Clyde: "Why Honey, this is not a sentence, this is a new beginning!" Those were Em Brigham's words to her downhearted husband, post surgery, as he contemplated life without a saddle. She understood his lifetime passion for horses and riding. "You've always ridden them before, but now you can drive them!"

That's how Lyman H. Brigham came to be driving his son and grandsons around Clyde Lake in an open surrey a couple weeks back. Children skipped along behind them like they were following the Piper.

His son, C.E. Brigham, (there are five generations of C.E. Brighams; this one known better as Skip) and grandsons, Chad (another C.E.) and Dusty, are from Oregon and share Brigham's love of horses. "Whenever we get to missing horses too much, why we just have to visit grandpa," his son said.

Following a 40 year career in forestry, Brigham's retirement days are spent with the horses and animals he loves, and most recent-

ly in restoring turn-of-the-century horse-drawn vehicles.

The surrey he and his family were seen driving at Clyde Lake is an open top buggy he particularly likes to use for Sunday drives.

He has a white antique surrey made in Dallas circa 1908-1910. It has a wicker rear seat and a spindle front seat. Even the Amish, who do much of his restoration work, had never seen one like it.

His Vis A Vis carriage will be seen at fairs and parades yet this fall. Its benches are face to face, hence its name, able to carry four passengers, plus another up top with the driver.

He has a burgundy single seat Doctor's Buggy with side curtains from the early 1900's, and an Amish family carriage with running lights and brakes. A pre-automobile light freight delivery wagon still advertises in barely discernable lettering pianos and organs for sale. It used to follow behind a horse on the streets of a town somewhere in Illinois.

Brigham's most recent acquisition is a Prairie Schooner, a small Conestoga wagon. "It's usable and authentic," asserts Brigham. "It's an interesting one, a light one, made for a one-


horse hitch."

He also has a small scale chuck wagon, only six feet long, that he pulls with a 40" mule.

"Hardly a day goes by that I'm not working on furniture, or something like soaking buggy wheels in diesel oil," says Brigham. He does most of the restoration to woodwork, but the Amish do most of the pain and wheel work, and such as surrey tops and other cloth work. "The fabric is 100% wool broadcloth from the Amish in Ohio. Wheel work is done in Indiana," says Brigham.

His vehicles are pulled by his Morgan and by his SSS Standard Bred Trotter. "SSS stands for Safe, Sound and Savvy," grins Brigham. "He's my parade-safe horse."

That's what he does mostly, now. Parades and fairs, special occasions like weddings, parties, even a romantic marriage proposal. His wife, Em, herself slowed by recent cancer treatment, has always loved the costuming. "She dresses us up," says Brigham. "I may go Western or top hat and tails, and she always has us fancied up for parades." Em likes people to know they've even car-

ried Santa Claus.

Lyman Brigham's fascination with horses and buggies comes wrapped in a love borne of long family tradition. His grandfather, E.C. Brigham and his great uncle Hassie were livery stable owners in Vermont, and he carries on with his tiny "front" shop in Baird, L.H. Brigham's Livery Stable, a place for livery lovers and buggy talk.



Q: We hear so much about the importance of communication between a parent & child. If you suppress a child's defiant behavior, how can he express the hostility and resentment he/she feels?

A: The child should be free to say anything to his parent, including "I don't like you" or "You weren't fair with me, mommy." These expressions of true

feeling should not be suppressed, provided they are said in a respectful manner. There is a thin line between what is acceptable and unacceptable behavior at this point. The child's expression of strong feeling, even resentment and anger, should be encouraged if it exists. But the parent should prohibit the child from resorting to name-calling and open rebellion.

"Daddy, you hurt my feelings in front of my friend, and you were unkind to me" is an acceptable statement. "You stupid idiot, why didn't you shut up when

my friends were here?!" is obviously unacceptable. If approached rationally as depicted in the first statement, it would be wise for the father to sit down and try to apologize to the child if he feels he was wrong. If he was right, however, he should calmly explain why he reacted as he did

and tell the child how they can avoid the collision next time. It is possible to communicate without sacrificing parental respect, and the child should be taught how to express his discontent properly. This will be a very useful communicative tool later in life.





CHANGES WITH AGE

Our feet undergo gradual changes as we age. These changes usually begin to register when people are in their 50s. The feet broaden, the natural padding on the soles flattens and the skin becomes dry. Each of these changes can have painful effects.

As the years go by, the broadening may require shoes that are as much as one size larger than customary. This is especially pertinent for women who habitually endure shoes that are too tight. Choosing shoes that accommodate broadened feet may help relieve problems created by years of wearing too tight shoes. Chronic dry skin can develop painful cracks, often in the heels. The cracks may invite infection.



**GOING INTO BUSINESS:
BUYING A FRANCHISE**

Starting a business is never easy, whether you build it from scratch, purchase an existing company, or buy a franchise.

