The City of lowa Park received a sales tax rebate check this month for $\$ 37,859.61$ ，which is an increase of 20.33 percent when compared wiu he rebate received in May of 1998 This month＇s rebate includes and reported by businesses filing monthly tax returns in April，and mondhy tax recurns in Apri，and months of the year．
Thus far this year，\＄136，372．2 has been rebated to the city，and tha months of last year，according to the comptroller＇s office．
Wichita Falls is up 4.17 percent for the year and Burkburnett＇s in crease is 3.13 percent．
