

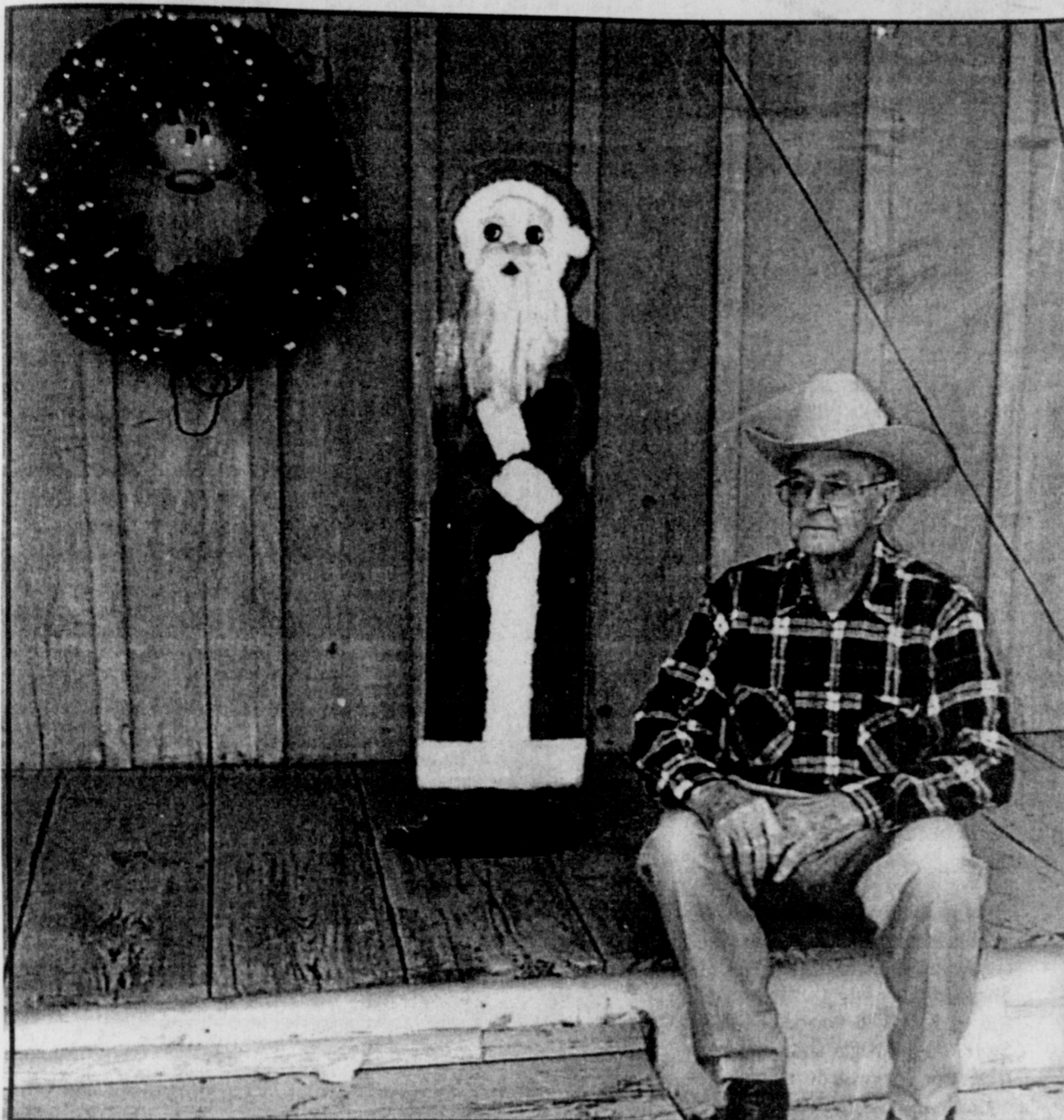

## Christmas decorating is his specialty

At the young age of 81 years, Iowa Parkan Fred Toler is still keeping up with his neighbors and family by decorating his yard each year for Christmas.

Toler's simple and festive touch adds to a neighborhood that obviously takes pride in holiday spirit.

Tolar and his wife, Mary Glen, have been decorating their yard some 50 years. Mrs. Toler said they started decorating their yard the year Toler returned from World War II, serving with the Army. That was the same year they built their home at 810 Yosemite - 1949.

