Beginning August 1, 1997 all of the mail originating in Baird will be sent to our pro-

Lawrence Bros. set date to rebuild in Clyde

Construction is expected to begin Aug. 17 on a new Lawrence Bros. IGA store on south access road of Interstate 20 to replace the one that burned June 5 in Clyde.

The new store, in the same location as the old on in Callahan Plaza, is scheduled for completion Oct. 23.

The Lawrence family, based in Sweetwater will purchase the land they previously leased. The new store will be 28,000 square feet, 40 percent larger than the previous store.

The building that housed Reel Action Video next door will be torn down to make more room for the new store.

The added space in the new store will be used to double the deli and fresh produce section and enlarge the bakery, floral and full service meat department. The frozen food, dairy and over the counter drug area will also be expanded.

A look at our past

This is column number 11 in a series of excerpts from yellowing copies of Eastland County newspapers.

Two articles concerning the theatrical profession have prominent locations on the front page of a March 11, 1922 county paper.

"\$800 TAKEN FROM SAFE IN FORT WORTH THEATRE."

The Associated Press article reads: "Two bandits entered the Palace theatre, in the heart of the business district, at 6 o'clock this morning, tied and gagged two...porters, hacked the combination off the safe and escaped with \$800."

The headline of the other article says: "JERSEY THEATRE MAN 'SLAIN LIKE TAYLOR'."

This United Press story from Camden, New Jersey goes: "Under mysterious circumstances recalling the murder of William Desmond Taylor, John T. Brunen, a theatrical promoter, was slain here last night. Three men were seen to drive up to Brunen's home and later he was found dead. A charge of buckshot had been fired into the back of his neck at close range, apparently from a sawed-off shotgun."

How to prevent your child's first day jitters

A child's first day at school can be an A+ if parents do a little homework of their own. "A parent's attitude about school plays an important part in how child reacts," said Dr. Lou Ann Todd Mock, a psychologist at Baylor College of Medicine in Houston.

"If your child has been in day care, make clear that this change is a real accomplishment and that now the child

is grown-up enough to go to "real" school," she said.

Mock's other suggestions:

*Visit the school during the summer.

*Begin the appropriate bedtime and wake-up schedule a week or two in advance.

*Figure out the best morning routine.

*Let the child select the first-day clothes and lay them out in advance.

Flood insurance recommended for those eligible in Texas

As Texas lakes and rivers begin to recede after this summer's flooding, disaster officials again encourage property owners throughout the state to purchase flood insurance through the National Flood Insurance Program (NFIP). There is a 30-day waiting period before an NFIP policy goes into effect.

With the height of hurricane season upon Texas, and the awareness that such storms have an inland as well as coastal flooding impact, now is the time to act so that the 30-day waiting period can begin.

"Flood insurance can provide financial relief from flood damages to both buildings and contents," said James E. McClanahan, Federal Coordinating Officer. "Most property owners insurance policies do not cover flood damage."

In a federally declared disaster, the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) helps the State in aiding those affected by the disaster.

Under law, both property owners and renters who receive assistance from the Individual and Family Grant Program and who live in the floodplain (called a Special Flood Hazard Area, also known as the 100-year floodplain)-must purchase and maintain flood insurance for the life of the damaged dwelling. For renters, flood insurance must be maintained as long as the unit is occupied by the grantee.

Upon receiving an Individual and Family Grant, an accompanying letter will inform the applicant living in a Special Flood Hazard Area that they need to purchase flood

insurance. If the grantee does not live in a Special Flood Hazard Area, their letters will include no such mention about purchasing flood insurance.

While federally declared and SBA declared disasters are few and far between, lesser flooding events occur regularly in Texas. Property owners, renters and business owners who have policies with the NFIP can be reimbursed for losses even if a disaster declaration is not made. Other individuals may not be as fortunate.

Flood insurance backed by the federal government is available through any licensed property agent in Texas or by calling the NFIP toll-free at 1-800-427-4661.

Getting The Most From Your Money

SELLING A STOCK IS AS IMPORTANT AS BUYING

Deciding when to sell a stock is as important as deciding when to buy. One technique suggested by market analysts is to set the "sell" price before you purchase a stock. For example, at the time you buy a stock for \$50 per share, prepare to sell it at, say \$60. Set a low-side "sell" price, too, to limit your loss if the price falls. Where to set these prices depends upon your expected profit and the loss you can withstand if the stock price drops.

Another technique uses "moving averages." You can calculate various moving averages using different stocks and different time periods. These averages are plotted on a graph to reveal trends that help you determine when to buy and sell.

Yet another technique is to sell when the company's fundamental business indicators begin to wane. A few of the important factors are earnings, price-to-earnings ratio (stock price divided by profit per share), market share, profit margin, and sales volume. You can obtain this information from the company's financial statements and from newspaper and magazine reports.

The idea is to sell when the stock becomes overpriced in light of these factors. Many users of this technique focus particularly on the price-to-earnings ratio, selling when a stock's price becomes too high in comparison to the stock's past ratios or with the ratio of a standard group of stocks.

There are, of course, other techniques (and combinations of techniques). If you invest in stocks, be sure to give careful thought to what your selling strategy should be. Perhaps your stockbroker can suggest a technique that fits your overall investment plan.

