## Clean-up Week to be city-wide

Residents are gearing up for the annual observance of Iowa Park's City-Wide Clean-Up Week.

It officially gets underway Monday and will conclude the following Sunday.

The event is jointly coordinated by the City of Iowa Park and the Chamber of Commerce.

Numerous organizations have already volunteered to pick up trash along roadways and parks sometime during the week.

Mayor Tim Hunter has issued a proclamation encouraging all residents and businesses to clean up their respective areas.

As in the past, any resident of Iowa Park is eligible to dump non-commercial trash and rubbish at the city's convenience center at Smith Road and Johnson, without charge, as long as they follow instructions of the attendant.

While there are additional areas where groups and individuals can be assigned to pick up trash, the Chamber has already assigned given areas

to volunteering groups.

Each group will be furnished bags by the Chamber, which were furnished by Cryovac.

Rotary Club - East Highway from Wall to Bell.

FFA - Johnson Road from West Highway to Magnolia.

## Burglar needed a smoke badly

Iowa Park police are investigating the burglary of a business that was reported early Friday of last week.

Someone knocked out the glass front door of Amanda's, 208 James, entered the building and took eight cartons of cigarettes, valued at \$283.50.

Damage to the structure by the burglar was set at \$135, according to the police blotter.

Eight arrests, not related to the burglary, were listed during the week in the blotter.

Police were summoned last Wednesday afternoon to Wal-Mart, where they arrested Cameo Nichole Petrik, 18, for theft of items with a total value of \$93.68.

Two other teenage females with Petrick were issued criminal trespass warnings.

reported domestic disturbance at 9:45 p.m. Thursday at a residence in the 900 block of East Cash, they arrested India Allen Chaplain, 41. She was released at 5:07 a.m. after signing a promise to appear in municipal court.

Jimmy Lee Via, 28, was picked up late Friday evening on an outstanding local warrant, capius pro fine (animal complaint), with a bond of \$150. He was later released after signing a personal recognizance bond.

Eddie James Maben, 34, was taken into custody Saturday afternoon on a warrant issued by the Wichita County sheriff's office.

Maben was wanted for felony non-support, with a bond of \$15,000. He was transported to the county jail.

Also Saturday evening, officers picked up Danielle Renee Cantrell, 18, on two locally-issued warrants: CPF no drivers license, bond \$140; and CPF no liability insurance, \$280 bond.

Cantrell was released later that evening after the \$140 fine was paid, and having signed a personal recognizance bond on the other warrant.

Another arrest on an outstanding local warrant was made Sunday afternoon.

Evert Lee Blevins, 24, was wanted for capius pro fine failure to maintain financial responsibility, with the municipal judge's stipulation that

### Early voting to begin Wednesday

Early voting will begin Wednesday in the two elections to be held here May 1, and conclude April 17.

Three city council positions are on one ballot, while the other concerns the \$5.2-million school bond issue.

Early ballots can be cast in person at city hall, in the city council election, and at the school tax office

on the bond issue.

Because only two candidates have filed for the two school trustee positions, that election is to be cancelled.

Candidates for the three city alderman positions include: Place One, incumbent Tracy Fears and Johnny Crawford; Place Three, incumbent Bob Hamilton and Wayne House, and Place Five, incumbent Bud Mercer and Floyd Williams.