She added that the decorations were begun for the benefit of their two daughters, Peggy Robertson and Jo Ann Yarbrough, and then for their grandchildren and great grandchildren.

Toler's decorations began years ago with fifty dollars worth of lights and has added to them ever since.

In past years, Mary Glen has always helped Toler with the yard decorations. However, this year Mrs.

Toler was feeling under the weather so she opted to stay inside and check lights, changing the ones out that didn't work.

Over the years, the couple decided together where the lights would be placed. He said he would point to an area and Mary Glen would say whether or not lights would go well there. He said one particular area was vacant, with no structure on which to place lights. So he built a gate frame at the entrance of their yard for the sole purpose of displaying Christmas lights.

In the past years, the Tolers have put lights all the way to the top of their trees, but the doctor told Toler he could not climb a ladder. This year the lights go up as far up as he could reach standing on the ground.

Although Toler says it takes him a little longer than it used to to get all of the Christmas lights put up, he starts early enough to be finished by the first of December.

Toler brags on his entire neighborhood's outdoor Christmas

lighting, noting that almost everyone in the area decorates for Christmas.

One of the Toler's daughters lives next door to him and the other lives south of them at the end of the block. They also have two grandchildren that live "within shouting distance," and they all decorate as well

## Chamber seeks nominations for annual award recipients

As has been the case in years past, the highlight of the annual Chamber of Commerce banquet, which will be held Jan. 16, will be the announcements of the recipients of several awards.

Nominations are now being accepted from civic and social organizations, as well as the public at large. Forms are available at the Chamber's office, which is open between 10 a.m. and 3 p.m. weekdays.

The awards include Outstanding Citizen of the Year, Outstanding Senior Citizen, Outstanding Educator, Outstanding Business, and Outstanding Agriculturist.

Selection of the recipients is made by awards committees, whose names are never made public. If, in the opinion of committee members, none of the nominees qualifies to be a recipient, no award in a particular category is made.

Deadline for the nominations is Dec. 31. It was set in order to give committee members adequate time to do their research and arrive at a decision.

Basic qualifications considered by the committees for the various awards include:

\* Outstanding Citizen: may be of any age; not necessary to be a lifetime resident; may be of any sex, married or unmarried; must have done something to distinguish them from the other members of the community.

\* Senior Citizen: should be 60 years of age or older; may be of either sex; should have done something to distinguish themselves from other citizens of the community; should have contributed to the community in general, neighbors, church, and city in an unselfish manner.

\* Outstanding Agriculturist: may be of either sex, married or unmarried; may be of any age; must have contributed something outstanding in the field of agriculture.

\* Outstanding Educator: must have the same good character of the Outstanding Citizen of the Year; may be of either sex, married or unmarried; should be a person that is recognized by other educators as out-

## Trustees' meeting tonight

Members of the Iowa Park school board will meet at 7 o'clock this evening in the W.F. George Middle School Library for their regular monthly meeting.

The FFA Public Relations Team, which placed first in the State Leadership Contest held Saturday at Sam Houston State University, will give a demonstration of their award-winning presentation during the meeting.

In addition to the regular business and reports, the trustees will talk about financial accounting needs for the year 2000, cost estimates of proposed facility needs, and a Board

Policy Update.

Agenda items on which action may be taken include a memorial to be erected on the campus of Kidwell Elementary in memory of Ricky Alsop, and a Learn and Serve grant that would be used to build a display featuring historical data of the community.

Superintendent Mike Caplinger will report on roof repairs to be done on each campus, the TEA proposal for student assessment, state testing schedule for 1999-2000, and the proposed state licensing structure for classroom teachers.

A portion of the meeting will be closed to discuss personnel matters.

The team will represent the state of Texas at the National FFA Convention in Louisville, Ky, as they