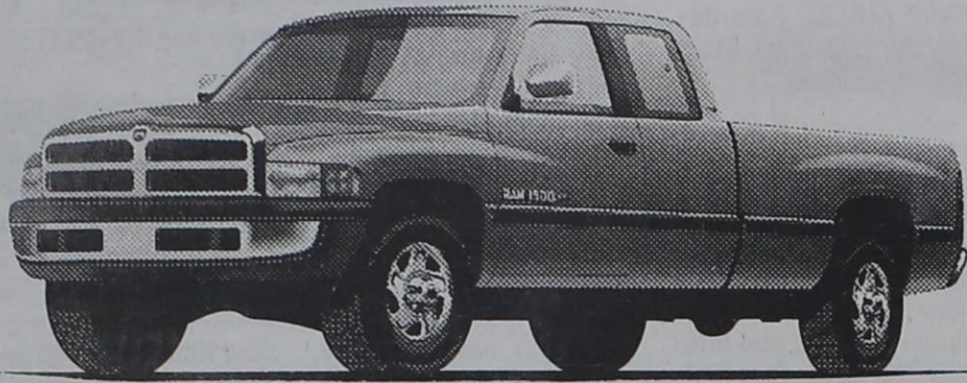

AT MID-WEEK, indications looked good for a balanced budget AND major federal tax cut legislation even before the Congressional recess. House and Senate and Administration 'appeared' to be getting close to agreements. House version would up estate tax exemption from the current \$600,000 to

a million by 2007, with no special treatment for family-owned businesses and other estates. Blue Dog Conservative Demos under Con. Charles Stenholm's direction would up that exemption to \$1.2 million by 2004, and increase the exemption on family-owned businesses and farms to \$1 million. House would lower capital gains tax from 28 to 20% on all assets except real estate which would be taxed at 26%; Blue Dogs would grant 10% exclusion per year asset was held up to 50% at five years or longer, on all assets including real estate. The House would provide \$400 child (under 17) tax credit in '98 and \$500 thereafter for families with incomes below \$75,000, if the family has income tax liabilities. The Blue Dogs would provide \$300 per child in '97 through '99 and \$500 thereafter for families with incomes below \$60,000 if they have federal tax liabilities. House would provide 50% HOPE credit for the first \$3000 college expenses for the first two years; no credit for third and fourth years; for individuals with incomes under \$40,000 (couples, \$80,000) OR HOPE tax credit of up to \$10,000 a year if HOPE credit is not claimed. The Blue Dog proposal would provide 100% for the first \$1000, 50% for the next \$1000 for up to four years of college

education; 20% tuition credit for the third and fourth year; for individuals with incomes under \$50,000 and couples with under \$80,000 year; and tax deduction of up to \$2,500 a year for interest on student loans.

SENATE AND House Conference Committee will work out the details of their respective agriculture bills and we all will be affected by what finally comes down the pike. The just-passed House appropriation bill is just under \$50 billion, less than for '97 and in addition to the usual USDA-recognized (Extension, Crop Insurance, Conservation, etc.) the bill covers School Lunches, WIC, Food Stamps, Elderly Feeding Programs and other vital food programs important to people who never set eyes on a farm. A total of \$3.9 billion is provided for WIC, the food program for women, infants and children, because of the need for a nutritional start to life. Other key rural programs include Rural Housing Loans, Economic Development loans for businesses, Rural Electrification and Telecommunication programs, Distance Learning and Medical Link Grants. The 17th District funding included the Brownwood Pecan Research Station, the San Angelo Center on wool production, The Boll Weevil Program and the Rabies Control Program.

Legal matters about car repair in the dark

Car Repairs can be one of the biggest headaches a consumer faces. Today's cars and trucks are so complex that it is sometimes very difficult to diagnose problems. This can make it hard for the average consumer to know if the proposed repair will actually fix the car.

It can also make it easy for an unscrupulous mechanic to include unnecessary but expensive work as part of the repair job, use secondhand parts, or bill you for repair work that was not done. We at the Office of the Attorney General want to assist you in avoiding this kind of "repair" job.

DTPA protects Consumers

Texas has no law specifically governing complained about about the shops you are considering. Also ask for the names of customers you may contact to see if they are satisfied with the work done by the shop. If you suspect the repair shop has violated the law, and you cannot get the problem resolved to your satisfaction, take your car to another shop and have the repair work inspected. Get the second shop's report in writing. You will need it in the event of medication or a lawsuit.

Remember, if you refuse to pay a repair bill, the shop owner has the legal right to keep your car until you pay. You may find the only way to resolve the situation is to pay the bill (making clear to the mechanic that you do not agree to it), then either seek medication or file suit against the shop under the DTPA in small claims court.

Don't Go Broke When your Car Breaks. To reduce the risk of becoming a victim, consider the following tips:

- * Always get a written estimate before any work is done.
- * Tell the mechanic to call you in advance if additional work is needed.
- * Ask to have the old parts returned to you.
- * Get everything in writing, including an explanation of the difference between the estimate and final bill, and keep every piece of paper.
- * If your charge is much higher than the estimate, or if the work was done without your authorization, politely, but firmly, question the bill.
- * Try to settle the matter amicably before taking any other action.
- Honest repair shops know that their

business depends on their good reputation. They will try to resolve the problem to everyone's satisfaction.