### Bloodmobile to visit next week

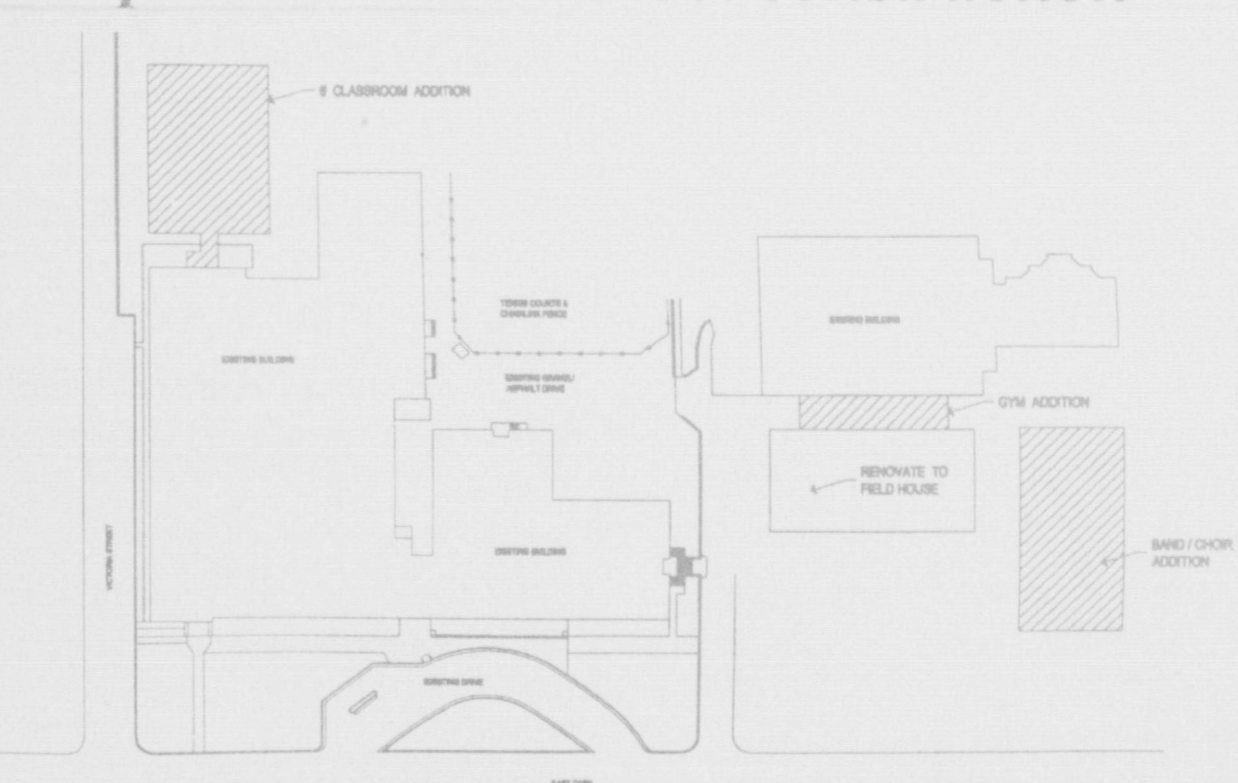
The Red Cross Bloodmobile will be at the Iowa Park Masonic Lodge from 1:30 to 6:30 p.m. Wednesday, April 14.

### Proposed Middle School construction



## Middle School construction explained

New construction and renovations at W.F. George Middle School, proposed in the school district's bond election on May 1, amount to \$1,285,000.

New construction includes a band/choir hall, six classrooms, and a field house.

Renovations include replacing the floor in the girls' gym, improvements in the boys' gym, and enlargement of the library.

Martha Dudley, a school board trustee and member of the group's facility study committee, explained the need for projects proposed at the middle school.

"In enlarging the library, two adjoining classrooms will be taken in to comply with ADA regulations, and to add a computer technology area.

"The boys' gym will have acoustics added. All downstairs areas will be closed and the dressing rooms and coaches offices will be in the 'fieldhouse.' The blue 'temporary' building will be used for this.

"The floor of the girls' gym needs to be replaced due to the tiles buckling.

"The band/choir hall was originally built to hold 75 to 80 students. The band and choir have both grown drastically and need more room.

"The six new classrooms will accommodate the two vocational classes now being transported to high school, replace the two classrooms used to enlarge the library, and two classrooms are earmarked for projected growth."

The needs on all campuses were determined after over two years of intensive study by a facility task force and members of the school board.

The \$5.2-million bond issue will be determined by voters on May 1.

Members of the school board will be visiting clubs and organizations to explain the bond issue and answer questions.