### 44 now offering free hams

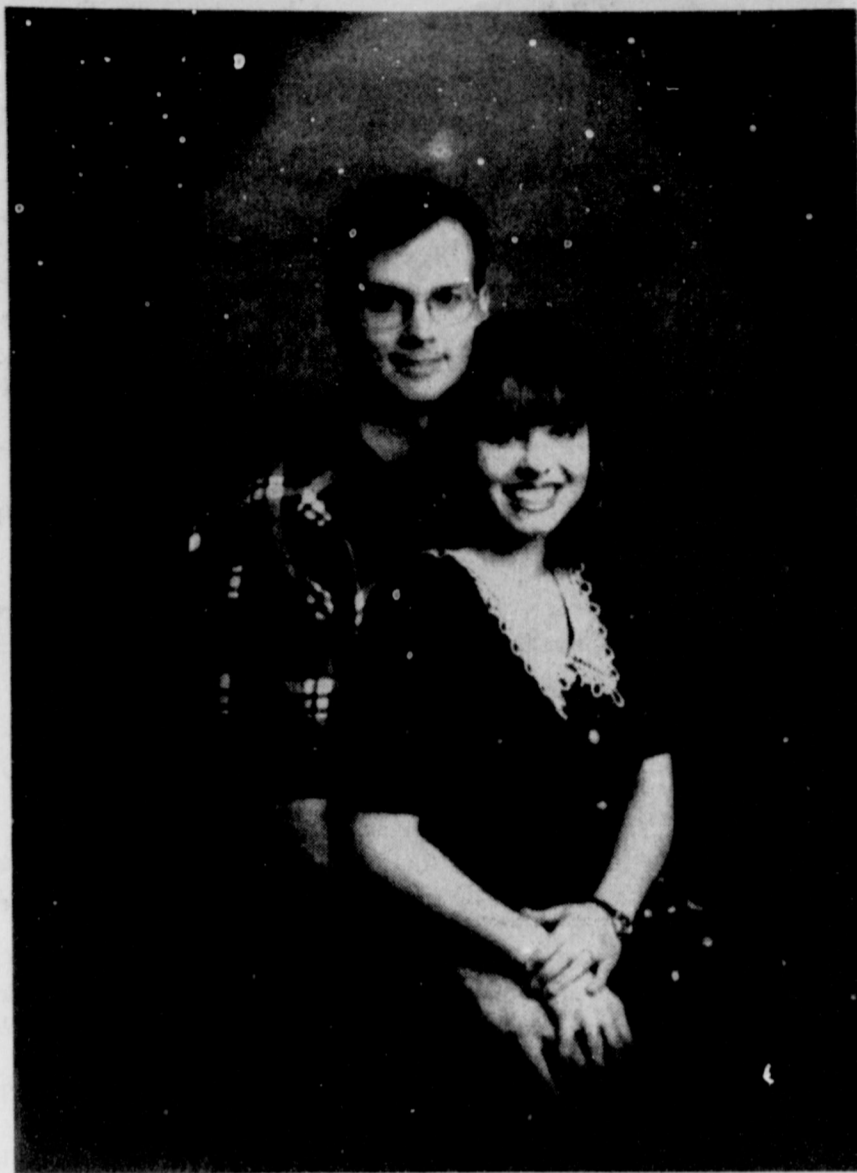
Regency One's name has been added since last week's edition of the Leader to the list of 43 local businesses that are offering free hams for Christmas.

## Recipes for Holiday Sweets

### Christmas Cookies

2 cups soft butter  
1 cup sugar  
1 egg  
2 tsps. vanilla  
4 1/2 cups sifted flour  
Cream butter and sugar. Blend in egg and vanilla and gradually blend in flour. Cover and refrigerate at least 2 hours. Roll a quarter of the dough at a time, approximately 1/8 inch thick. Cut out cookie shapes and bake on greased baking sheet 6 to 9 minutes at 375 degrees.

### Icing

2 egg whites  
1/4 tsp. cream of tartar  
Dash salt  
2 tsps. vanilla  
3 cups powdered sugar  
Beat egg whites with cream of tartar and salt until stiff. Add vanilla. Gradually beat in powdered sugar until peaks form. Divide into five bowls and add food coloring to four. Add decorative trims.

### Seven Layer Bars

1/4 lb. butter  
1 cup graham cracker crumbs  
1 cup shredded coconut  
1 (8-10 oz.) pkg. chocolate chips  
1 (8-10 oz.) pkg. butterscotch chips  
1 can sweetened condensed milk  
1/4 cup chopped nuts  
Melt butter in bottom of 9x13" pan. Evenly spread the other ingredients in the pan, one by one, in the order listed. Do not stir or mix. Bake at 350 degrees 25-30 minutes. Let cool slightly and cut into squares.

