I don't need to be reminded that Saturday is the 20th anniversary of the tornado striking neighbor Wichita
Falls. Falls.

Every time I hear of one hitting anywhere, or the threat of a major
storm system moving into the area storm system moving into the area, I
have recollectionsof that 1979 event No, it didn't hit anything of mine. But, like most folks around here, it had an effect on me.
When I heard on the radio that the big funnel was approaching Wichita Falls, I went out on Johnson Road, just south of the football stadium, because that was the highest

I could see the big cloud, but not

the funnel itself.
it was to the west. It appeared to be four or five miles from Iowa Park, just south of US 287.
After it disappeared, I drove out
that way to see what damage it had inflicted. But, at least from the highway, I couldnt even find
trees that had been damaged. About an hour after the funnel
moved out of Wichita Falls, they moved out of Wichita Falls, they
began calling over the radio for help to assist in finding injured people in its path. The coordinating center was
to be at the comer of Midwestern to be at the comer of Midwestern
Parkway and Jacksboro Highway. After arriving, a group of us were
dispatched to the area of apartments dispatched to the area of apartments
that are just west of Weeks Park Golf that are just west of Weeks Park Golf
Course. There was a lot of damage, but
anyone injured had already been evacuated and when security per-
sonnel moved into the area to prevent looting, we were instructed to leave.
The next day, the MuleSkinners made dozens and dozens of sand-
wiches, and loaded aboard a pickup, wiches, and loaded aboard a pickup,
we moved through a housing area, handing them out to people who were
recovering what they could find from

The following day, we loaded up our deep fryers and all the chickens we could get from our local grocery stores, all donated, and established a serving area in the parking area of a
grocery store at the corner of Southgrocery store at the corner of Southwestern Parkway and Kemp. It didn't take long for folks to find us. And it appeared we would
run out of our supply of chicken just run out of our supply
after the noon hour.

But about that time, the manager of the grocery store came over and asked if we needed more chicken. He explained that we could have his entire inventory, because all electricity was out in that area, and the health department would require him to just throw away everything
his deep freeze and cooler.
We obviously accepted hadenough to continue cooking until just after the sun set.
There's no way of telling how many victims and volunteers we fed
that day, but those folks were that day, but those folks were ex-
tremely appreciative tremely appreciative and gracious
with their comments. with hir comments,
Of course, we played only a very small part in the effort to assist vic-
tims and workers, butour exposure to all that was going on, and talking
with the people, makes it ery easy to with the people, makes it very easy
remember the tornado of 1979 . Even though we weren't directly
effected by it.
Oh, speaking of Wichita Falls, our own city council has a different view about charging for dumping of trash at the city'sconvenience center. Unlike Wichita Falls, Iowa Park does not choose to charge volunteers participating in the City-Wide CleanUp project that begins next week. I noticed that our neighboring
city demanded that volunters pay city demanded that volunteers pay
for dumping trash and debris they for dumping trash and debris they
were collecting along the river banks that pass through that city.

Ive always culled out any such ads in the past. But when this one was
accompanied by a $\$ 70$ check, I was accompanied by a $\$ 10$ check, 1 was
impressed and ran it. Not because 1 Im in bad financial shape, but because this was a first, and gave indication of being honest.

The day after the ad ran, that check was returned by the bank. Then two days later, I received a warning from the Texas Press As