### Questions & Answers

Questions this week include the following, with answers by Superintendent of Schools Mike Caplinger:

**Question -** "Will there be additional seating and arrangements when the south gym at the high school is converted into a competition gym?"

**Answer -** "Yes, the gym seating should double from 600 to 1200 seats, with most additional seating placed on the home side. If the seating in the north gym is kept, it will require considerable repair work."

**Question -** "Will the roof of the girls' gym at the middle school be repaired?"

**Answer -** "Ironically the roofs on buildings at the middle school are the best in the district. They all have leaks and are in need of repair. But, yes, the roof on the girls' gym will be repaired before new flooring is installed."

## Permits take big increase

An office building under construction at the corner of Bank and Yosemite is the major reason that building permits issued during March almost doubled the first two months of 1999.

The permit was issued to Stanley Williamson, who had to give up his office area at Park and Wall, due to the consolidation of North Central Bancshares' branch offices, which was announced last month.

Permits issued by city hall during March amounted \$166,460, which easily overshadowed the \$90,563 total of January and February, according to the report. That raised the year's total to \$257,023.

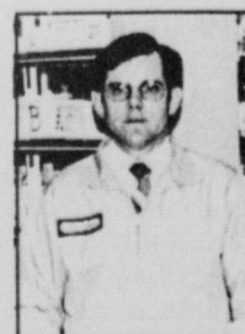

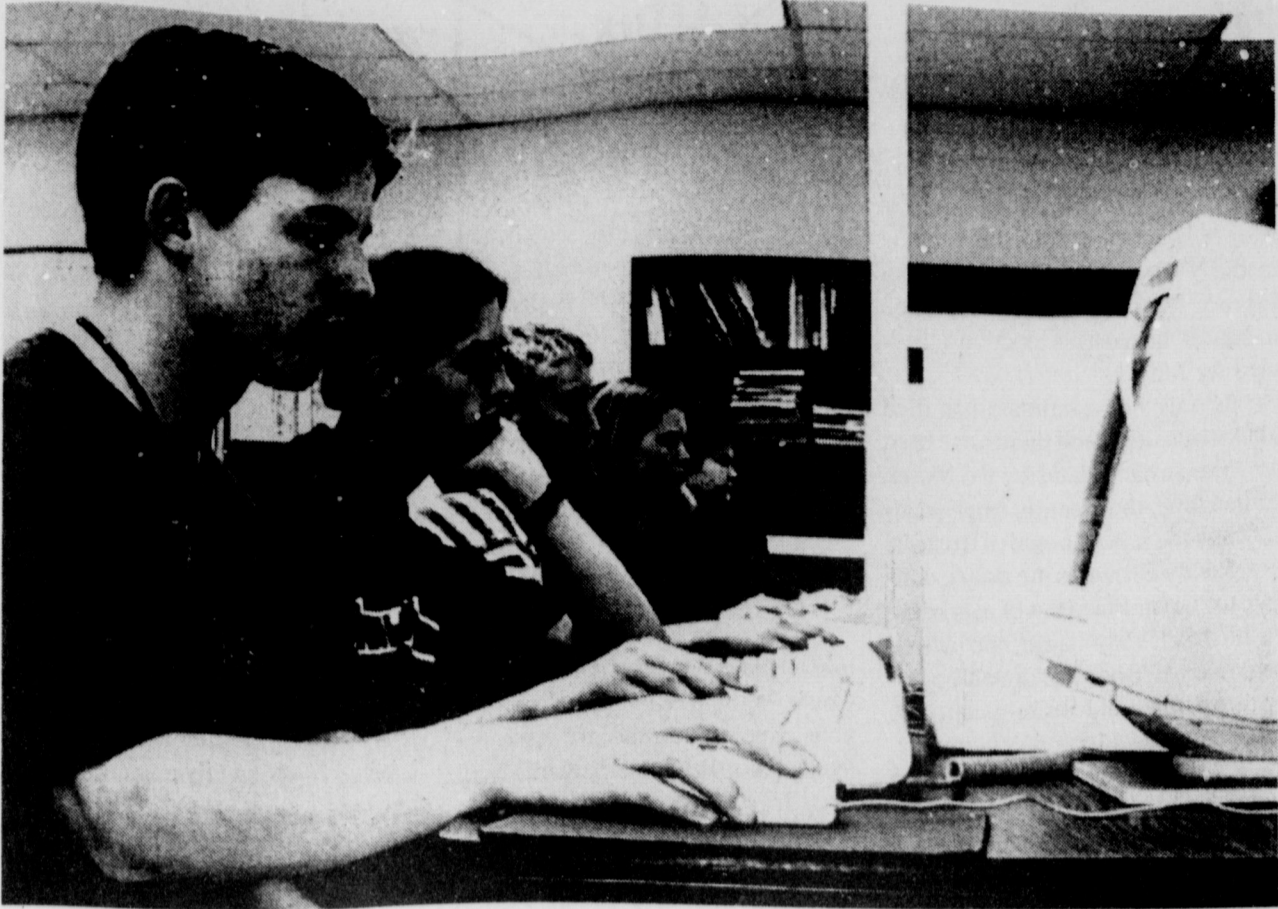

I don't need to be reminded that Saturday is the 20th anniversary of the tornado striking neighbor Wichita Falls.

Every time I hear of one hitting anywhere, or the threat of a major storm moving into the area, I have recollections of that 1979 event.

No, it didn't hit anything of mine. But, like most folks around here, it had an effect on me.

When I heard on the radio that the big funnel was approaching Wichita Falls, I went out on Johnson Road, just south of the football stadium, because that was the highest point with an unobstructed view.

I could see the big cloud, but not the funnel itself.

I did see a funnel, however. But it was to the west. It appeared to be four or five miles from Iowa Park, just south of US 287.

After it disappeared, I drove out that way to see what damage it had inflicted. But, at least from the highway, I couldn't even find any trees that had been damaged.

About an hour after the funnel moved out of Wichita Falls, they began calling over the radio for help to assist in finding injured people in its path. The coordinating center was to be at the corner of Midwestern Parkway and Jacksboro Highway.