### Pecan Balls

1 - 6 oz. pkg. semisweet chocolate pieces  
1 - 6 oz. pkg. butterscotch pieces  
3/4 cups sifted powdered sugar  
1/2 cup sour cream  
1 tsp. grated lemon peel  
1/4 tsp. salt  
1 3/4 cups vanilla wafer crumbs (about 45 cookies)  
3/4 cups chopped pecans  
Melt chocolate and butterscotch pieces together over hot water; remove from heat. Add powdered sugar,

sour cream, lemon peel and salt; mix well. Blend in wafer crumbs. Chill 15-20 minutes. Shape into 1-inch balls and roll in chopped pecans. Store in a tightly covered container. Makes about 3 1/2 dozen balls.

### Millionaire Date Loaf

4 1/2 cups sugar  
1 - 13 oz. can evaporated milk  
Mix together in a heavy saucepan. Bill 5 minutes and add:  
1 small pkg. dates, chopped  
Cook 4 more minutes, stirring constantly. (Mixture may stick slightly, but it doesn't affect the results.) Remove from heat and add:  
1 pt. marshmallow creme  
2 cups pecans  
1 tsp. vanilla  
Beat until cool. Pour into a buttered dish. Cool and cut into squares.

### Apricot Balls

3 - 6 oz. pkgs. dried apricots, diced  
1 - 14 oz. pkg. flaked coconut  
1 cup chopped pecans  
1 - 14 oz. can sweetened condensed milk  
1/2 cup sifted powdered sugar  
Combine apricots, coconut and pecans in large bowl; add sweetened condensed milk, stirring well. Chill. Shape mixture into 1-inch balls, and roll each ball in powdered sugar. Store in an airtight container in refrigerator. Makes 8 dozen balls.

### Crunchy Peanut Butter Noodles

1/4 cup shortening  
1/4 cup sugar  
1 egg  
1 1/2 cups flour  
1/3 tsp. soda  
1/3 tsp. baking powder  
1/3 cup buttermilk  
1 tsp. vanilla  
Crunchy peanut butter  
Powdered sugar, optional

Cream shortening, sugar, and egg; add dry ingredients. Add butter-milk and vanilla and knead into a dough. Roll out about 1/8 inch thick. Cut in 2 inch squares. Cover with crunchy peanut butter. Fold edges together and press with fork. Bake at 375 degrees until brown. If desired, powdered sugar may be sprinkled on squares while warm. Makes about 2 1/2 dozen.

### Southern Pralines

2 cups sugar  
2 cups pecan halves  
3/4 cup buttermilk  
2 Tbsps. butter or margarine  
1/8 tsp. salt  
3/4 tsp. baking soda

Combine all ingredients except baking soda in a large heavy saucepan. Cook over low heat, stirring gently, until sugar dissolves. Cover and cook over medium heat 2 to 3 minutes to wash down sugar crystals from sides of pan. Uncover and cook to soft ball stage (235 degrees), stirring constantly. Remove from heat, and stir in soda. Beat with a wooden spoon just until mixture begins to thicken. Working rapidly, drop by tablespoonfuls onto greased wax paper. Let stand until firm.