A franchise agreement is basically a contract between you and an owner (franchisor) which allows you to use the owner's trademark, trade name, or advertising symbol. In exchange for this right, you pay fees (often a portion of your business revenues) to the franchisor. As with any business relationship, specific obligations and benefits vary. Some franchisors offer a full range of services to help you get started, including training, site selection, marketing plans, and products. Others give you little more than the legal right to use their name or symbol, after which you are on your own.

Initial and ongoing expenses vary widely among franchises, so determine all your costs before you invest. For example, some franchisors require franchisees to pay for licensing fees, building renovations, equipment purchases, operations manuals, real estate leases, and other start up costs. Other franchisors may require you to pick up such costs as training, insurance, and advertising.

Before signing a contract, make sure you understand any restrictions on competing with other franchisees or selling your business. Talk to other franchisees of the franchisor that you are considering. Do they get adequate training and ongoing support? If you hear extensive complaints, you should probably keep looking. Also, take a hard look at yourself. Are you willing to work long hours? Do you like working with people? Can you effectively sell your product or service?

As always, it's a good idea to seek professional advice before investing in a new business. A lawyer familiar with franchising should review your contract, and we can help determine whether your income, expense, and cash flow projections make sense.







Annual Sheep And Goat Field Day September 5

The Texas A&M Research and Extension Center's 23rd Annual Sheep and Goat Field Day is set for September 5th. The Center is located on North Highway 87. This year's event will focus on drought management.

Activities begin with registration and exhibit viewing from 9:00-9:45 a.m.

The day is dedicated to Dr. Carl Menzies, Resident Director of Research and to Ken Cook, Longtime District 7 Extension Director at the Center.

Menzies retires as the Center's only Resident Director of Research on August 31st. He has held the position since 1971. Cook retired February 29th after 17 years as Extension Director.

Menzies led Texas A&M's range and livestock research efforts on the Edwards Plateau. Under his direction, the center's Research staff evolved into world leaders in the areas of range improvement, sheep and goat management, and wool and mohair production.

Cook was responsible for overseeing county staffs in 23 area counties. Through his leadership the district developed a statewide reputation for excellence in agricultural practices and youth development.

A special manned by ranchers who weathered the 1950's drought will be a major highlight of this year's event. Elmer Kelton, noted local author, will moderate the session. Panelist include: L. P. Bloodworth, rancher, Sonora; John Cargile, Producer Livestock Auction Co, and rancher, San Angelo; Rod Richardson, rancher, Iraan; and Louis Woodward, rancher, Girvin. 

 Navy Fireman**

Navy Fireman James I. Cauthen, son of James I. and Darla L. Cauthen of Clyde, Texas recently participated in the decommissioning ceremony of the aircraft carrier USS America, the nation's namesake, which is home ported in Norfolk, Va.

Cauthen is one of the last Sailors to serve aboard one of the nation's oldest aircraft carriers. The decommissioning ceremony was held in Portsmouth, Va.

The 1,047-foot-long aircraft carrier was commissioned in 1965. USS America complet-

ed 19 major deployments, traveling millions of miles to nearly every corner of the planet. Its first deployment was to the Mediterranean Sea in 1965. Cauthen and fellow shipmates recently completed the carrier's last deployment that took them to the Adriatic Sea near Bosnia and to the Persian Gulf near Iraq.

A rich history of events follows USS America. In 1981, it became the first carrier to transit the Suez Canal since 1967. Cauthen's ship was the only aircraft carrier to participate in combat operations from the Red Sea and the Persian Gulf during the Desert Storm. It also supported U.N. efforts in Somalia and Haiti.

USS America earned 45 awards through out its 31 years of service. As a member of the ship's last crew, Cauthen plays an important role. The ceremony that decommissions a U.S. Navy ship is a time-honored tradition.

The 1993 graduate of Clyde High School joined the Navy in November 1993. His wife, Crystal, is the daughter of Wayne Towery, also of Clyde.

Everyone will still need to call 911 to report an emergency, just as you have been doing. The pager system should mean quicker response time by emergency responders and less chaos for the dispatchers.

IF TOOTH KNOCKED OUT BY INJURY

Tommy was riding his skateboard down the driveway. He lost his balance and fell to the pavement. He wiped the blood from his mouth and found his upper front tooth in his hand. What do you do? Luckily, your dentist can deal effectively with this kind of dental emergency. But he'll need your help.

Collect the tooth and replace it in the socket at the site of the injury. Have your child (or you) hold it there until you reach the dentist. This will keep the tooth in its natural environment and extend the opportunity for a successful replantation. If this is not possible, wrap the tooth in a wet cloth or place it in a glass of water.

Don't linger! The chances for a successful replantation are best if done within 30 minutes to an hour after this mishap.

Some parents rush their child to the dentist, but in their haste forget to bring the tooth. DON'T FORGET THE TOOTH! And don't try to clean it yourself - even if it looks messy. What you think is dirt may actually be soft tissues that will help in the healing process.