After arriving, a group of us were dispatched to the area of apartments that are just west of Weeks Park Golf Course.

There was a lot of damage, but anyone injured had already been evacuated and when security personnel moved into the area to prevent looting, we were instructed to leave.

The next day, the MuleSkinners made dozens and dozens of sandwiches, and loaded aboard a pickup, we moved through a housing area, handing them out to people who were recovering what they could find from their wrecked homes.

The following day, we loaded up our deep fryers and all the chickens we could get from our local grocery stores, all donated, and established a serving area in the parking area of a grocery store at the corner of Southwestern Parkway and Kemp.

It didn't take long for folks to find us. And it appeared we would run out of our supply of chicken just after the noon hour.

But about that time, the manager of the grocery store came over and asked if we needed more chicken.

He explained that we could have his entire inventory, because all electricity was out in that area, and the health department would require him to just throw away everything in his deep freeze and cooler.

We obviously accepted, and we had enough to continue cooking until just after the sun set.

There's no way of telling how many victims and volunteers we fed that day, but those folks were extremely appreciative and gracious with their comments.

Of course, we played only a very small part in the effort to assist victims and workers, but our exposure to all that was going on, and talking with the people, makes it very easy to remember the tornado of 1979.

Even though we weren't directly effected by it.

Oh, speaking of Wichita Falls, our own city council has a different view about charging for dumping of trash at the city's convenience center.

Unlike Wichita Falls, Iowa Park does not choose to charge volunteers participating in the City-Wide Clean-Up project that begins next week.

I noticed that our neighboring city demanded that volunteers pay for dumping trash and debris they were collecting along the river banks that pass through that city.

Just thought I'd mention that.

I let a hustler's advertisement be printed in the classified section of last week's edition, and I don't intend to ever let that happen again.

It was a bordered ad, stating "No Gimmicks, Extra Income Now!" It had to do with envelope stuffing and promised good pay.