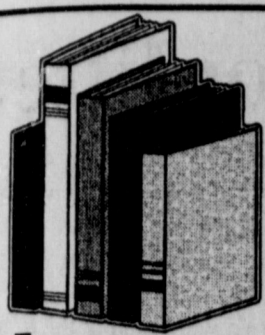

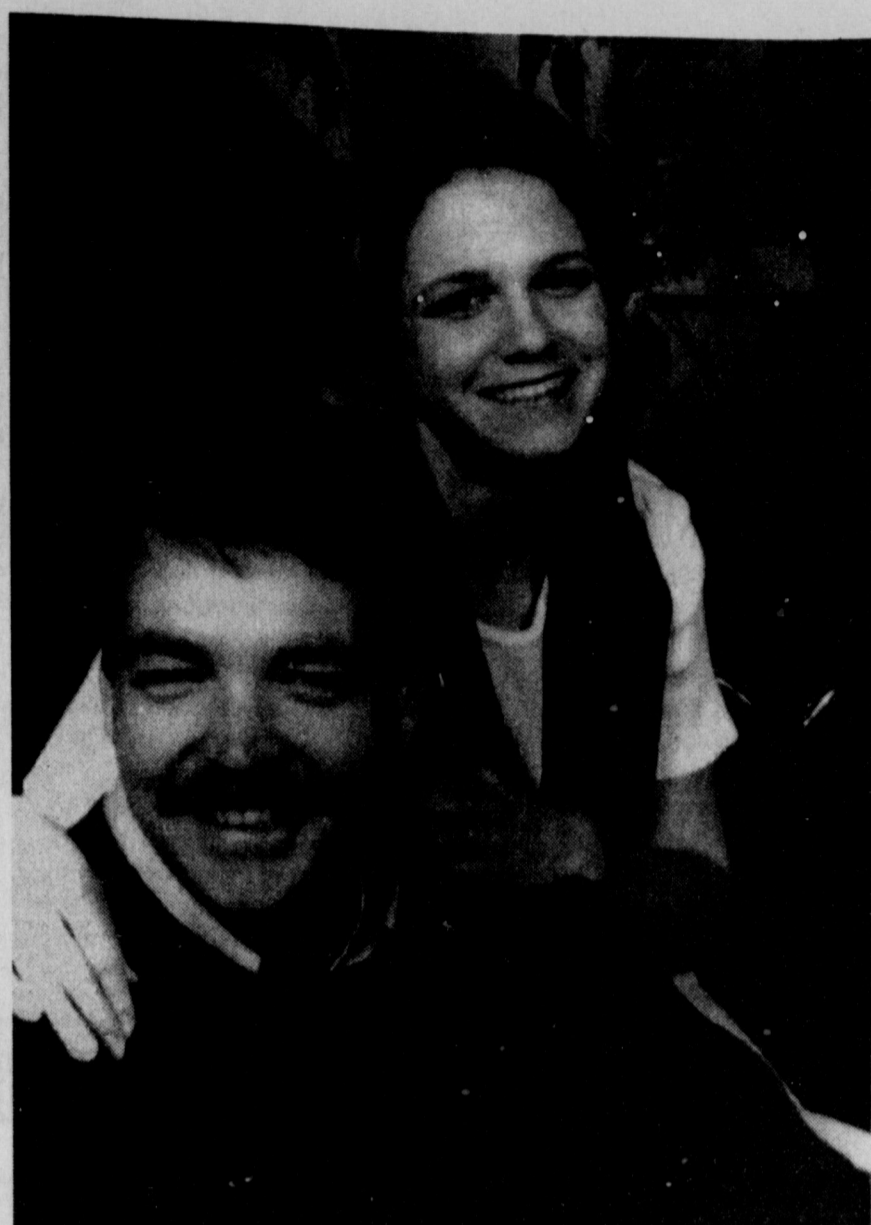

# As I See It...

Education is constantly changing, and if you want an example, just keep reading.

I've gotta give credit to Virgil Woodfin. No, he's not the educator, but he loaned me a book, "Domestic Science Principles and Application," that was a textbook for public schools, as revised in 1921.

You girls and women who took Home Economics obviously will have a better understanding of what they were teaching then, as compared to now.

This is how a classroom should be run:

### DUTIES OF HOUSEKEEPERS

Two members of the class may be assigned at the beginning of each lesson to perform the housekeeping duties. These girls may be called Housekeeper No. 1 and Housekeeper No. 2, each serving a section of the class. The students on the immediate right of the girls appointed make double portions in cooking, for the benefit of the housekeepers.

Housekeeper No. 1, Section I, performs the following duties: --

1. Bring out the supplies for Section 1.
2. Pass dish cloths and towels.
3. If ovens are to be used, get ovens for Section I.
4. Wash out half the towels that are soaked. Housekeeper in afternoon classes put day's towels to soak.
5. Straighten the shelves in the pantry.
6. Wipe off the oilcloth with a damp cloth.
7. See that each desk in Section I is supplied with soap, flour, salt, and matches.
8. Fill the pitchers of Section I with cold water.
9. Collect garbage from utility pans at the close of lesson.
10. Put away supplies at the close of lesson.
11. Sweep floor around Section I.

12. Clean the sink, soap dish and sink strainer at sink No. 1 when the class is through.

13. Arrange the curtains evenly at the close of the lesson.

14. Set the garbage can out for the janitor. See that the can is scalded each week and set in the sun and air.

Housekeeper No. 2, Section II, performs the following duties: --

1. Bring out the supplies.
2. Pass dish cloths and towels.
3. Place gas ovens, if a baking lesson.
4. Rinse towels washed by Housekeeper No. 1.
5. Hang towels on a clothes rack to dry.
6. Wipe off and polish the gas range.
7. Clean the ice box; empty any dishes that may need attention. (Note. -- Keep milk and butter in the lower part of the box.)
8. Clean all ovens and tea kettles.
9. On Friday, scald out the ice box and wipe off the shelves. See that the trap is clean.

