

"The importance of Bloodmobile drives cannot be stressed enough," sayd Lynn Gast, Red Cross territory manager. "Approximately 60 percent of the blood collected by Red Cross is from mobile drives conducted at businesses, schools and churches throughout the area."

Middle School construction explained

New construction and renovations at W.F. George Middle School, proposed in the school district's bond election on May 1, amount to \$1,285,000.

New constuction includes a band/choir hall, six classrooms, and a field house.

Renovations include replacing the floor in the girls' gym, improvements in the boys' gym, and enlargement of the library.

Martha Dudley, a school board trustee and member of the group's facility study committee, explained the need for projects proposed at the middle school.

"In enlarging the library, two adjoining classrooms will be taken in to comply with ADA regulations, and to add a computer technology area.

'The boys' gym will have accoustics added. All downstairs areas will be closed and the dressing rooms and coaches offices will be in the 'fieldhouse.' The blue 'temporary' building will be used for this.

"The floor of the girls' gym needs to be replaced due to the tiles buckling.

"The band/choir hall was originally built to hold 75 to 80 students. The band and choir have both grown drastically and need more room.

"The six new classrooms will accomodate the two vocational classes now being transported to high school, replace the two classrooms used to enlarge the library, and two classrooms are earmarked for projected growth."

The needs on all campuses were determined after over two years of intensive study by a facility task force and members of the school board.

The \$5.2-million bond issue will be determined by voters on May 1.

Members of the school board will be visiting clubs and organizations to explain the bond issue and answer questions.

The questions will be answered by Superintendent Mike Caplinger or a member of the school board and published in the next edition of the Leader.

Questions & Answers

Questions this week include the following, with answers by Superintendent of Schools Mike Caplinger:

Question - "Will there be additional seating and arrangements when the south gym at the high school is converted into a competition gym?"

Answer - "Yes, the gym seating should double from 600 to 1200 seats, with most additional seating placed on the home side. If the seating in the north gym is kept, it will require considerable repair work."

Ouestion - "Will the roof of the girls' gym at the middle school be repaired?"

Answer - "Ironically the roofs on buildings at the middle school are the best in the district. They all have leaks and are in need of repair. But, yes, the roof on the girls' gym will be repaired before new flooring is installed."







s I See It.

I don't need to be reminded that Saturday is the 20th anniversary of the tornado striking neighbor Wichita

Every time I hear of one hitting anywhere, or the threat of a major storm system moving into the area, I have recollections of that 1979 event.

But, like most folks around here, it had an effect on me.

When I heard on the radio that the big funnel was approaching of the grocery store came over and Wichita Falls, I went out on Johnson Road, just south of the football stadium, because that was the highest point with an unobstructed view.

I could see the big cloud, but not the funnel itself.

I did see a funnel, however. But it was to the west. It appeared to be four or five miles from Iowa Park, just south of US 287.

After it disappeared, I drove out that way to see what damage it had inflicted. But, at least from the highway, I couldn't even find any trees that had been damaged.

About an hour after the funnel moved out of Wichita Falls, they began calling over the radio for help to assist in finding injured people in its path. The coordinating center was to be at the comer of Midwestern

Parkway and Jacksboro Highway. After arriving, a group of us were effected by it. dispatched to the area of apartments that are just west of Weeks Park Golf Course.

There was a lot of damage, but anyone injured had already been evacuated and when security perlooting, we were instructed to leave.

The next day, the MuleSkinners made dozens and dozens of sandwiches, and loaded aboard a pickup, we moved through a housing area, handing them out to people who were recovering what they could find from their wrecked homes.

The following day, we loaded up our deep fryers and all the chickens we could get from our local grocery stores, all donated, and established a serving area in the parking area of a grocery store at the corner of Southwestern Parkway and Kemp.

It didn't take long for folks to No, it didn't hit anything of mine. find us. And it appeared we would run out of our supply of chicken just after the noon hour.

> But about that time, the manager asked if we needed more chicken.

He explained that we could have his entire inventory, because all electricity was out in that area, and the health department would require him to just throw away everything in his deep freeze and cooler.

We obviously accepted, and we had enough to continue cooking until just after the sun set.

There's no way of telling how many victims and volunteers we fed that day, but those folks were extremely appreciative and gracious with their comments.

Of course, we played only a very small part in the effort to assist victims and workers, but our exposure to all that was going on, and talking with the people, makes it very easy to remember the tornado of 1979.

Even though we weren't directly

being honest. The day after the ad ran, that check was returned by the bank.

Then two days later, I received a warning from the Texas Press Association concerning the same ad.

Folks, whether we run an ad or you just learn of such a promotion from another source, don't, please don't ever respond to any job offer concerning stuffing or addressing envelopes.

I apologize to anyone who may have responded to that ad, and if you did, I'd like to talk with you about it.