I've always culled out any such ads in the past. But when this one was accompanied by a \$70 check, I was impressed and ran it. Not because I'm in bad financial shape, but because this was a first, and gave indication of being honest.

The day after the ad ran, that check was returned by the bank.

Then two days later, I received a warning from the Texas Press Association concerning the same ad.

Folks, whether we run an ad or you just learn of such a promotion from another source, don't, please don't ever respond to any job offer concerning stuffing or addressing envelopes.

I apologize to anyone who may have responded to that ad, and if you did, I'd like to talk with you about it.

## City meeting set Monday

The tentative agenda released for Monday night's meeting of the city council lists adoption on two annexation ordinances, a resolution concerning walking track funding, and a personal appearance by a citizen.

**Roast Pork**

- 2 1/2 tbl. salt
  - 2 bay leaves, crushed
  - 1 teaspoon thyme
  - 2 teaspoons rosemary
  - 1 1/2 tbl. ground black pepper
  - 3/4 tsp. cayenne pepper
  - 1 center - cut boneless pork loin
  - 4 stalks celery, chopped
  - 1 cup chopped onion
  - 2 cloves garlic, minced
  - 1/4 cup chopped cilantro leaves
1. Combine first six ingredients. Rub half of this mixture on the inside of meat; tie into a roll and rub the rest on the outside. 2. Place in a baking dish with the remaining ingredients on and around the roast. Add 4 cups water and cover tightly with foil. 3. Place in a preheated 450 degree oven and immediately turn down to 350. Bake about two hours, or until the inside temperature reads 135. 4. Leave broth to cool (unless needed at once for entree).

Note: The broth may be frozen and used again for a roast, or as a rich base for soups.

**Rum Raisin Rice Pudding**

- 1 cup rice
- 5 cups half - and - half
- 1/2 cup sugar
- 1 1/2 tsp. vanilla extract
- Seeds of one vanilla bean
- 1/2 cup of golden raisins
- 1 large egg, lightly beaten
- 1 cup heavy cream
- 1/4 cup dark rum

Combine the rice, half and half, sugar, vanilla extract, vanilla bean seed and raisins in a large saucepan set over low heat. Simmer for about 25 minutes, or until rice is ? . Add the egg and cook for just another one to two minutes, or to thicken.

Shut off the heat, add the cream and rum. Mix well and chill before serving.

**Golden Apple Pie with Rum Sauce**

- 6 to 7 medium (about 2 pounds) Golden Delicious apples
- 1/4 cup packed brown sugar
- 2 Tbls. flour
- 1/2 tsp. ground cinnamon
- 1/4 tsp. salt
- 1/8 tsp. ground nutmeg
- Pastry for two crust pie
- 1/4 cup chopped nuts
- 2 Tbls. rum or 1/2 tsp. rum extract
- 2 Tbls. butter or margarine

Paré apples if desired; core and slice to equal 7 cups. Combine apples with brown sugar, flour, spices and salt; place in pastry - lined - 9 - inch pie plate. Flute edges of crust. Sprinkle apples with nuts and rum; dot with butter. Roll out remaining pastry; cut into 3/4 inch strips. Arrange strips in lattice pattern a top pie. Bake at 425 degrees for 50 to 60 minutes or until apples are tender; cover top of pie