10. See that each desk is supplied with soap, flour, salt, and matches.

11. Pass drinking water to Section II.

12. Collect the garbage from utility pans.

13. Put away all supplies.

14. Sweep floor around Section II.

15. Clean sink, soap dish, and strainer of sink No. 2.

16. Dust the moldings of the room, all ledges, and furniture.

17. Afternoon class close and lock the windows.

As you can imagine, there were loads of recipes for all kinds of foods included in the book.

One section was to teach students how to plan meals while using food costs of those days, which you might find interesting.

"Plan dietary for family of five at \$1.50 per day, where the wage earner gets \$4.50 to \$6.00 per day."

Like I said, times have changed.

## Police arrest woman shoplifter

A woman Iowa Park police arrested in a shoplifting case last week won't face charges for that action.

But she will be incarcerated, anyway.

The woman, Loretta Foster Latchett, 31, will reportedly now have to serve the balance of a 10-year sentence in prison, according to police.

Police received a call Thursday evening from Wal-Mart, reporting a woman had left that store with a full shopping cart of merchandise which she had not paid for.

Officers observed a vehicle matching the employee's description, and gave chase until it stopped in the 600 block of East Jefferson.

Officers captured the woman who was attempting to evade them in tall weeds.

After receiving a number of different alices, officers were finally able to determine the woman's real identity. Using that name for a check in the computer, they determined she was wanted for violation of her parole.

She had been convicted of robbery, and released after serving three years of a 10-year sentence.

The merchandise she allegedly took from Wal-Mart, valued at \$164, was returned to the business, according to the police blotter.

Another person was arrested on warrants issued from an agency outside Wichita County.

Brian Dwight Jackson, 29, was taken into custody Saturday evening after it was determined two outstanding warrants for him had been issued by authorities in Colorado Springs, Co.

Jackson was transported to the county jail to be detained until he is extradited.

Two women were arrested by Iowa Park police within 35 minutes of each other Tuesday evening, both due to warrants issued by the Wichita County sheriff's department.

India Allen Troutman, 41, was wanted on a charge of capis pro fine, resisting arrest, and Brandi Leann Butler, 18, was wanted for driving while license was suspended.

The two were held at the police station until they were transported by sheriff's deputies to the county jail, according to the police blotter.

Police are investigating the reported theft of a trampoline mat and springs, valued at \$250, from a residence in the 400 block of West Clara. The theft report was filed Saturday morning.