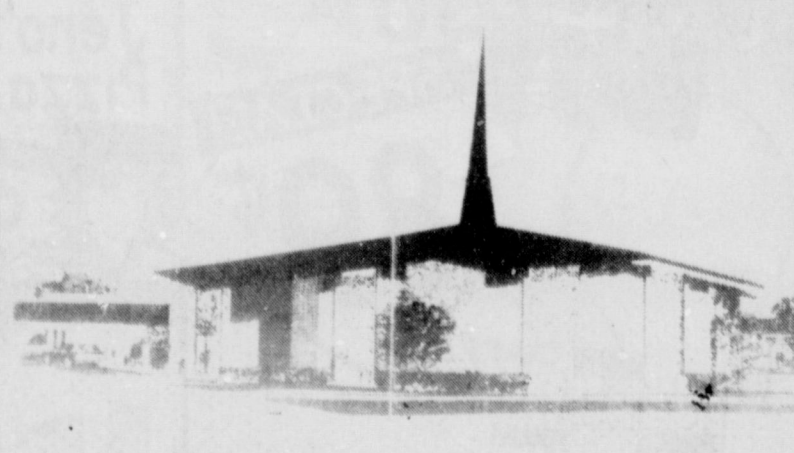

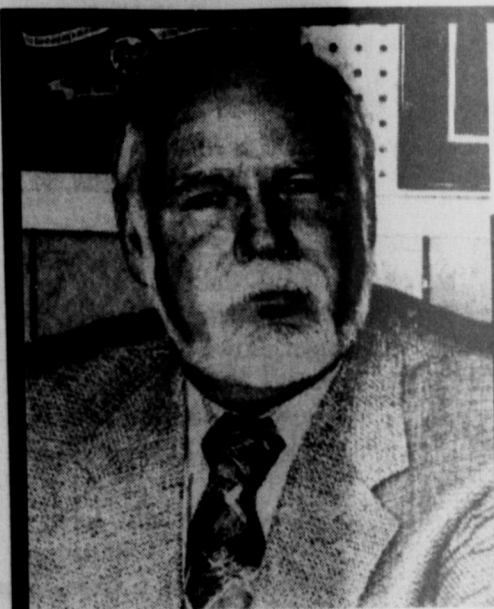

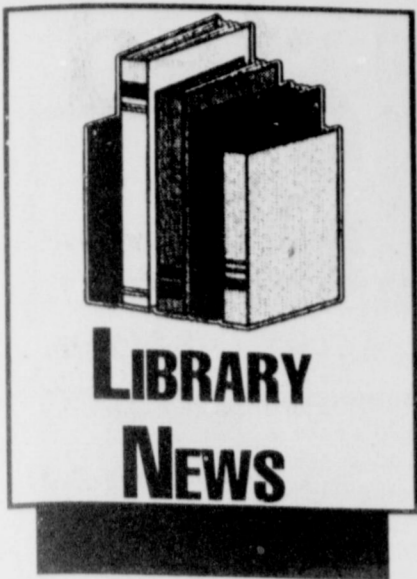

**Hawks keep on winning**

The Iowa Park Hawks kept their winning streak alive by defeating a pair of District 5-3A opponents this week to remain perfect in League play at 4-0, and 14-5 overall.

Iowa Park struggled with Henrietta on Friday, needing a run in the bottom of the seventh to pull out a 5-4 win over the Bearcats, then rebounded on Tuesday to pound Childress 14-4.

The Hawks will play Bowie on Friday to close out the first half of district play. Iowa Park is alone on top with a 4-0 mark followed by Graham at 3-1, Vernon and Childress 2-2, Henrietta 1-3 and Bowie is 0-4.

Against the Bearcats on Friday, Iowa Park jumped on top 1-0 in the bottom of the first, but later fell behind 3-1 after three innings. Iowa Park regained the lead at 4-3 after five innings, only to see Henrietta come back to tie the game at 4-4 with a single run in the top of the seventh.

In the bottom half of that inning, Scotty Mitchell led off with a single to right, which he turned into a double, mostly on hustle. Kevin Park then bunted, trying to move Mitchell to third, but the pitcher threw the ball past the first baseman, into right field, allowing Mitchell to come all the way around to score the game-winner.

"We played just good enough to win," said head coach David Fuhrman. "I think our tradition carried us in this game. We're still not playing the kind of defense I would like to see us play and we're not coming up with key hits with runners on base."

Wright also picked up the win to move his record to 3-1, striking out eight and allowing only two walks

along with no hit. He was taken out of the game after four innings when his pitch count got too high.

"We're still not as hot as I think we're going to be," Fuhrman added. "We've still got some guys that are going to be big hitters for us that haven't gotten on track yet, but they will. Our goal is to make every team we play have to get nine tough outs."