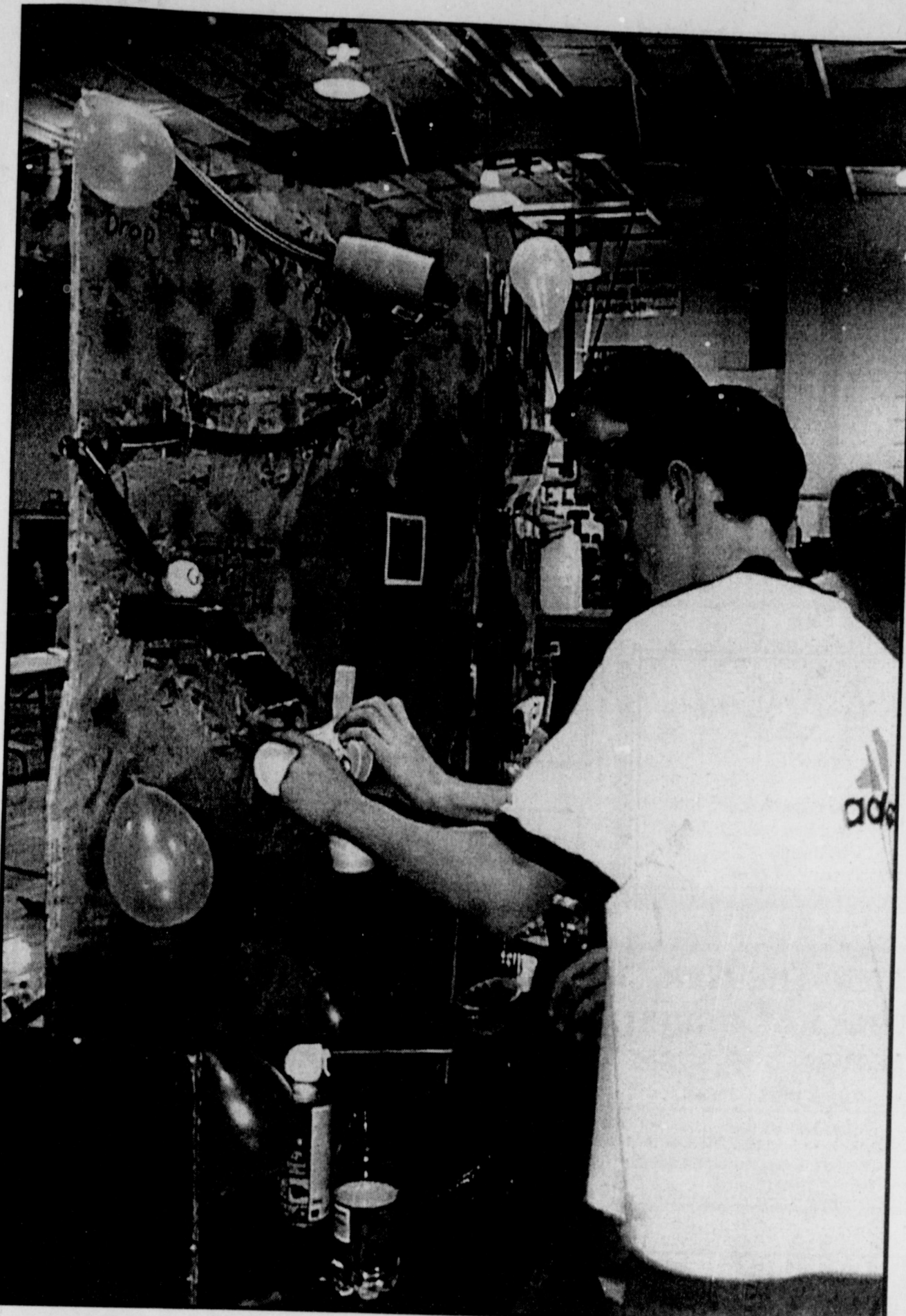

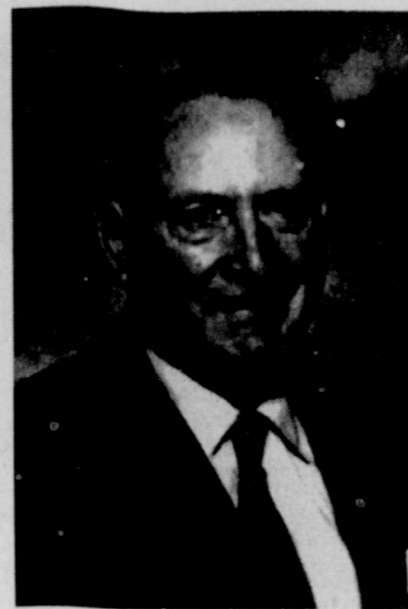

## Council to meet Monday

Two personal appearances have been included on the tentative agenda for Monday night's regular-scheduled meeting of the city council.

The meeting, which is to begin at 7 p.m. in council chambers, is the only scheduled meeting the council is to hold during the month of December.

Tommy Key is to request the city to continue its participation in his development of Park Place Addition, by providing utilities and streets for Phase Three of the development.

The city has been financing the utilities and streets for such additions, and is being reimbursed the cost as well as interest as each lot is sold.

The other appearance requested is by Rev. John Besse, who is to seek a waiver from the city's ordinance to

permit use of handbill distribution to residences, as well as to seek permission to conduct a "Christmas march on city streets."

Three resolutions appear on the agenda. One, if approved, would allow the city to continue participating in the funding of the North Texas Regional Drug Enforcement Task Force.

The other two resolutions relate to state-mandated requirements, including sharing the cost of participating in the Regional Water Plan for Area B, and the other to have installed a flume at the wastewater treatment plant.

Administrator Mike Price will seek authorization to purchase a backhoe/loader and also a one-ton cab and chassis. Price also will ask the council to reject all bids received on the purchase of a dump truck.

The council will consider acting on an ordinance which, if approved, would further restrict certain front yard obstructions, according to the agenda.
